VOLUNTARY ANNOUNCEMENT PILOT REHABILITATION PROGRAMME FOR EMPLOYEES INJURED AT WORK

This announcement is made by Human Health Holdings Limited (the "Company", together with its subsidiaries, the "Group") on a voluntary basis to provide shareholders and potential investors of the Company with the latest business update of the Group.

The board (the "Board") of directors (the "Directors") of the Company wishes to announce that Actmax Limited (the indirect wholly owned subsidiary of the Company) has been awarded the tender for the provision of services under the 3-year "Pilot Rehabilitation Programme for Employees Injured at Work" (the "Pilot Programme") launched by the Labour Department. The Pilot Programme is rolled out today (23rd September 2022). It aims to provide timely and well-coordinated private out-patient rehabilitation treatment services for injured construction employees who have been absent or are expected to be absent from work for six weeks or more because of the work injury so as to prevent their injury from developing into chronic illness and facilitate their early recovery and return to work.

The cost of the Pilot Programme is mainly borne by the Government. Human Health estimates that the total amount involved is approximately HK\$310 million. The actual expenditure will depend on factors such as the number of injured employees participating in the Pilot Programme and their service needs. A Work Injury Rehabilitation Office ("WIRO") is established under the Pilot Programme and the Group is responsible for its daily operations and management. There are over 70

rehabilitation treatment service locations across Hong Kong Island, Kowloon and the New Territories, to provide greater convenience for participants. The Pilot Programme covers case management services and rehabilitation treatment services including medical treatment (provided by general practitioner, specialists in orthopaedics or specialists in occupational and environmental medicine), physiotherapy, occupational therapy, imaging examination service and electrodiagnostic testing service. The Labour Department will, based on the reported work injury cases, preliminarily identify suitable injured construction employees and contact them to introduce the Pilot Programme. The Labour Department will, with the consent of the injured employees, pass their information to WIRO to follow up on the procedures for participation. Each participant will be followed up and arranged to receive early rehabilitation treatment by a designated case manager.

The Group has formed a strategic partnership with the CUHK Medical Centre Limited ("CUHKMC") to participate in the Pilot Programme. The strategic partnership formed between the Group and CUHKMC will synergise the Group's mature administrative management experience and strong operation network with CUHKMC's professionalism in rehabilitation, as well as clinical quality assurance and personnel training.

CUHKMC is a non-profit, private teaching hospital wholly owned by The Chinese University of Hong Kong. With a social mission to bridge the service gap between the public and private healthcare systems, CUHKMC is dedicated to offering quality healthcare service at affordable and transparent package prices. To the best of the Directors' knowledge, information and belief, having made all reasonable enquiries, CUHKMC and its ultimate beneficial owner are third parties independent of the Company and its connected persons (as defined under the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited).

The Board believes that the Pilot Programme can help injured construction employees recover and return to work early, prevent their work injuries from turning into chronic conditions, help reducing work-injury payouts of employers arising from delayed treatment of their employees, and help maintain enterprises' productivity, thereby bringing benefits to both injured employees and employers and the community as a whole. In addition, the Pilot Programme shall contribute a steady income stream to the Group, provide foundation for the Group to develop its rehabilitation services and strengthen its collaboration with the Hong Kong Government. Besides, the strategic partnership formed with the CUHKMC would facilitate the development of the medical

services of the Group and expect that there would be ample collaboration opportunities in the future.
