### 1. INTRODUCTION

At the AGM, certain resolutions will be proposed to inter alia, approve (i) the re-election of the retiring Directors; (ii) the granting of the Share Issue Mandate and the Share Repurchase Mandate respectively; and (iii) the adoption of the New Bye-laws.

### 2. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

In accordance with the Company's Bye-law 87(1), Ms. Xia Ping and Mr. Duan Rihuang will retire from office by rotation, and being eligible, offer themselves for re-election as Director at the forthcoming AGM. In accordance with the Company's Bye-law 86(2), any Director appointed to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office until the first general meeting after his appointment and be subject to re-election at such meeting. Therefore, Mr. Tso Sze Wai and Mr. Wang Rongfang retire from office in the forthcoming AGM, and being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the forthcoming AGM.

The nomination committee and the Board, after taking into account the nomination policy and board diversity policy of the Company, are of the view that the proposed re-election of Mr. Duan Rihuang, Ms. Xia Ping, Mr. Tso Sze Wai and Mr. Wang Rongfang are beneficial to the Board as the Company would be able to enjoy their comprehensive business experience that contributes to the expertise, continuity and stability of the Board. The Company has benefited from their contribution and valuable insights. The nomination committee believes that each of Mr. Duan Rihuang, Ms. Xia Ping, Mr. Tso Sze Wai and Mr. Wang Rongfang will continue to contribute effectively to the Board and thus recommended re-election of the aforesaid retiring Directors to the Board.

The nomination committee of the Company and the Board had assessed and reviewed the annual written confirmation of independence of Mr. Duan Rihuang, Mr. Tso Sze Wai and Mr. Wang Rongfang and considered that they satisfied all the independence criteria as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules.

Particulars of the aforesaid Directors standing for re-election are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

### 3. PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE NEW SHARES

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed to grant to the Directors a general mandate to allot, issue and otherwise deal with additional Shares of not exceeding 20% of the total number of issued Shares of the Company as at the date of passing of the proposed resolution to approve this Share Issue Mandate.

The Share Issue Mandate will, if granted, remain effective until the earliest of:

- (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company;
- (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the bye-laws of the Company or any applicable laws to be held; and
- (iii) the date on which the authority set out in this resolution is revoked or varied by passing of an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

In addition, if the Share Issue Mandate and Share Repurchase Mandate are granted, a separate ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM to increase the number of Shares which may be allotted and issued under the Share Issue Mandate by the number of Shares repurchased under the Share Repurchase Mandate (up to a maximum of 10% of the total number of issued Shares of the Company as at the date of the grant of the Share Issue Mandate).

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were 2,819,102,084 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the relevant ordinary resolution and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the date of the AGM, the Company would be authorised under the Share Issue Mandate to issue up to a maximum of 563,820,416 Shares.

### 4. PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will also be proposed to grant to the Directors a general mandate to repurchase Shares up to 10% of the total number of issued Shares of the Company as at the date of passing of the proposed resolution to approve this Share Repurchase Mandate (i.e. a total of 281,910,208 Shares on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the date of the AGM).

The Share Repurchase Mandate will, if granted, remain effective until the earliest of:

- (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company;
- (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the bye-laws of the Company or any applicable laws to be held; and
- (iii) the date on which the authority set out in this resolution is revoked or varied by passing of an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

An explanatory statement in relation to the Share Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

### 5. ADOPTION OF NEW BYE-LAWS

Reference is made to the announcement of the Company dated 8 April 2022 in relation to the adoption of the New Bye-laws.

In order to (i) bring the Existing Bye-laws in line with the relevant requirements of the Listing Rules (in particular the core standards set out in Appendix 3 thereto) and the laws of Bermuda; and (ii) make other consequential and housekeeping amendments to the Existing Bye-laws, the Board resolved to seek approval of the Shareholders at the AGM to adopt the New Bye-laws, in substitution for, and to the exclusion of, the Existing Bye-laws.

A summary of the areas under the Existing Bye-laws which will be subject to material change is set out below:

- 1. to reflect the changes of names of the Company;
- to provide that the Company must hold an annual general meeting in each financial
  year and such annual general meeting must be held within six months after the end of
  the Company's financial year;
- 3. to provide that meeting of members or any class thereof may be held by means of such telephone, electronic or other communication facilities as to permit all persons participating in the meeting to communicate with each other simultaneously and instantaneously, and participation in such a meeting shall constitute presence at such meeting;
- 4. to provide that an annual general meeting of the Company must be called by notice of not less than twenty-one clear days, while all other general meetings (including a special general meeting or a special meeting at which the passing of a special resolution is to be considered) must be called by notice of not less than fourteen clear days but if permitted by the Listing Rules;
- 5. to provide that all Shareholders shall have the right to (i) speak at a general meeting of the Company; and (ii) vote at a general meeting of the Company, except where a Shareholder is required, by the Listing Rules, to abstain from voting to approve the matter under consideration;

- 6. to provide that any Director appointed by the Board to fill a casual vacancy on the Board or as an addition to the existing Board shall hold office until the next following annual general meeting of the Company after his appointment and shall then be eligible for re-election;
- 7. to update the provision providing the circumstances under which a Director is not prohibited from voting (or being counted in the quorum) on any resolution of the Board approving any contract or arrangement or any other proposal in which he or any of his close associates is materially interested, in accordance with the requirements under the Listing Rules, following the repeal of the relevant requirements in Appendix 3 to the Listing Rules;
- 8. to provide that the Shareholders may approve the removal of the auditor of the Company at any time before the expiration of his term of office by way of an extraordinary resolution;
- 9. to update the provision regarding the appointment of the auditor of the Company to fill any casual vacancy in the office of the auditor of the Company that any such auditor appointed shall hold office until the next following annual general meeting of the Company and shall then be subject to appointment by the Shareholders; and
- 10. to update and tidy up definitions and other references, and to make consequential amendments in line with the above amendments and other house-keeping amendments.

Please refer to Appendix III to this circular for the full particulars of the proposed amendments to the Existing Bye-laws brought about by the New Bye-laws (showing changes to the Existing Bye-laws).

The legal advisers of the Company as to the laws of Hong Kong have confirmed to the Company that the New Bye-laws conform with the relevant parts of Appendix 3 to the Listing Rules; and the legal advisers of the Company as to the laws of Bermuda have confirmed to the Company that the New Bye-laws do not violate the laws of Bermuda. In addition, the Company has confirmed to the Stock Exchange that there is nothing unusual about the New Bye-laws for a company listed in Hong Kong.

The proposed adoption of the New Bye-laws is subject to the approval of the Shareholders by way of a special resolution at the AGM.

### 6. LISTING RULES REQUIREMENT

In accordance with Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. Therefore, the chairman of the AGM will therefore demand a poll for every resolution put to the vote at the AGM pursuant to Bye-law 66 of the Company's Bye-laws.

In order to be valid, the form of proxy must be completed, signed and returned to the Company's branch share registrar in Hong Kong, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, located at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong in accordance with the instructions printed thereon, together with a power of attorney or other authority, if any, under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority, not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the AGM or adjourned meeting. The completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting at the AGM or adjourned meeting (as the case may be) should you so wish.

### 8. RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility for the accuracy of the information contained in this circular and confirm, having made all reasonable enquiries, that to the best of their knowledge and belief, there are no other facts the omission of which would make any statement herein misleading.

### 9. RECOMMENDATION

### Ms. Xia Ping

Ms. Xia Ping ("Ms. Xia"), aged 50, was appointed an executive Director and a member of the Remuneration Committee on 30 September 2019. Ms. Xia graduated from the East China University of Technology, Fuzhou Normal University\*(東華理工大學撫洲師範學院), majoring in Chinese Language and Literature in 1992 and the China Central Radio and TV University\*(中央廣播電視大學) in the PRC majoring in Chinese Language and Literature in 2005 and obtained the qualification of intermediate accountant issued by the Ministry of Finance of the PRC in 2006. She is the executive president of Shenzhen Haogang Zhongya Electronic City Group Co., Ltd.\*(深圳市空崗中亞電子城集團股份有限責任公司). Besides, Ms. Xia also acts as an executive director of Zhongya Daye Industrial Park Management Co., Ltd.\*(中亞大冶產業園管理有限公司), a director of Shenzhen Zhongya Film Industry Co., Ltd.\*(中亞大冶產業園管理有限公司) and a supervisor of Shenzhen Zhongya Film Industry Co., Ltd.\*(中亞視界科技(深圳)有限公司). Ms. Xia remuneration was determined with reference to her experience, responsibility, market conditions and the Company's remuneration policy, and was recommended by the remuneration committee of the Company and approved by the Board.

Save as disclosed herein and as at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Xia did not hold any position in the Company or any of its subsidiaries nor had any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial shareholder or controlling shareholder of the Company; any directorship in other public companies, the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the past three years or other major appointments and professional qualifications. Ms. Xia did not have, and was not deemed to have any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Save as disclosed above, there is no information that is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rule 13.5 1(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules and there is no other matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

### Mr. Duan Rihuang

Mr. Duan Rihuang ("Mr. Duan"), aged 64, was appointed as an independent non-executive Director and a member of the Remuneration Committee, the Nomination Committee and the Audit Committee on 12 June 2020. Mr. Duan is entitled to an annual remuneration of HK\$200,000, which was determined with reference to his experience, responsibilities, market condition and the Company's remuneration policy, and was recommended by the remuneration committee of the Company and approved by the Board.

Save as disclosed herein and as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Duan did not hold any position in the Company or any of its subsidiaries nor had any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial shareholder or controlling shareholder of the Company. In addition, Mr. Duan did not have any directorship in other public companies, the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the past three years or other major appointments and professional qualifications. Mr. Duan did not have, and was not deemed to have, any interests in any shares, underlying shares or debentures of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Mr. Duan has confirmed that he meets the independence criteria as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules.

### Mr. Tso Sze Wai

Mr. Tso Sze Wai ("Mr Tso"), age 51, was appointed as an independent non-executive Director and the chairman of the audit committee of the Company ("Audit Committee") on 2 July 2021.

Mr. Tso holds a bachelor's degree in Commerce awarded by University of New South Wales, Australia and a postgraduate diploma in Computing awarded by the University of Western Sydney, Australia. He is a member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

Mr. Tso has been serving as an independent non-executive director of China Jicheng Holdings Limited, the shares of which are listed on the Stock Exchange (stock code: 1027), since October 2016. He has also been an independent non-executive director of a company the shares of which are listed on the Singapore Stock Exchange, namely Net Pacific Financial Holdings Limited (stock code: SGX:5QY), since July 2020. He has over 20 years of experience in accounting, corporate finance and corporate secretarial matters. He was a company secretary of Green Energy Group Limited, a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange (Stock Code: 979). Prior to that, he had held senior management positions in a number of listed companies in Hong Kong and Singapore.

Mr. Tso has entered into an appointment letter with the Company for a fixed term of 3 years commencing from 2 July 2021 (which shall continue for further successive periods until terminated by either party giving at least two (2) months' notice). He is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the annual general meetings of the Company in accordance with the bye-laws of the Company and the Listing Rules.

Mr. Tso is entitled to receive a director's fee of HK\$20,000 per month, which was determined by the Board based on the recommendation by the remuneration committee of the Company, with reference to his qualification, experience, and duties and responsibilities within the Company, the remuneration policies of the Company and prevailing market rates.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Tso (i) does not hold any other positions in the Company or any of its subsidiaries; (ii) has not held any other directorship in other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years; (iii) does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders of the Company; and (iv) does not have any interest in the shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

From 2014 to 2017, he served as the project head (general management) with Fujian Mingcheng Construction (Group) Co., Ltd.\* (福 建名城建工有限公司)in charge of the Evergrande Lvzhou Phase II Project\*(恒大綠洲二期工 程項目). From 2017 to 2018, he served as the project head (general management) of Engineering Company of CCCC Fourth Harbor Engineering Co., Ltd\*(中交四航局第三工程有限公司) in charge of the Kaichun Expressway Section TJO8 First Work Zone Road Foundation Project\* (開 春高速路TJO8標第一工區路基工程項目). In 2019, he served as the project head of MCC 1 Malaysia 8cnlag Labour Service Construction Project(一治馬來西亞8cnIag勞務施工項目) with MCC International (M) Sdn. Bhd.\* (中治國際馬來西亞有限公司). Since April 2020, he has been serving as the deputy general manager of Zhongan Zhonghui (Shenzhen) Industrial Co., Ltd.\* (中 安中慧(深圳)實業有限公司).

Mr. Wang has entered into an appointment letter with the Company for a fixed term of 3 years commencing from 23 June 2021 (which shall continue for further successive periods until terminated by either party giving at least two (2) months' notice). He is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meeting(s) requirements in accordance with the byelaws of the Company and the Listing Rules. Mr. Wang is entitled to receive a director's fee of HK\$20,000 per month, which was determined by the Board based on the recommendation by the remuneration committee of the Company, with reference to his qualification, experience, and duties and responsibilities within the Company, the remuneration policies of the Company and prevailing market rates.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, save as disclosed above, Mr. Wang (i) does not hold any other positions in the Company or any of its subsidiaries; (ii) has not held any other directorship in other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years; (iii) does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders of the Company; and (iv) does not have any interest in the shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO).

Save as disclosed above, the Board is not aware of other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders or the Stock Exchange, and there is no other information which is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rule 13.51(2) (h) to (v) of the Listing Rules.

# EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE SHARE REPURCHASE MANDATE

The following is an explanatory statement as required under Rule 10.06(1)(b) of the Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate.

### 1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 2,819,102,084 Shares. Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution set out in item 5 of the notice of the AGM in respect of the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that the total number of issued Shares remains unchanged until the date of the AGM, i.e. being 2,819,102,084 Shares, the Directors would be authorised under the Share Repurchase Mandate to repurchase, during the period in which the Share Repurchase Mandate remains in force, a total number of 281,910,208 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of the AGM.

### 2. REASONS FOR SHARE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Repurchases of Shares may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

### 3. FUNDING OF SHARE REPURCHASE

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the bye-laws of the Company, the laws of Bermuda and/or any other applicable laws, and the Listing Rules as the case may be.

### 4. IMPACT OF SHARE REPURCHASE

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared to the position disclosed in the audited consolidated financial statements contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2021) in the event that the Share Repurchase Mandate was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Share Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

### 6. GENERAL

To the best of their knowledge and having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors nor any of their respective close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Company has not been notified by any core connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company that they have a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or that they have undertaken not to sell any Shares held by them to the Company in the event that the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

# EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE SHARE REPURCHASE MANDATE

### 7. TAKEOVERS CODE

If, as a result of a repurchase of Shares pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (as defined in the Takeovers Code), depending on the level of increase in the Shareholder's interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and thereby become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

To the best knowledge of the Company, as at the Latest Practicable Date, China Asia Graphene Holding Group Co. Limited (previously known as Zhonghan International Holdings Group Limited), the controlling Shareholder (as defined in the Listing Rules), was interested in 2,112,395,735 Shares, representing approximately 74.93% of the issued Shares. In the event that the Directors exercise in full the Share Repurchase Mandate to repurchase Shares, then (if the present shareholding otherwise remains the same) the shareholding of China Asia Graphene Holding Group Co. Limited would be increased to approximately 83.26% of the issued Shares. Such increase would not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code but would reduce the amount of Shares held by the public (as defined in the Listing Rules) to less than 25% of the total issued Shares. The Company has no present intention to repurchase Shares to such extent as to result in the amount of Shares held by the public (as defined in the Listing Rules) being reduced to less than 25%.

### 8. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

During the six months prior to the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had not repurchased any of the Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise).

Full particulars of the proposed amendments to the Existing Bye-laws brought about by the adoption of the New Bye-laws (showing changes to the Existing Bye-laws) are set out as follows. Unless otherwise specified, clauses, paragraphs and bye-law numbers referred to herein are clauses, paragraphs and article numbers of the New Bye-laws.

- 2.(k) a resolution shall be an extraordinary resolution when it has been passed by a majority of not less than two-thirds of votes cast by such Members as, being entitled so to do, vote in person or, in the case of such Members as are corporations, by their respective duly authorised representative or, where proxies are allowed, by proxy at a general meeting of which Notice has been duly given in accordance with Bye-law 59;
- 2.(1) references to a document being executed include references to it being executed under hand or under seal or by electronic signature or by any other method and references to a notice or document include a notice or document recorded or stored in any digital, electronic, electrical, magnetic or other retrievable form or medium and information in visible form whether having physical substance or not.

Members affected as a result of the foregoing sentence shall not be, or be deemed to be, a separate class of members for any purpose whatsoever.
- 12.(2) The Board may issue warrants or convertible securities or securities of similar nature conferring the right upon the holders thereof to subscribe for any class of shares or securities in the capital of the Company on such terms as it may from time to time determine.

- 68. On a poll votes may be given either personally or by proxy.
- 69. A poll demanded on the election of a chairman, or on a question of adjournment, shall be taken forthwith. A poll demanded on any other question shall be taken in such manner (including the use of ballot or voting papers or tickets) and either forthwith or at such time (being not later than thirty (30) days after the date of the demand) and place as the chairman directs. It shall not be necessary (unless the chairman otherwise directs) for notice to be given of a poll not taken immediately.
- 70. The demand for a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting or the transaction of any business other than the question on which the poll has been demanded, and, with the consent of the chairman, it may be withdrawn at any time before the close of the meeting or the taking of the poll, whichever is the earlier.
- All questions submitted to a meeting shall be decided by a simple majority of votes except where a greater majority is required by these Bye-laws or by the Act. In the case of an equality of votes, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, the chairman of such meeting shall be entitled to a second or casting vote in addition to any other vote he may have.
- A Member who is a patient for any purpose relating to mental health or in respect of whom an order has been made by any court having jurisdiction for the protection or management of the affairs of persons incapable of managing their own affairs may vote, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, by his receiver, committee, curator bonis or other person in the nature of a receiver, committee or curator bonis appointed by such court, and such receiver, committee, curator bonis or other person may vote on a poll by proxy, and may otherwise act and be treated as if he were the registered holder of such shares for the purposes of general meetings, provided that such evidence as the Board may require of the authority of the person claiming to vote shall have been deposited at the Office, head office or Registration Office, as appropriate, not less than forty-eight (48) hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting, or adjourned meeting or poll, as the case may be.

- All Members have the right to (a) speak at a general meeting; and (b) vote at a general meeting except where a Member is required, by the rules of the Designated Stock Exchange, to abstain from voting to approve the matter under consideration.
- Where the Company has knowledge that any Member is, under the rules<sub>2</sub>-where appropriate, of the Designated Stock Exchange, required to abstain from voting on any particular resolution of the Company or restricted to voting only for or only against any particular resolution of the Company, any votes cast by or on behalf of such Member in contravention of such requirement or restriction shall not be counted.
- Any Member entitled to attend and vote at a meeting of the Company shall be entitled to appoint another person as his proxy to attend and vote instead of him. A Member who is the holder of two or more shares may appoint more than one proxy to represent him and vote on his behalf at a general meeting of the Company or at a class meeting. A proxy need not be a Member. A proxy shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of In addition, a proxy or proxies representing either a Member who is an individual and for whom he acts as proxy as such Member could exercise. In addition, a proxy or a Member which is a corporation shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of a the Member which is a corporation and for which he acts as proxy or they represent as such Member could exercise if it were an individual Member.
- <del>80</del>77. The instrument appointing a proxy and (if required by the Board) the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed, or a certified copy of such power or authority, shall be delivered to such place or one of such places (if any) as may be specified for that purpose in or by way of note to or in any document accompanying the notice convening the meeting (or, if no place is so specified at the Registration Office or the Office, as may be appropriate) not less than forty-eight (48) hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote-or, in the case of a poll taken subsequently to the date of a meeting or adjourned meeting, not less than twenty-four (24) hours before the time appointed for the taking of the poll and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid. No instrument appointing a proxy shall be valid after the expiration of twelve (12) months from the date named in it as the date of its execution, except at an adjourned meeting or on a poll demanded at a meeting or an adjourned meeting in cases where the meeting was originally held within twelve (12) months from such date. Delivery of an instrument appointing a proxy shall not preclude a Member from attending and voting in person at the meeting convened and in such event, the instrument appointing a proxy shall be deemed to be revoked.

Instruments of proxy shall be in any common form or in such other form as the Board may approve (provided that this shall not preclude the use of the two-way form) and the Board may, if it thinks fit, send out with the notice of any meeting forms of instrument of proxy for use at the meeting. The instrument of proxy shall be deemed to confer authority to demand or join in demanding a poll and to vote on any amendment of a resolution put to the meeting for which it is given as the proxy thinks fit. The instrument of proxy shall, unless the contrary is stated therein, be valid as well for any adjournment of the meeting as for the meeting to which it relates.

A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument of proxy shall be valid notwithstanding the previous death or insanity of the principal, or revocation of the instrument of proxy or of the authority under which it was executed, provided that no intimation in writing of such death, insanity or revocation shall have been received by the Company at the Office or the Registration Office (or such other place as may be specified for the delivery of instruments of proxy in the notice convening the meeting or other document sent therewith) two(2) hours at least before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting, or the taking of the poll, at which the instrument of proxy is used.
- Any corporation which is a Member may by resolution of its directors or other governing body authorise such person as it thinks fit to act as its representative at any meeting of the Company or at any meeting of any class of Members. The person so authorised shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of such corporation as the corporation could exercise if it were an individual Member and such corporation shall for the purposes of these Bye-laws be deemed to be present in person at any such meeting if a person so authorised is present thereat.

- If permitted by the Act, Where a Member is a clearing house (or its nominee(s) if and, in each case, being a corporation being a Member), it may authorise such persons as it thinks fit to act as its representatives at any meeting of the Company or at any meeting of any class of Members provided that the authorisation shall specify the number and class of shares in respect of which each such representative is so authorised. Each person so authorised under the provisions of this Bye-law shall be deemed to have been duly authorised without further evidence of the facts and be entitled to exercise the same rights and powers on behalf of the clearing house (or its nominee(s)) as if such person was the registered holder of the shares of the Company held by the clearing house (or its nominee) (s) in respect of the number and class of shares specified in the relevant authorisation including, where a show of hands is allowed, the right to vote individually on a show of hands.
- Unless otherwise determined by the Company in general meeting, the number of Directors shall not be less than two (2). There shall be no maximum number of Directors unless otherwise determined from time to time by the Members in general meeting. Any Director appointed pursuant to Bye-law 863(2) shall not be taken into account in determining which particular Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation.
- 8986.(1) resigns his office by notice in writing delivered to the Company at the Office or tendered at a meeting of the Board-whereupon the Board resolves to accept such resignation;
- 8986.(6) No Director shall be required to vacate office or be ineligible for re-election or re-appointment as a Director, and no person shall be ineligible for appointment as a Directors, by reason only of his having attained any particular age.

- 166164.(1) The Directors, Secretary and other officers and every Auditor for the time being of the Company at any time, whether at present or in the past, and the liquidator or trustees (if any) for the time being acting or who have acted in relation to any of the affairs of the Company and everyone of them, and everyone of their heirs, executors and administrators, shall be indemnified and secured harmless out of the assets and profits of the Company from and against all actions, costs, charges, losses, damages and expenses which they or any of them, their or any of their heirs, executors or administrators, shall or may incur or sustain by or by reason of any act done, concurred in or omitted in or about the execution of their duty, or supposed duty, in their respective offices or trusts; and none of them shall be answerable for the acts, receipts, neglects or defaults of the other or others of them or for joining in any receipts for the sake of conformity, or for any bankers or other persons with whom any moneys or effects belonging to the Company shall or may be lodged or deposited for safe custody, or for insufficiency or deficiency of any security upon which any moneys of or belonging to the Company shall be placed out on or invested, or for any other loss, misfortune or damage which may happen in the execution of their respective offices or trusts, or in relation thereto; PROVIDED THAT this indemnity shall not extend to any matter in respect of any wilful negligence, wilful default, fraud or dishonesty which may attach to any of said persons.
