**1. INTRODUCTION**

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the proposed (i) re-election of retiring Directors; (ii) general mandates to buy back Shares and to issue Shares; (iii) extension of the general mandate to issue Shares; and (iv) to seek your approval of the resolutions relating to these matters at the AGM.

**2. RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS**

The Board currently consists of eight Directors, of which three are Executive Directors, namely Mr. Zhuang Yong, Mr. Yang Lin and Mr. Wang Man Kwan, Paul; two Non-executive Directors, namely Mr. Guo Guanghui and Mr. Yung Kwok Kee, Billy, and three Independent Non-executive Directors, namely Dr. Chung Shui Ming, Timpson, Mr. Lam Kin Fung, Jeffrey and Mr. Lo Yiu Ching, Dantes.

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Pursuant to Article 107 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Zhuang Yong, Mr. Wang Man Kwan, Paul and Mr. Lo Yiu Ching, Dantes shall retire by rotation at the AGM and being eligible, offer themselves for re-election. Brief biographical details of the retiring Directors who are proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

Mr. Lo Yiu Ching, Dantes, being an Independent Non-executive Director eligible for re-election at the AGM, has made an annual confirmation of independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules.

Pursuant to Code Provision B.2.3 of the CG Code, if an independent non-executive director has served more than nine years, such director's further appointment should be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by shareholders.

Mr. Lo Yiu Ching, Dantes has been serving as an Independent Non-executive Director for more than nine years, the Board has, after a thorough discussion and having taken into account of the following factors, concluded that Mr. Lo is still independent and should be re-elected:

- (i) the Nomination Committee and the Board have assessed and reviewed his annual confirmation of independence based on, among others, the criteria set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and are satisfied with the independence of Mr. Lo, and are not aware of any circumstances that might influence Mr. Lo in exercising his independent judgement. The Directors consider that there is no evidence that Mr. Lo's length of tenure has an adverse impact on his independence;
- (ii) the Nomination Committee and the Board have reviewed Mr. Lo's biography and believe that his skills and knowledge, and experience in the Company's affairs will continue to benefit the Board and to enhance the diversity of the Board;
- (iii) the Nomination Committee and the Board are satisfied with Mr. Lo's past performance in discharging his duties as an Independent Non-executive Director, including his attendance record of the meetings of the Board and Board committees, and his active participation and his independent opinion provided in the discussion at the meetings; and
- (iv) the Nomination Committee and the Board consider that Mr. Lo has the required character, integrity, independence and experience to fulfill the role of an Independent Non-executive Director.

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The Board believes that, by reasons of the factors mentioned above, the re-appointment of Mr. Lo will bring considerable stability and significant contribution to the Board and will continue to benefit the Board, the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Mr. Lo will continue to maintain an independent view of the Company's affairs despite his length of tenure, and will continue to bring his relevant knowledge and experience to the Board, and should be eligible for re-election. Separate resolution will be proposed for Mr. Lo's re-election at the AGM in pursuance of Code Provision B.2.3 of the CG Code.

Pursuant to Code Provision B.3.4 of the CG Code, the Nomination Committee and the Board consider that Mr. Lo is able to complement the professional background of the composition of the Board in terms of his expertise in construction and public administration. Mr. Lo devoted sufficient time in fulfilling his role as Independent Non-executive Director and Chairman of the Nomination Committee of the Company. During the past year, he attended and actively participated in the discussions in all four Board meetings, four Audit Committee meetings, two Nomination Committee meetings, two Remuneration Committee meetings and the annual general meeting convened in 2021 which he was eligible to attend. The Board believes that Mr. Lo will continue to dedicate sufficient time and attention to the affairs of the Company.

### 3. GENERAL MANDATE TO BUY BACK SHARES

Pursuant to the Companies Ordinance and the Listing Rules, listed companies incorporated in Hong Kong may in certain circumstances, if authorised by their articles of association, buy back their own shares.

On 21 June 2021, general mandates were given to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to, among others, buy back its own Shares. Such general mandates will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. Therefore, an Ordinary Resolution will be proposed at the AGM to give the Share Buy-back Mandate to the Directors to buy back Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the number of Shares in issue at the date of the passing of the Ordinary Resolution (i.e. not exceeding 342,335,984 Shares based on 3,423,359,841 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming that such number of Shares in issue remains the same at the date of passing the Ordinary Resolution), details of which are set out in Ordinary Resolution No. 6 in the AGM Notice.

Therefore, an Ordinary Resolution will be proposed at the AGM to give the Share Issue Mandate to the Directors to issue Shares up to 20% of the number of Shares in issue at the date of the passing of the Ordinary Resolution (i.e. not exceeding 684,671,968 Shares based on 3,423,359,841 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming that such number of Shares in issue remains the same at the date of passing the Ordinary Resolution). In addition, an Ordinary Resolution will be proposed to authorise extension of the Share Issue Mandate which would increase the limit of the Share Issue Mandate by adding to it the number of Shares bought back under the Share Buy-back Mandate.

Mr. Zhuang joined China Overseas Development Group Co., Ltd.\* (“CODG”, a wholly-owned subsidiary of COLI) in 2000 and since then, he worked in various business units within CODG, such as, human resources department, sales and marketing management department, and acted as the deputy general manager of the Shanghai branch, general manager of the Nanjing branch, general manager of the Suzhou branch and assistant general manager of the Western China regional companies. Such emoluments are determined by the Board with reference to the Company's standards for emoluments, his job responsibilities, the prevailing market conditions and the Company's operating performance and profitability.

**Mr. LO Yiu Ching, Dantes, Independent Non-executive Director***Experience*

Mr. Lo, aged 76, graduated in London in 1970 and further obtained his Master of Science degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Hong Kong in 1980. He is a fellow of the Institution of Civil Engineers, a fellow of the Institution of Structural Engineers and a fellow of the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers.

Mr. Lo had been engaged both in Hong Kong and overseas in the administration, planning, design and supervision of major capital works projects in civil and structural engineering, including multi-storey buildings, slope works, construction of roads and bridges, reclamations and port works and new town development. In 1970, Mr. Lo started his career with Ove Arup & Partners in London as a project engineer. He joined the Hong Kong Government in 1974 as an engineer and was promoted to director of Civil Engineering Department in 1999 and then director of Highways Department in 2000. In 2002, Mr. Lo was appointed the permanent secretary for the Environment, Transport and Works (Works). He retired from the civil service in 2006. In particular, he had made valuable contribution in steering forward major public works projects and in promoting quality improvements in the construction industry.

He has been appointed as a distinguished adjunct professor in the Department of Civil Engineering, The University of Hong Kong since 2003. Since May 2010, Mr. Lo has been appointed as an Independent Non-executive Director of the Company, members of the Audit Committee, Remuneration Committee and Nomination Committee of the Company. He has also been appointed as the Chairman of the Nomination Committee of the Company with effect from 17 March 2016. In addition, Mr. Lo has been appointed as an independent non-executive director of Build King Holdings Limited with effect from 30 November 2018.

#### *Director's emoluments*

Mr. Lo's current Director's emoluments are HK\$400,000 per annum. Such emoluments are determined by the Board with reference to the Company's standards for emoluments, his job responsibilities, the prevailing market conditions and the Company's operating performance and profitability.

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide requisite information to Shareholders for their consideration of the Share Buy-back Mandate. This explanatory statement further constitutes the memorandum required under section 239(2) of the Companies Ordinance.

## **1. LISTING RULES**

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listing are on the Stock Exchange to buy back their fully paid up shares on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions, the most important of which are summarised below:

### **(a) Source of funds**

Buy-back must be funded out of funds which are legally available for the purpose and in accordance with the company's constitutive documents and the laws of the jurisdiction in which the company is incorporated or otherwise established.

### **(b) Maximum number of shares to be bought back**

A maximum of 10% of the number of shares of a company in issue at the date of passing the relevant resolution may be bought back on the Stock Exchange.

## **2. SHARE CAPITAL — NUMBER OF SHARES IN ISSUE**

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 3,423,359,841 Shares.

Subject to the passing of Ordinary Resolution and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or bought back prior to the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Share Buy-back Mandate to buy back a maximum of 342,335,984 Shares.

## **3. REASON FOR BUY-BACK**

The Directors believe that the Share Buy-back Mandate is in the best interest of the Company and its Shareholders. Such buy-backs may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such buy-backs will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

**4. FUNDING OF BUY-BACK**

In buying back Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its Articles of Association and the Companies Ordinance. The Companies Ordinance provides that a company may make a payment in respect of a share buy-back which may only be paid from the distributable profits of the company or from the proceeds of a new issue of shares made for the purpose.

There might be material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report for the year ended 31 December 2021) in the event that the Share Buy-back Mandate was to be exercised in full at any time during the proposed buy-back period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Share Buy-back Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

## 6. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the powers of the Company to make buy-back pursuant to the proposed Ordinary Resolution in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Hong Kong.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Star Amuse and Chung Hoi Finance (the "**Concert Group**") were beneficially interested in approximately 38.32% of the Shares in issue. In the event that the Directors exercised the Share Buy-back Mandate in full, the shareholdings of the Concert Group would increase by more than 2% of the Shares in issue. As a result of the exercise of the Share Buy-back Mandate in full, the Concert Group may become obliged to make a mandatory general offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. It is not the present intention of the Directors to exercise the Share Buy-back Mandate in such manner as to trigger off any general offer obligations.
