PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the Company is investment holding. The principal activities of the Group during the year are the operation of transportation and storage facilities for crude oil and the operation of a natural gas pipeline network and refilling stations supplying natural gas and liquefied petroleum gas for vehicle use.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Group's result for the year ended 31 December 2004 and the state of affairs of the Company and the Group at that date are set out in the accompanying financial statements on pages 21 to 62.

The Board has resolved not to recommend the payment of a dividend for the year ended 31 December 2004 (2003: Nil).

Pursuant to the Company's bye-law 86(2), Mr. Ma Ji shall hold office until the forthcoming annual general meeting and will retire and, being eligible, will offer himself for re-election. Pursuant to the Company's bye-law 87, Messrs. Guo Ting, Zhao Xin Xian and Yu En Guang will retire by rotation and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the forthcoming annual general meeting. All other remaining directors continue in office.

The Company has received from each of the independent non-executive directors an annual confirmation of his independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. The Company considers all of the independent non-executive directors are independent.

DIRECTORS' SERVICE CONTRACTS

No director proposed for re-election at the forthcoming annual general meeting had a service contract with the Company which is not determinable by the Company within one year without payment other than statutory compensation.

Save as disclosed above, as at 31 December 2004, none of the Directors nor any of their associates had any interests in the securities of the Company or any of its associated corporations (within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO) as recorded in the register required to be kept under Section 352 of the SFO or as otherwise notified to the Company and the Stock Exchange pursuant to the Model Code.

SHARE OPTION SCHEME

The Company's share option scheme ("the Scheme") was adopted pursuant to an ordinary resolution passed by the shareholders of the Company on 6 March 2002. The Scheme is in full compliance with the relevant requirements of Chapter 17 of the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on Stock Exchange.

The purpose of the Scheme is to enable the Company to grant options to the eligible participants of the Group in recognition of their contribution to the Group. Eligible participants of the Scheme include any full-time employees and executive and non-executive directors of the Company or its subsidiaries and any suppliers, consultants, agents and advisers. The Scheme became effective on 6 March 2002 and, unless otherwise cancelled or amended, will remain in force for 10 years from that date. For the year ended 31 December 2004, no option has been granted under the Scheme.

The maximum number of shares in respect of which options may be granted under the Scheme shall not in aggregate exceed 10% of the shares of the Company in issue as at the date of approval of the limit. As at 31 December 2004, the total number of shares of the Company that may be issued upon exercise of all share options granted and yet to be

exercised under the Scheme was 116,000,000, which represented 3.83% of the issued share capital of the Company as at that date. The maximum entitlement for any eligible person (other than a substantial shareholder or an independent non-executive director of the Company, or any of their respective associates) is that the total number of shares issued and to be issued upon exercise of all options granted and to be granted in any 12-month period up to and including the date of the latest grant does not exceed 1% of the shares of the Company in issue at the relevant time. Any further grant of share options in excess of this limit is subject to shareholders' approval in general meeting.

The period within which an option may be exercised will be determined by the Board in its absolute discretion, save that no option may be exercised later than 10 years from the date of grant of the option.

The exercise price in relation to each option shall be determined by the Board in its absolute discretion, but in any event shall not be less than the highest of: (i) the closing price of the shares as stated in the Stock Exchange's daily quotation sheet on the date of grant of such option; (ii) the average closing price of the shares as stated in the Stock Exchange's daily quotation sheets for the five business days immediately preceding the date of grant of such option; and (iii) the nominal value of a share on the date of grant of such option.

At 31 December 2004, the directors and employees of the Company had the following personal interests in options to subscribe for shares of the Company granted at nominal consideration under the Company's share option scheme. Each option gives the holder the right to subscribe for one share.

** Mr. Zhu Jia Zhen resigned as a director of the Company on 8 March 2005 and Mr. Zhu's share options of 28,000,000 lapsed accordingly.

Concerning the share option granted during the year as detailed above, the directors do not consider it is appropriate to present a theoretical valuation of the options as the exercise prices of all the share options which were vested as at 31 December 2004 were above the market price of the shares of the Company as at 31 December 2004. The intrinsic value of the share option is zero and the valuation of the share option will be based on its speculative appeal, which therefore does not necessarily provide a reliable measure of the fair value of the share option. Some further disclosures relating to the Company's share option scheme are set out in note 23 to the financial statements.

CONNECTED TRANSACTIONS

Ongoing Connected Transactions

In November 1999, the Company's subsidiary, Xinjiang Xingmei, entered into an agreement with its minority shareholder, for the provision of crude oil transportation, storage and unloading services for a period of 20 years.

During the year ended 31 December 2004, revenue from the provision of crude oil transportation, storage and unloading services to the minority shareholder amounted to RMB40,978,000 (2003: RMB74,946,000). The amount due from minority shareholder as at 31 December 2004 amounted to RMB40,110,000 (2003: RMB27,792,000).

With respect to the above ongoing connected transactions entered into by the Group, the Stock Exchange on application by the Company, granted to the Company a waiver from strict compliance with the connected transaction requirements as set out in the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on the Stock Exchange (the "Listing Rules"). In the opinion of the independent non-executive directors, the ongoing connected transactions were:

- (i) conducted in the ordinary and usual course of the Group's business;
- (ii) on normal commercial terms or on terms no less favourable than terms available to or from independent third parties;
- (iii) in accordance with relevant agreements on terms that are fair and reasonable so far as the shareholders of the Company are concerned and in the interest of the Company as a whole; and
- (iv) within the relevant annual cap amounts as agreed by the Stock Exchange.

DIRECTORS' INTERESTS IN CONTRACTS

Save as disclosed in note 29 to the financial statements, no contracts of significance subsisted at any time during the year to which the Company or any of its subsidiaries was a party and in which a director of the Company had material interest, whether directly or indirectly.

MATERIAL LEGAL PROCEEDINGS

As at 31 December 2004, a subsidiary of the Group was involved in litigation against a third party for breach of contract. Details are set out in note 28 to the financial statements.

Save as disclosed above, as at 31 December 2004, the Company was not involved in any material litigation or arbitration and no material litigation or claims was pending or threatened or made against the Company so far as the Company is aware.

PUBLIC FLOAT

Based on information that is publicly available to the Company and within the knowledge of its directors, as of the date of this report, there is sufficient public float of the shares with not less than 25% of the total issued shares of the Company as required under the Listing Rules.

PURCHASE, REDEMPTION OR SALE OF LISTED SECURITIES

During the year, neither the Company, nor any of its subsidiaries purchased, redeemed or sold any of the Company's listed securities.

PRE-EMPTIVE RIGHTS

There is no provision for pre-emptive rights under the Company's bye-laws or the laws in Bermuda which would oblige the Company to offer new shares on a pro rata basis to existing shareholders.

CODE OF BEST PRACTICE

In the opinion of the Board, the Company has complied with the Code of Best Practice as set out in Appendix 14 to the Listing Rules throughout the accounting period covered by the annual report, except that all non-executive directors of the Company are not appointed for any specific term of office but are subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the bye-laws of the Company.

MODEL CODE

The Company has adopted the Model Code (the "Model Code") for Securities Transactions by Directors of Listed Issuers as set out in Appendix 10 to the Listing Rules as the Company's code of conduct and rules governing dealing by all directors in the securities of the Company.

All directors have complied with the required standard regarding directors' securities dealings set out in the Model Code during the year.

AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Company established an audit committee on 6 January 2000 with written terms of reference in compliance with the Code of Best Practice as set out in Appendix 14 to the Listing Rules. The audit committee comprises Messrs. Yu En Guang, Zhang Xue Min and Yip Ching Shan, the three independent non-executive directors of the Company. The primary duties of the audit committee are to review and supervise the financial reporting process and internal control system of the Group.
