GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

Unless otherwise renewed, the existing mandate to issue Shares will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed to grant to the Directors new general and unconditional mandate to allot, issue and otherwise deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the aggregate number of issued shares of the Company as at the date of the passing of the relevant resolution.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

Subject to the passing of the relevant resolution to approve the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are allotted and issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 81,800,000 Shares, representing 10% of the aggregate number of issued shares of the Company as at the date of the AGM.

2. SOURCE OF FUNDS

Mr. Wu completed the executive master of business administration course (EMBA) from Overseas Education College Shanghai Jiao Tong University (上海交通大學海外教育學院) in February 2006. Mr. Wu further obtained a master degree in business administration from Hong Kong Finance and Economics College (香港財經學院) in June 2008. He obtained the qualification of engineer from Quzhou City Leading Group for Title Reform* (衢州市職稱改革領導小組) in 1992. From December 1978 to March 1994, Mr. Wu worked as an engineer in Jiang Shan Chemical Industry General Factory* (江山化工總廠). He was the chairman of the board of directors of Zhejiang Jiangshan Sunny Electron Co., Ltd* (浙江江山三友電子有限公司) from April 1994 to May 2011. Since May 2011, Mr. Wu has been the president of Zhejiang Tonking New Energy Group Co., Ltd* (浙江同景新能源集團有限公司).

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Rise Triumph Limited and Signkey Group Limited beneficially owned 224,380,000 Shares and 7,074,000 shares of the Company respectively, representing approximately 27.43% and 0.86% of the total issued share capital of the Company respectively. Mr. Wu beneficially owned 96% and 85% of the issued share capital of Rise Triumph Limited and Signkey Group Limited respectively. Mr. Wu is a director of Rise Triumph Limited. Mr. Wu is deemed, or taken to be, interested in all the Shares held by Rise Triumph Limited and Signkey Group Limited for the purpose of the SFO.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Wu does not have any relationship with other Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company and he has no interests in the Shares which are required to be disclosed pursuant to Part XV of the SFO.
