PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF THE DIRECTORS PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES AND NOTICE OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

I. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to give you information regarding the following resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolutions, notice of which is set out on pages 16 to 20 of this circular.

At the Annual General Meeting, the resolutions regarding: (i) the re-election of the Directors; and (ii) the granting to the Directors general mandates for the issue and repurchase of the Shares.

II. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF THE DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Clause 99 of the Company's Bye-laws, at each annual general meeting one-third of the Directors for the time being, or, if their number is not three or a multiple of three, then the number nearest one-third, shall retire from office by rotation save any Director holding office as Chairman or Managing Director. The Directors to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election, but as between persons who became Directors on the same day shall (unless they otherwise agree between themselves) be determined by lot. The retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election. In addition, pursuant to A.4.2 of the Corporate Governance Code, all directors appointed to fill a casual vacancy should be subject to election by shareholders at the first general meeting after appointment. Every director, including those appointed for a specific term, should be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years.

Messrs. Ren Qian and Neil Bush should retire and re-elect at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting.

Pursuant to Clause 102 of the Company's Bye-laws, the Company may from time to time in general meeting by Ordinary Resolution elect any person to be a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the Board. Any Director so appointed shall hold office only until the next following Annual General Meeting of the Company (in the case of an addition to the Board) and shall then be eligible for re-election at the meeting but shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting.

Messrs. Ma Kin Ling, Tam Chak Chi and Chow Kin Wing should retire and re-elect at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting.

Pursuant to A.4.3 of the Corporate Governance Code, any further appointment of an Independent Non- Executive Director in excess of nine years should subject to a separate resolution to be approved by shareholders.

The Directors are of the opinion that they remain independent, notwithstanding their length of tenure. They continue to demonstrate the attributes of an Independent Non-Executive Director noted above and there is no evidence that their tenure has had any impact on his independence. The Board believes that their detailed knowledge and experience of the Group's business and their external experience continue to be of significant benefit to the Company, and that they maintain an independent view of its affairs.

Each of the Independent Non-Executive Directors has made an annual confirmation of independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. The Company is of the view that all Independent Non-Executive Directors meet the independence guidelines set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules.

Details of the abovementioned Directors, Messrs. Ren Qian, Neil Bush, Ma Kin Ling, Tam Chak Chi and Chow Kin Wing who are proposed to be re-elected at the Annual General Meeting, are set out in Appendix I to this circular. At the Annual General Meeting, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to approve the re-election of Messrs. Ren Qian and Neil Bush as Executive Director and Messrs. Ma Kin Ling, Tam Chak Chi and Chow Kin Wing as Independent Non-Executive Director of the Company.

III. PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

At the Annual General Meeting, an ordinary resolution will be proposed that the Directors be given a general and unconditional mandate to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares representing not more than 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company at the date the relevant resolution is passed at the Annual General Meeting (the "Issue Mandate").

IV. PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the Annual General Meeting, an ordinary resolution will be proposed that the Directors be given a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all powers of the Company to repurchase on the Stock Exchange the Shares in the Company up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company at the date the relevant resolution is passed at the Annual General Meeting (the "Repurchase Mandate").

In addition, an ordinary resolution will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting providing that any Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate (up to maximum of 10% of the issued Shares as at the date of the grant of the Repurchase Mandate) will be added to the total number of Shares which may be allotted and issued under the Issue Mandate.

The Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate would continue in force until the first occurrence of either the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company following the passing of the relevant resolutions unless it is renewed at such meeting or the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Company's Bye-laws or any applicable law to be held or it is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

An explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders in connection with the proposed general mandate to repurchase Shares is set out in the Appendix II to this circular. The explanatory statement contains all information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution at the Annual General Meeting.

V. CLOSURE OF REGISTER OF MEMBERS

The register of members of the Company will be closed from Friday, 10 July 2020 to Wednesday, 15 July 2020 (both days inclusive), during which period no transfer of shares of the Company will be registered. To be eligible to attend and vote at the AGM, all share transfer documents accompanied by the relevant share certificates must be lodged with the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Standard Limited, at level 54, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong for registration no later than 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, 9 July 2020.

VI. NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

A notice convening the Annual General Meeting to be held at 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, 15 July 2020 at Units 1910-12, 19th Floor, China Merchants Tower, Shun Tak Centre, 168-200 Connaught Road Central, Sheung Wan, Hong Kong is set out pages 16 to 20 of this circular for the purpose of considering and, if thought fit, passing: (i) an ordinary resolution to re-elect of the Directors; and (ii) an ordinary resolution to grant to the Directors general mandates for the issue of the Shares and the repurchase of its Shares.

VII. FORM OF PROXY

A form of proxy is enclosed for use by the Shareholders. Such form of proxy is also published on the website of the Stock Exchange (www.hkexnews.hk) and the website of the Company (www.hkfihg.com). DETAILS OF DIRECTORS PROPOSED FOR RE-ELECTION

Mr. Ren Oian, aged 60, was newly appointed as Executive Director on 5 July 2017. He graduated from the North China University of Water Conservancy and Electronic Power majoring in Agricultural Water in 1983 and obtained a Master of Business Administration from the Beijing Normal University in 2001. He has over 30 years' experience in the water resources management industry, the housing and urbanrural development industry and the real estate industry in the PRC. Mr. Ren was the secretary of the office minister of The Ministry of Water Resources of the PRC and The Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development of the PRC respectively. He has extensive experience in planning, usage, development and operation of water resources and land resources in the PRC. Mr. Ren was also the deputy mayor of The People's Government of Hebei Province, Langfang City (mainly responsible for urban development), the deputy general manager of China Housing and Urban-Rural Development Huatong Real Estate Limited# (中國建設部華通置業有 限公司) and the chairman of Beijing Yinghe Property Development Limited. Prior to joining the Company, Mr. Ren served as an executive director of China City Infrastructure Group Limited (Stock Code: 2349) (formerly known as China Botanic Development Holdings Limited) from 30 July 2009 to 2 December 2016 and was responsible for strategic development and properties management.

Mr. Ren is appointed for a specific term for three years and subject to retirement and re-election provisions in accordance with the Bye-laws. Mr. Ren's annual remuneration is HK\$600,000 which is based on mutual agreement between the Board and Mr. Ren and Mr. Ren's responsibilities and duties in the Company.

Mr. Neil Bush, aged 65, was appointed the Deputy Chairman and an executive director on 15 November 2012 of the Company. He is responsible for the implementation of the overall strategic planning and development of the Group. Mr. Bush graduated from Tulane University with a bachelor's degree in International Economics and from the Tulane University Freeman School of Business with a master's degree in Business Administration. Mr. Bush had over 30 years of experience in domestic and international energy and real estate business development. He formed oil companies which explored oil resources in various states in the United States of America and overseas. Mr. Bush has engaged in various international business development activities with a focus on the PRC and Middle East. Since 1975, Mr. Bush has traveled to the PRC over 140 times and worked with numerous entities on a variety of projects including real estate development, energy, automobile parts, sheet rock manufacturing and paint production. From 7 December 2010 to 20 July 2012, Mr. Bush was a non-executive director of China Resources and Transportation Group Limited, a company of which the shares are listed on the Stock Exchange (stock code: 269). Since 22 April 2013, Mr. Neil Bush has been serving as the Non-Executive Chairman on the board of SGX-ST Mainboard-listed SingHaiyi Group Limited, a Singapore based real estate company. He is also the Chairman of the Points of Light, a national charitable organisation formed by President George H.W. Bush in 1989 that promotes citizen service through volunteerism in communities all across America and increasingly overseas. Mr. Bush serves as Chairman of the Barbara Bush Houston Literacy Foundation, and on the boards of the Houston Salvation Army and the Bush School of Government and Public Service.

Mr. Bush is appointed for a specific term for three years and subject to retirement and re-election provisions in accordance with the Bye-laws. Mr. Bush's annual remuneration is HK\$600,000 which is based on mutual agreement between the Board and Mr. Bush and Mr. Bush's responsibilities and duties in the Company.

Mr. Ma Kin Ling, aged 37, was appointed as an independent nonexecutive director on 10 May 2019. He is currently the chief financial officer and company secretary of Xinyang Maojian Group Limited (stock code: 362), a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange and the independent non-executive director of SunCorp Technologies Limited (stock code: 1063), a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange. Mr. Ma is a member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. He graduated from City University of Hong Kong with a Bachelor degree of Business Administration (Honours) in Accountancy and Law. Prior to the joining of the Group, he worked in reputable international accounting firms and has over 10 years' experience in auditing and accounting.

Mr. Ma is appointed for a specific term for three years and subject to retirement and reelection provisions in accordance with the Bye-laws. Mr. Ma's annual remuneration is HK\$120,000 which is based on mutual agreement between the Board and Mr. Ma and Mr. Ma's responsibilities and duties in the Company.

Mr. Tam Chak Chi, aged 42, was appointed as an independent nonexecutive director on 19 August 2019. He holds a bachelor's degree of commerce from the University of Toronto. He is a fellow member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants, a fellow member of the Taxation Institute of Hong Kong and a member of each of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Chartered Global Management Accountant. Mr. Tam has more than 15 years of experience in providing accounting, auditing and financial services and has served various senior positions at various private and listed companies. Mr. Tam is currently an executive Director of My Heart Bodibra Group Limited (stock code: 8297), an independent nonexecutive director of Wealth Glory Holdings Limited (stock code: 8269) and AL Group Limited (stock code: 8360), which are listed on the GEM of the Stock Exchange.

Mr. Tam is appointed for a specific term for three years and subject to retirement and re-election provisions in accordance with the Bye-laws. Mr. Tam's annual remuneration is HK\$120,000 which is based on mutual agreement between the Board and Mr. Tam and Mr. Tam's responsibilities and duties in the Company.

DETAILS OF DIRECTORS PROPOSED FOR RE-ELECTION

Mr. Chow Kin Wing, aged 38, is currently the chief financial officer and company secretary of China Fortune Investments (Holding) Limited, (stock code: 8116), a company listed on GEM of The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the "Stock Exchange"). He holds a Bachelor degree in Accounting and Finance from the Queensland University of Technology, Australia. He is an associate member of Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants, an associate member of the Hong Kong Institute of Chartered Secretaries and The Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators. He has more than 13 years of experience in financial management, auditing and accounting in an international accounting firm and a listed company in Hong Kong.

Mr. Chow is appointed for a specific term for three years and subject to retirement and re-election provisions in accordance with the Bye-laws. Mr. Chow's annual remuneration is HK\$120,000 which is based on mutual agreement between the Board and Mr. Chow and Mr. Chow's responsibilities and duties in the Company.

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders of the Company to enable the Shareholders to make informed decision whether to vote for or against the resolution at the Annual General Meeting in relation to the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 4,000,000,000 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution granting the Proposed Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the Annual General Meeting, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 800,000,000 Shares during the period in which the Repurchase Mandate remains in force.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders to seek the Repurchase Mandate which enables the Directors to repurchase the Shares in the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and its Shareholders. The Directors have no present intention to repurchase any Shares.

3. DIRECTORS' DEALING AND CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, or any of their associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) have any present intention, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting, to sell all of their Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries. No connected persons or their respective associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell their Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so in the event that the Company is authorised to make repurchase of the Shares.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases must be funded entirely from the Company's available cash flow or working capital facilities, which will be funded by resources legally available for that purpose in accordance with the Company's Bye-Laws and the laws of Bermuda. The Company is empowered by its memorandum of association and Bye-laws to purchase its Shares. Bermuda law provides that the amount of capital repaid in connection with a share repurchase may only be paid out of either the capital paid up on the relevant shares, or the funds of the Company that would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or the proceeds of a new issue of shares made for such purpose. The amount of premium payable on repurchase may only be paid out of either the funds of the Company that would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the share premium account of the Company.

If the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full, there might be a material adverse effect on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited financial statements contained in the Annual Report). However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements or the gearing levels of the Company.

6. DIRECTORS' UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the applicable Listing Rules and the laws of Bermuda.

7. HONG KONG CODE ON TAKEOVERS AND MERGERS

If on the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a shareholder or group of shareholders acting in concert, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors, Dr. Hui Chi Ming through Hong Kong Finance Investment Limited, Hong Kong Finance Equity Management Limited, Hong Kong Finance Equity Investment Limited, Hong Kong Finance Equity Holding Limited and Wisdom On Holdings Limited was deemed to be interested in an aggregate of 276,516,000 Shares, 775,719,143 Shares, 928,534,284, 514,341,115 and 300,000 Shares respectively, representing approximately 6.91%, 19.39%, 23.22%, 12.86% and 0.01% of the issued share capital of the Company respectively.

The entire issued share capital of Hong Kong Finance Investment Limited, Hong Kong Finance Equity Management Limited, Hong Kong Finance Equity Investment Limited, Hong Kong Finance Equity Holding Limited and Wisdom On Holdings Limited are directly or indirectly wholly-owned by Dr. Hui Chi Ming.
