### 1. BASIS OF PREPARATION AND PRESENTATION OF THE UNAUDITED CONDENSED CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

China Golden Classic Group Limited (the “Company”) is a limited liability company incorporated in the Cayman Islands and its shares are listed on the GEM of the Stock Exchange on 8 July 2016.

The principal activity of the Company is investment holding during the period. The subsidiaries of the Company are principally engaged in the manufacture and trading of oral care, leather care and household hygiene products.

The unaudited condensed consolidated financial information (“Financial Information”) of the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively as the “Group”) for the three months ended 31 March 2022 have been prepared in accordance with the applicable disclosure provisions of Chapter 18 of the GEM Listing Rules and Hong Kong Accounting Standard (“HKAS”) 34 “Interim Financial Reporting” issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (“HKICPA”).

The Financial Information of the Group should be read in conjunction with the annual audited consolidated financial statements of the Group for the year ended 31 December 2021. The accounting policies adopted in preparing the unaudited condensed consolidated interim financial statements were consistent with those applied for the financial statements of the Group for the year ended 31 December 2021.

The functional currency of the Company and the Group’s principal subsidiaries is Hong Kong Dollar (“HK\$”) or Renminbi (“RMB”). As the Group mainly operates in the People’s Republic of China (“PRC”), the directors of the Company (“Directors”) consider that it is appropriate to present the Financial Information in RMB.

### 2. REVENUE AND SEGMENT INFORMATION

Information reported to the executive directors of the Company, being the chief operating decision maker (“CODM”), for the purposes of resource allocation and assessment of segment performance focuses on the types of goods or services delivered or provided. No operating segments identified by the CODM have been aggregated in arriving at the reportable segments of the Group.

### 2. REVENUE AND SEGMENT INFORMATION (Continued)

Specifically, the Group's reportable and operating segments are as follows:

- (1) Oral care products segment reports manufacture and sales of oral care products including functional toothpaste, mouthwash, oral spray and toothbrush.
- (2) Leather care products segment reports manufacture and sales of leather care products including leather shoe care products and leather clothing care products.
- (3) Household hygiene products segment reports manufacture and sales of household hygiene products including surface cleaners, laundry care products, toilet care products and mould proof products.

#### (a) Segment revenues and results

Segment turnover represents revenue derived from the sales of oral care, leather care and household hygiene products.

During the three months ended 31 March 2022, all revenue were recognised at a point in time upon delivery.

# Business Review and Prospects

## BUSINESS REVIEW

For the Period, the Group recorded (i) a turnover of approximately RMB59.7 million, representing a decrease of approximately 12.5% compared to the Last Corresponding Period; and (ii) a net loss of approximately RMB4.1 million, reflecting a difference of approximately RMB1.1 million or 38.3% as compared to the net loss of approximately RMB2.9 million in the Last Corresponding Period. The Group's net loss margin was approximately 6.8% during the Period, representing a difference of approximately 2.5%, compared to net loss margin of approximately 4.3% in the Last Corresponding Period. On the other hand, the Group's overall gross profit margin decreased from approximately 39.5% for the Last Corresponding Period to approximately 34.8% for the Period.

The net loss was mainly attributable to the shortage of raw materials arising from the logistics-disruptions caused by COVID-19 and the weak demand of distributors in pandemic-affected areas.

## PROSPECTS AND OUTLOOKS

The first quarter of 2022 was full of challenges for the Group and management team, which remain dedicated to creating value for the shareholders of the Company. COVID-19 and its highly contagious variants have broken out in many parts of China. The operation of the Group was seriously affected by the shortage of raw materials arising from the logistics-disruptions and the weak demand of distributors in pandemic-affected areas.

In the second quarter of 2022, the situation of the Group has proven to be even more challenging. On one hand, Shanghai, located in close proximity to the Group, has adopted a strategy of "citywide static management" in early April 2022 since the escalation of the pandemic. On the other hand, Jiangyin, the location of our Group, has become a pandemic-affected area and taken stringent measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 since 3 May 2022. In response to the challenges, the management of the Group has formulated the following strategies:

- (1) professional teams have been set up to comprehensively implement epidemic prevention and control measures as well as disinfect production, material storing and living areas;
- (2) a series of plans have been made for pandemic prevention and control, health screening, closed-loop management, preparedness and support, and emergency response.

## Business Review and Prospects

After preparing the measures above, the Group obtained permission from local authorities to resume work and production in a closed management mode, providing daily nucleic acid testing for all working staff members.

Though the performance of the Group in the first quarter has fallen below the Board's expectations, the Board is still optimistic about the future of the Company for the following reasons:

- (1) a sizable portion of the world is emerging from the aftermath of the pandemic, and China's domestic economy will resume its strong growth in view of the robust epidemic prevention measures implemented by the Chinese government;
- (2) the enhanced awareness of household hygiene and oral health of customers is expected to enhance the turnover of our products.

# Management Discussion and Analysis

## RESULTS OF OPERATION

The turnover for the Period was approximately RMB59.7 million, representing a decrease of approximately 12.5%, as compared to approximately RMB68.3 million for the Last Corresponding Period. During the Period, the Group incurred a net loss of approximately RMB4.1 million, as compared to the net loss of approximately RMB2.9 million for the Last Corresponding Period. The basic loss per share was RMB0.41 cents for the Period while the basic loss per share was RMB0.29 cents for the Last Corresponding Period.

### Turnover

The Group recorded a total turnover of approximately RMB59.7 million for the Period, which represented a decrease of approximately RMB8.5 million or 12.5% as compared to approximately RMB68.3 million for the Last Corresponding Period. The lower turnover was mainly due to the decreased turnover of household hygiene products and leather care products. The turnover of household hygiene products decreased by approximately RMB5.3 million or 15.8% from approximately RMB33.6 million for the Last Corresponding Period to RMB28.3 million for the Period. On the other hand, the turnover of leather care products recorded a decrease of approximately RMB1.7 million or 30.4% from approximately RMB5.6 million for the Last Corresponding Period to approximately RMB4.0 million for the Period. Such decrease was mainly due to (i) the shortage of raw materials arising from the logistics-disruptions caused by COVID-19; and (ii) the weak demand of distributors in pandemic-affected areas. The turnover of the Group's oral care products decreased by approximately RMB1.5 million or 5.2% to approximately RMB27.5 million for the Period, as compared with approximately RMB29.0 million for the Last Corresponding Period. As the gross profit margin of oral care products is higher than the other two segments products, the Group prioritised the production and transport logistics of oral care products.

### Cost of sales

Cost of sales decreased from approximately RMB41.2 million for the Last Corresponding Period to approximately RMB39.0 million for the Period, demonstrating a decrease of approximately RMB2.3 million or 5.5%. The decrease mainly reflected the decreased product sales volume.

### Gross profit and gross profit margin

Gross profit decreased from approximately RMB27.0 million for the Last Corresponding Period to approximately RMB20.8 million for the Period, representing a decrease of approximately RMB6.2 million or 23.1%. The gross profit margin decreased to 34.8%, representing a 4.8% decrease as compared to 39.6% for the Last Corresponding Period. The decrease was mainly attributed to the rise in the price of raw materials and packaging materials and the decreased product sales volume.

# Management Discussion and Analysis

## Selling and distribution costs

Selling and distribution expenses incurred for the Period were approximately RMB12.8 million, resulting in a decrease of approximately RMB7.6 million or approximately 37.3%, as compared to approximately RMB20.4 million for the Last Corresponding Period, which mainly reflected the reduced engagement of temporary personnel.

## Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses incurred for the Period were approximately RMB12.8 million, representing an increase of approximately RMB2.6 million or approximately 24.8%, as compared to approximately RMB10.3 million for the Last Corresponding Period. The increase was mainly driven by the increase in depreciation for property, plant and equipment, repair and maintenance.

## Finance costs

Interest expenses incurred for the Period were approximately RMB248 thousand, which increased by approximately RMB28 thousand as compared to the last corresponding period, representing an increase of approximately 12.7%. It was driven by the decreased interest income.

## Loss for the period

As a result of the foregoing, the Group incurred a net loss of approximately RMB4.1 million for the Period, representing a difference of approximately RMB1.1 million or 38.3% as compared to the net loss of approximately RMB2.9 million for the Last Corresponding Period. Net loss margin for the Period was approximately 6.8%, representing a difference of approximately 2.5% as compared to the net loss margin of 4.3% for the Last Corresponding Period.

## DIVIDEND

The Board has determined not to declare a dividend for the Period.

The Scheme will remain in force for a period of 10 years from the date of adoption of such scheme and will expire at the close of business on the business day immediately preceding the tenth anniversary thereof unless terminated earlier by the shareholders of the Company in general meeting. Each of the controlling shareholders of the Company, namely Ms. Li and ChongBo Mary (together, the “Controlling Shareholders”), has entered into a deed of non-competition on 17 June 2016 (the “Deed of Non-competition”). Details of the Deed of Non-competition are set out in the section headed “Relationship with Controlling Shareholders” of the Prospectus and the non-competition undertaking has become effective from the date of listing of the shares of the Company on GEM (the “Listing Date”). As far as the Directors are aware, as at the date of this report, the Controlling Shareholders have not breached any terms under the Deed of Non-competition.

### COMPETING INTERESTS

As far as the Directors are aware, as at the date of this report, none of the Directors or the Controlling Shareholders have any interests in a business which competes or may compete with the business of the Group or have any other conflict of interest with the Group.

### AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Company has established an audit committee (the “Audit Committee”) with written terms of reference in compliance with the GEM Listing Rules. The primary duties of the Audit Committee are mainly to make recommendations to the Board on the appointment, reappointment and removal of the Company’s external auditor, review the financial information of the Company, and oversee the Company’s financial reporting system, risk management and internal control systems. The Audit Committee comprised of three independent non-executive Directors, namely Mr. Tang Wai Yau (chairman of the Audit Committee), Mr. Ye Jingzhong and Mr. Pan Qingwei.
