

GLOSSARY OF TECHNICAL TERMS

This glossary of technical terms contains definitions of certain terms used in this document in connection with our Company and our business. The terms and their meanings may not always correspond to standard industry meaning or usage of these terms, and may not be directly comparable to similarly titled terms adopted by other companies operating in the same industries as our Company.

“AI”	artificial intelligence
“BMI”	body mass index, a numerical value calculated from height and weight, providing a standardized measure to classify underweight, healthy weight, overweight, and obesity
“cardiovascular”	relating to the heart and blood vessels, encompassing the circulatory system that pumps blood throughout the body
“case manager(s)”	the professionals who are responsible for coordinating physician-patient communication, developing personalized healthcare management plans and SOPs for patients, and tracking and coordinating the entire whole-course healthcare management journey to ensure patients receive appropriate and effective healthcare management services and resources
“CDSS”	clinical decision support systems, computer systems designed to assist healthcare providers in making clinical decisions by analyzing patient data and providing evidence-based recommendations
“Class III Grade A”	a premier, top-tier comprehensive hospital in China’s medical system, signifying the highest level of medical care, teaching, and research
“diabetes”	a chronic disease that occurs either when the pancreas does not produce enough insulin or when the body cannot effectively use the insulin it produces
“endocrine”	relating to the system of glands that produce and secrete hormones directly into the bloodstream to regulate various bodily functions
“endocrinology”	the branch of medicine that deals with the diagnosis and treatment of disorders related to hormones and the endocrine system
“gynecology”	the branch of medicine that focuses on the health of the female reproductive system, including the diagnosis and treatment of disorders affecting the uterus, ovaries, and other reproductive organs
“HA(s)”	hospital associates, our professionals that are responsible for our in-hospital operation of our whole-course healthcare management services
“Harness”	A proprietary, enterprise-grade, cloud-native orchestration platform, managing, and scaling AI applications. It enables the seamless integration of diverse AI models and agent systems, providing automated workflow orchestration, dynamic resource management, and robust service governance.
“hypertension”	a chronic medical condition in which blood pressure in the arteries is persistently elevated, often called high blood pressure
“hyperlipidemia”	a condition characterized by abnormally high levels of lipids (fats) in the blood, including cholesterol and triglycerides
“IoT”	Internet of things

“IVF”	in vitro fertilization, an assisted reproductive technology procedure where eggs are fertilized by sperm outside the body in a laboratory setting
“large language model” or “LLM(s)”	an AI algorithm that uses deep learning techniques and massively large data sets to understand, summarize, generate and predict new content
“M.A.S.”	Multi-Agent System, a computerized system composed of multiple interacting intelligent agents designed to solve problems that are difficult or impossible for an individual agent or a monolithic system to solve
“MA(s)”	medical assistant(s), our professionals who is responsible for service provision and execution of our patient-end whole-course healthcare management services
“MGA”	managing general agent, an insurance intermediary that has the authority to underwrite and manage insurance policies on behalf of insurance companies
“MoM” or “Mixture of Models”	a type of artificial intelligence architecture that combines multiple models to perform tasks, leveraging the strengths of each model to achieve better performance and adaptability in various scenarios
“obstetrics”	the branch of medicine that deals with pregnancy, childbirth, and the postpartum period, focusing on the care of women during these phases
“pediatrics”	the branch of medicine that focuses on the medical care of infants, children, and adolescents from birth up to the age of 18 years
“RAG”	a type of artificial intelligence technique that enhances language generation by retrieving relevant information from a large corpus of data to provide more accurate and contextually appropriate responses
“respiratory”	relating to breathing and the organs involved in the exchange of oxygen and carbon dioxide, including the lungs, airways, and associated structures
“SOA”	service-oriented architecture, a software design approach where applications are built as a collection of loosely coupled, interoperable services that can be accessed and combined to create larger applications
“SOPs”	standard operating procedures, a set of instructions to help our staffs carry out routine operations in a consistent and efficient manner
“WeiMai Apps”	applications designed for a mobile device, including but not limited to applications for our patients — WeiMai Medical Consultation Mini Program, applications for physicians — WeiMai Doctor App, and WeiMai mobile end for MAs
“WHO”	World Health Organization
“whole-course healthcare management service”	the comprehensive healthcare solutions that cover the entire journey of a patient from pre-treatment to post-treatment, including prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and rehabilitation, aiming to provide continuous and personalized care to improve health outcomes, which is in accordance with the policy consensus issued by the NHC
