There is no information which is discloseable nor is Dr. He involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements under Rules 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters concerning Dr. He that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

1. To receive the audited consolidated financial statements of the Company and the reports of the directors and auditors for the year ended 31 December 2016.
