INTERIM RESULTS ANNOUNCEMENT FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE GEM OF THE STOCK EXCHANGE OF HONG KONG LIMITED (THE “STOCK EXCHANGE”)

GEM has been positioned as a market designed to accommodate small and mid-sized companies to which a higher investment risk may be attached than other companies listed on the Stock Exchange. Prospective investors should be aware of the potential risks of investing in such companies and should make the decision to invest only after due and careful consideration.

Given that the companies listed on GEM are generally small and mid-sized companies, there is a risk that securities traded on GEM may be more susceptible to high market volatility than securities traded on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange and no assurance is given that there will be a liquid market in the securities traded on GEM.

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This announcement, for which the directors of Vinco Financial Group Limited (the “Company”, together with its subsidiaries, the “Group”) collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on GEM of the Stock Exchange (“GEM Listing Rules”) for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this announcement is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this announcement misleading.

HIGHLIGHTS

- The Group recorded a turnover of approximately HK\$5.88 million for the six months ended 30 June 2020 (2019: approximately HK\$5.48 million).
- Profit attributable to shareholders for the six months ended 30 June 2020 amounted to approximately HK\$0.06 million as compared to loss attributable to shareholders of approximately HK\$3.70 million for the corresponding period in 2019.
- The Directors do not recommend the payment of any dividend for the six months ended 30 June 2020 (2019: nil).

1. Basis of preparation

The Group's unaudited condensed consolidated half yearly financial statements have been prepared in accordance with all applicable Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRSs"), which collective term includes all applicable individual Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards, Hong Kong Accounting Standards ("HKASs") and Interpretations issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA"), accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the disclosure requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. These financial statements also comply with the applicable disclosure provisions of the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on the GEM of The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited.

The unaudited condensed consolidated half yearly financial statements comprise the Company and its subsidiaries (together referred to as "the Group").

Items included in the unaudited condensed consolidated half yearly financial statements of each entity of the Group are measured using the currency of primary economic environment in which the entity operates (the "functional currency"). These financial statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars ("HK\$"), rounded to the nearest thousand except for per share data. HK\$ is the Company's functional and the Group's presentation currency.

The measurement basis used in the preparation of the financial statements is the historical cost basis.

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with HKFRSs requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The condensed consolidated accounts have not been audited by the auditors of the Company but have been reviewed by the audit committee of the Company.

2. Revenue

The principal activity of the Group is the provision of financial services in Hong Kong. Revenue represents income from the provision of corporate financial advisory services for the six months ended 30 June 2020 and 2019.

3. Segment information

No business segment analysis and geographical segment analysis are presented for the periods as substantially all of the Group's revenue was derived from provision of financial services in Hong Kong.

4. Income tax

Pursuant to the rules and regulations of the Cayman Islands, the Company is not subject to income tax in the Cayman Islands.

5. Earnings/ (Loss) per share

a) Basic earnings/ (loss) per share

The calculation of basic (loss)/ earnings per share is based on the profit attributable to the owners of the Company of approximately HK\$60,000 (2019: loss attributable to the owners of the Company of approximately HK\$3,696,000) and the weighted average of 640,000,000 (2019: 640,000,000) ordinary shares in issue during the year.

b) Diluted earnings/ (loss) per share

There were no dilutive potential ordinary shares in issue for the six months ended 30 June 2020 and 2019, and diluted earnings/ (loss) per share is the same as basic earnings/ (loss) per share.

The Directors do not recommend the payment of any dividend for the six months ended 30 June 2020 (for the six months ended 30 June 2019: Nil).

Management Discussion and Analysis

Business Review

For the six months ended 30 June 2020, the Group continued to focus on its principal business in relation to the provision of corporate finance advisory services in Hong Kong. In the first half of 2020, the business of the Group had been temporary negatively impacted by various factors. These factors include the China-USA trade war, the political unrest in Hong Kong and the outbreak of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) (“Pandemic”), which resulted in decreasing the number of engagements for corporate finance advisory services handled by the Group. Despite that a trade deal was signed between China and the USA, the China-US conflicts have not ended due to the adverse situation of the epidemic in the USA. A number of the Group’s projects have been put on hold as those clients’ financial performance have been deteriorated mainly because of the continuous weak business environment caused by the China-US trade war and Pandemic.

The China-US trade war and the Pandemic have weighed on the local economy. As a combined result of the above factors, the Group’s operation has been negatively affected due to the postponement or cancellation of some of the local and overseas projects. Although the business operations of the Group continued to experience severe competitions from competitors, the Group has managed to complete around twelve corporate finance-related projects and one initial public offering project in the first half of the year.

Outlook

As the development of such epidemic remains to be highly unpredictable, the extent of its impact on the economy of Hong Kong and the world is uncertain. Also, the haze of uncertainties stemming from the China-US trade war. The industry which the Group operates in may be directly or indirectly affected. Although, the Pandemic has recently shown signs of stabilizing in Hong Kong, and the HKSAR government has refined and relaxed certain control measures in relation to COVID-19, however, the scale of the Pandemic remains uncertain worldwide. It is unknown to us when the global recovery will take place.

Also, as various travel restrictions and lockdown measures remain enacted to fight against the Pandemic, which impede our marketing and due diligence works, resulting in a temporary slowdown of our IPO and advisory related projects. The management is of the view that the overall tough business environment may persist for some time.

Looking ahead, the market condition for the rest of 2020 remains challenging, but as Hong Kong is one of the key financial centers in the world, the Board remains optimistic about the prospects of corporate finance advisory services industry. Furthermore, the whole management has joined the Group for over ten years and has extensive experience in the financial sector, the management is positive on the prospect of the business of the Group in the long run. The management believes the business of the Group is viable and sustainable. The Group will continue to focus on the corporate finance advisory services as well as IPO-related projects. Meanwhile, the Group will also continue to seek for business opportunities in the financial related services so as to generate higher value for the shareholders.

Financial Review

The Group recorded a turnover of approximately HK\$5.88 million for the six months ended 30 June 2020. The profits attributable to equity holders of the Company for the six months ended 30 June 2020 was approximately HK\$0.06 million. The Group believes that the financial performance has been temporarily affected due to (i) withholding of certain projects as our clients' financial performance have been deteriorated mainly because of the continuous weak business environment caused by the US-China trade war and the Pandemic; and (ii) the volatilities of the political climate, economy and the stock market this year in tandem with the trade war and tariff dispute between China and the USA have led to the postponement to some of our projects as clients' worries over domestic uncertainties might have weakened investment sentiment to the local capital markets.

The Group remained in a healthy and sound liquidity position as at 30 June 2020.

Capital Structure

The capital of the Group comprises only ordinary shares. As at 30 June 2020, the total number of the ordinary shares of the Group was 640,000,000 shares.

Charges on Assets

As at 30 June 2020, the Group did not have any charges on its assets.

Information on employees

As at 30 June 2020, the Group had a workforce of 15 employees. The total staff costs, including directors' emoluments, amounted to approximately HK\$3.82 million for the half year under review. The Group's remuneration policies are determined by reference to market terms as well as the performance, qualification and experience of individual employee.

Contingent Liabilities

As at 30 June 2020, the Group did not have any significant contingent liabilities.

Remuneration Committee

The remuneration committee comprises of one executive Director, namely Mr. Chung Ho Yan and two independent non-executive Directors, namely Mr. Lee Wing Lun (chairman of the remuneration committee) and Mr. Tam King Ho, Howard.

Nomination committee

The Company established a nomination committee with written terms of reference in compliance with the GEM Listing Rules. The principal duties of the nomination committee are to formulate nomination policy and to make recommendations to the Board on nomination and appointment of directors and board succession. The nomination committee comprises of one executive Director, namely Mr. Chung Ho Yan (chairman of the nomination committee) and two independent non-executive Directors, namely Mr. Lee Wing Lun and Mr. Tam King Ho, Howard.

Audit Committee

The Company has established an audit committee with written terms of reference on in compliance with the GEM Listing Rules. The principal duties of the audit committee are to review and to supervise the financial reporting process and internal control systems of the Group. The audit committee comprises of three independent non-executive Directors, namely Mr. Lee Wing Lun (chairman of the audit committee), Mr. Tam King Ho, Howard and Mr. Law Chor Yam.

The audit committee has reviewed the financial statements of the Group for the six-month period ended 30 June 2020 pursuant to the relevant provisions contained in the Code on Corporate Governance Practices as set out in Appendix 15 of the GEM Listing Rules and was of the opinion that the preparation of such statements complied with applicable accounting standards and that adequate disclosure has been made in respect thereof.
