I. INTRODUCTION

References are made to the announcement of the Company dated 13 December 2022 in relation to the entry into 2023 Framework Agreements and the announcement of the Company dated 13 December 2022 in relation to the Proposed Amendments.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

The purpose of this circular is to provide (i) further details of the 2023 Framework Agreements and the transactions contemplated thereunder to the Independent Shareholders; (ii) the letter from the Independent Board Committee to the Independent Shareholders; (iii) a letter of advice from the Independent Financial Adviser to the Independent Board Committee and the Independent Shareholders; (iv) further information about the Proposed Amendments and adoption of the New Memorandum and Articles to the Shareholders; (v) other information as required under the Listing Rules; and (vi) the notice of the EGM.

II. 2023 FRAMEWORK AGREEMENTS

Background

Reference is made to the announcement of the Company dated 21 March 2022 that Sichuan Lingwei (an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company) entered into (i) the Existing Huili FM Agreement with Huili Caitong and Xiushuihe Mining; and (ii) the Existing Yanyuan FM Agreement with Yanyuan Xigang. Pursuant to the Existing Framework Agreements, Sichuan Lingwei has agreed to provide facility management services, comprising operational site routine services and mining engineering support and consultancy services (“**FM Services**”), to the mining camps of Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang from 1 April 2022 to 31 December 2022 (the “**Previous Announcement**”).

On 13 December 2022 (after trading hours), Sichuan Lingwei entered into (i) the 2023 Huili FM Agreement with Huili Caitong and Xiushuihe Mining; and (ii) the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement with Yanyuan Xigang. Pursuant to the 2023 Framework Agreements, Sichuan Lingwei has agreed to provide FM Services to the mining camps of Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang. The term of the 2023 Huili FM Agreement and the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement is from 1 January 2023 or the date of approval of the 2023 Framework Agreements by the Independent Shareholders at the general meeting of the Company (whichever is the later) until 31 December 2025.

Save for the parties and the service fees, the principal terms of the 2023 Huili FM Agreement and the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement are substantially the same.

2023 Framework Agreements

A summary of the salient terms of the 2023 Huili FM Agreement and the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement are set out below:

Date: 13 December 2022

Parties: **In respect of the 2023 Huili FM Agreement:**

(i) Huili Caitong (as customer);

- (ii) Xiushuihe Mining (as customer); and
- (iii) Sichuan Lingwei (as service provider)

In respect of the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement:

- (i) Yanyuan Xigang (as customer); and
- (ii) Sichuan Lingwei (as service provider)

Term: From 1 January 2023 or the date of approval of the 2023 Framework Agreements by the Independent Shareholders at the general meeting of the Company (whichever is the later) until 31 December 2025.

Service Scope: Sichuan Lingwei is responsible for providing with a wide range of FM Services, including but not limited to:

- (i) **Fixed Fee Services** generally comprising cleaning services, security services, meal processing services, vehicle driving services, greening services, loader driving services, water pumping services, pipeline inspection services, warehouse management services and weighing services; and
- (ii) **Volume-based Fee Services** generally comprising engineering labor services, canteen contract operation services, vehicle leasing services and consultancy services.

Annual Caps: **In respect of the 2023 Huili FM Agreement:**

It is expected that the service fees (excluding VAT and other taxes) payable by Huili Caitong and Xiushuihe Mining to Sichuan Lingwei for the FM Services provided by Sichuan Lingwei for each of the three years ending 31 December 2025 shall be no more than RMB23.0 million, RMB30.0 million and RMB30.0 million, respectively.

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In respect of the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement:

It is expected that the service fees (excluding VAT and other taxes) payable by Yanyuan Xigang to Sichuan Lingwei for the FM Services provided by Sichuan Lingwei for each of the three years ending 31 December 2025 shall be no more than RMB3.0 million, RMB4.0 million and RMB4.0 million, respectively.

Pricing and Other Pertinent Terms:

The service fees for the FM Services under the 2023 Framework Agreements shall be determined on arm's length basis with reference to the pricing policy as set out in the paragraph below headed "Pricing Policy".

The parties to the 2023 Framework Agreements have also agreed as follows:

- (i) the parties shall enter into Specific Agreements which will set out the necessary terms and conditions for the relevant transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements in the ordinary course of business after arm's length negotiations on normal commercial terms; and
- (ii) the Specific Agreements shall conform with the principles and provisions as set out in the 2023 Framework Agreements.

Historical Amount

The historical actual amount recorded for the period from 1 April 2022 to 31 December 2022 in relation to the Existing Huili FM Agreement and the Existing Yanyuan FM Agreement is as follows:

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The Company has utilised 100% of its historical annual cap of the Existing Huili FM Agreement and the Existing Yanyuan FM Agreement in relation to the operational site services. However, the historical annual cap for the mining engineering support and consultancy services has not been utilised given that the contracting parties under the Existing Huili FM Agreement and the Existing Yanyuan FM Agreement have deferred and/or reschedule their mining engineering-related capital expenditure spending due to intermittent interruptions brought about by the implementation of various strict control measures in view of zero-COVID policy in China.

The Company confirms that for the year ended 31 December 2022, the actual transaction amount did not exceed the annual cap in relation to the Existing Framework Agreements.

Proposed Annual Caps and the Basis of Determination

Basis of Determination

The proposed annual caps for the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements are arrived at after taking into consideration of, among others, the following:

- (i) historical transaction amounts arising from the Existing Framework Agreements;

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- (ii) the anticipated expansion in the scope of services which may require higher levels of technical customisation and the contemplated increase in project activities with reference to the proposed operational plans, among others:
- the anticipated expansion of scope of services commencing from early 2023 which will include loader driving services; water pumping services; pipeline inspection services; warehouse management services and weighing services;
 - the anticipated gradual increase and resumption in mining and production capacities given the signs of potential exit of zero-COVID policy in China that may lead to increasingly higher utilisation rates commencing from the fourth quarter of 2023;
 - the anticipated completion of an additional mine tailings facility in 2024 which will require additional general workers to support the Fixed Fee Services as well as additional skilled labors to manage the engineering labor services; and
 - the anticipated expansion of canteen contract operations and vehicle leasing services in particular, from 2024 onwards, will result in the deployment of additional general workers in supporting the Volume-based Services;
- (iii) the types, locations and conditions of the facilities, including, among others, the level of complexity and the topography of the mining camps which may require deployment of additional skilled labor and specialised mining equipment;
- (iv) the anticipated increase in the number of labor (general workers and technical skilled labors), which may double that of the 2022 level, taking into account of the above operational plans and the increasingly higher capacity utilisation rates for mining engineering project activities from the fourth quarter of 2023 onwards assuming a potential full exit of zero-COVID policy in China;
- (v) cost-plus pricing model taking into account of the anticipated operational costs to be incurred for rendering the services, among others, labour costs, travel expenses, material costs, administration costs and sub-contracting costs (if any) plus a profit margin and subject to inflationary adjustments;
- (vi) the anticipated demand based on the existing operational requirements, including the potential expansion of scope of services and increase in demand as identified for the said mining camps during the term of the 2023 Framework Agreements; and

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- (vii) the buffer (being approximately 5%) budgeted to cope with potential increase in the relevant service demands, as well as estimated increase in average market prices for similar services due to (a) expected increase in costs caused by inflation, and economic and social development during the term of the 2023 Framework Agreements and (b) the possibility of adjustment of total service fees for the scope of services due to unforeseen circumstances.

Pricing Policy

As a general principle, the service fees under the 2023 Framework Agreements shall be determined by arm's length basis after the commercial negotiations with reference to the following pricing methods:

- (i) the prevailing government-prescribed prices or government guiding prices for the relevant services. The service fees shall be determined within the range as prescribed by the relevant government agency (as applicable);
- (ii) the prevailing market prices for similar and/or other comparable services on general commercial terms as conducted in the ordinary course of business from reliable and independent sources (the "**Prevailing Market Prices**"), including prices quoted by independent third parties; and/or
- (iii) cost-plus pricing model taking into account of the anticipated operational costs to be incurred for rendering the services, among others, labour costs (general workers and technical skilled labours), travel expenses, administration costs, material costs and sub-contracting costs (if any) plus a reasonable profit margin and subject to inflationary adjustments (the "**Cost-Plus Pricing**").

Based on the above pricing models, in the absence of prevailing government-prescribed prices or government guiding prices for the relevant services, the pricing models for the Fixed Fee Services and Volume-based Fee Services will be determined with reference to the Prevailing Market Prices and the Cost-Plus Pricing models, as applicable. As an overall measurement, the Group will also review and update the relevant costing computation details prior to entering into any Specific Agreements such that the final pricing remains commercially feasible to the contracting parties. The costing and pricing review process forms part of the implementation of the Internal Control Measures as set out below.

Internal Control Measures

To safeguard the interests of the Shareholders, the Group has adopted internal control measures relating to the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements, which include the following:

- (i) the relevant personnel of the business department will supervise and monitor the pricing policy to ensure the relevant continuing connected transaction is conducted on normal commercial terms and will not be prejudicial to the interest of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole;
- (ii) prior to entering into any Specific Agreements, the relevant departments, among others, the operation department, the legal and compliance department, the finance department and the management of the Group will review, assess and approve the terms to ensure they are consistent with the principles and provisions set out in the 2023 Framework Agreements and in accordance with the aforesaid pricing policy;
- (iii) the finance department will compile and consolidate the transaction amounts under the 2023 Framework Agreements derived for every month and prepare the annual transaction amount estimation for the legal and compliance department to review and confirm that the annual caps are not exceeded, and the details will then be reported to the management of the Group and the Board;
- (iv) if the annual caps are expected to be exceeded, the finance department shall promptly report to the Independent Board Committee and take necessary measures, including obtaining approval of the revised annual caps from the Independent Shareholders and suspend any transactions under the relevant Specific Agreements before re-compliance of relevant Listing Rules;
- (v) the finance department and the legal and compliance department will conduct regular random checks to review and assess whether the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements and any Specific Agreements, among others, pricing methodology and pertinent terms, are conducted in accordance with the terms set out in the respective agreements (including conduct of market comparison check if necessary), and report the result of random checks to the management of the Company and the Board;
- (vi) the Group's internal auditor will conduct regular review of the internal control system is effectively in place to ensure that the connected transactions are entered into in accordance with the terms set out in the 2023 Framework Agreements;

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- (vii) the Group's external auditor will conduct an annual review of the transactions entered into under the 2023 Framework Agreements in accordance with the relevant requirements under the Listing Rules; and
- (viii) the Company's independent non-executive Directors, will conduct annual review, of the status of the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements to ensure that the Group has complied with its internal approval process, the terms of the 2023 Framework Agreements and the relevant requirements under the Listing Rules.

By implementing the above procedures and measures, the Directors consider that the Company has established an adequate internal control system to ensure the relevant continuing connected transactions under the 2023 Framework Agreements are conducted in accordance with the terms of such agreement, on normal commercial terms and in accordance with the pricing policies of the Company, which are fair and reasonable and in the interest of the Company and its Shareholders.

Information of the Parties

Huili Caitong is a company established in the PRC with limited liability which is principally engaged in iron ore mining, iron ore beneficiation and sale of self-produced products. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Huili Caitong is wholly owned by Chengyu Vanadium Titano, which is effectively (i) 67.5% owned by the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders; (ii) 7.2% owned by Mr. Wang Zongming; and (iii) 25.3% owned by 14 individuals and one union. Save as disclosed above, as at the Latest Practicable Date, none of the ultimate beneficial owners effectively owns more than 5% of the equity interests in Chengyu Vanadium Titano and except for the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders, they are all Independent Third Parties. Huili Caitong was formerly an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company before the completion of its disposal on 30 July 2019.

Xiushuihe Mining is a company established in the PRC with limited liability which is principally engaged in iron ore mining, iron ore beneficiation and sale of self-produced products. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Xiushuihe Mining is 95% and 5% owned by Huili Caitong and Xichang Vanadium and Titanium Products Co., Ltd.* (西昌钒钛製品有限公司), respectively; and the latter is ultimately controlled by the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders. It was formerly an indirect subsidiary of the Company which was held as to 95.0% by Huili Caitong (a then indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company before the completion of its disposal on 30 July 2019).

Yanyuan Xigang is a company established in the PRC with limited liability which is principally engaged in coal mining, processing, refining and sales of coal. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Yanyuan Xigang is effectively (i) 53.0% owned by the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders; (ii) 6.1% owned by Mr. Yang Jian; (iii) 5.6% owned by Mr. Qiu Xuhua; (iv) 5.4% owned by Mr. Xu Chao; and (v) 29.9% owned by 25 individuals. Save as disclosed above, none of the ultimate beneficial owners effectively owns more than 5% of the equity interests in Yanyuan Xigang and except for the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders, they are all Independent Third Parties.

Sichuan Lingwei is a company established in the PRC with limited liability which is principally engaged in rendering facility management and consultancy services. It is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company.

Rationale and Benefits of the 2023 Framework Agreements

The Group is principally engaged in mining and ore processing. As disclosed in the Previous Announcement, the Group has placed all the mining facilities management activities as a standalone business unit in order to strengthen the operational system capability of a specialised facilities management team which may also facilitate allocation of relevant management resources for the facilities management operations that such coordinated efforts may potentially allow diversification of such expertise beyond mining industry should opportunities arise for the Group. While the Group is building up its facilities management capabilities to capture project opportunities under the China's future economy across multiple sectors, the Group will continue to stay focused in its existing business strategies across the volatile business environment and market cycles amidst recent signs of China's potential gradual exit from its "Zero-Covid" stance.

The transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements, as extended under the Existing Framework Agreement, are expected to remain income-accretive, which will further improve the economies of scale of the reorganised facilities management business unit and broaden recurring income stream for the Group as part of its existing asset-light business strategies amidst the current business environment. As facilities management continue to hold an increasingly important and integral role in other industries and sectors, the Group believes that the services to be provided and management resources to be allocated under the 2023 Framework Agreements serves as a base to allow progressive expansion of the level of such relevant expertise (including future investments in relevant skilled personnel and technological support) such that the Group could potentially market its facilities management capabilities, procure additional service contracts, forge partnership with strategic partners so that it could explore more innovative and technology-driven facilities management strategies in managing the entire value chain of the facilities management business for other third party clients as well.

The Directors (excluding the independent non-executive Directors whose view has been included in the section headed “Letter from the Independent Board Committee” of this circular) are of the view that the terms and conditions of the 2023 Framework Agreements (and the proposed annual caps thereunder) are determined on arm’s length basis and are fair and reasonable and are thus in the interests of the Shareholders as a whole, and the continuing connected transactions contemplated thereunder are on normal commercial terms and in the ordinary and usual course of business of the Group.

No Director has a material interest in the 2023 Framework Agreements, and therefore none of the Directors are required to abstain from voting in the Board meeting approving the 2023 Framework Agreements and the transactions contemplated thereunder.

Listing Rules Implications

(1) 2023 Huili FM Agreement

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Xiushuihe Mining is the non-wholly owned subsidiary of Huili Caitong, which is wholly owned by Chengyu Vanadium Titano. Chengyu Vanadium Titano is in turn collectively held directly and indirectly as to more than 30% by the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders. Accordingly, Huili Caitong and Xiushuihe Mining are the associates of the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders and therefore connected persons of the Company under Rule 14A.07 of the Listing Rules, and the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Huili FM Agreement constitute continuing connected transactions of the Company pursuant to Chapter 14A of the Listing Rules.

(2) 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Yanyuan Xigang is ultimately held indirectly as to more than 30% by the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders. Accordingly, Yanyuan Xigang is an associate of the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders and therefore connected persons of the Company under Rule 14A.07 of the Listing Rules, and the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement constitute continuing connected transactions of the Company pursuant to Chapter 14A of the Listing Rules.

As one or more applicable percentage ratios in respect of the proposed annual caps for the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements, as calculated on an aggregated annual basis in accordance with the Listing Rules, exceeds 5%, such transactions contemplated thereunder, together with the annual caps thereof, constitute continuing connected transactions of the Company which are subject to the reporting, announcements, annual review and Independent Shareholders’ approval requirements under Chapter 14A of the Listing Rules.

III. PROPOSED AMENDMENTS AND ADOPTION OF THE NEW MEMORANDUM AND ARTICLES

Reference is made to the announcement of the Company dated 13 December 2022. The Board proposes to make the Proposed Amendments and adopt the New Memorandum and Articles in substitution for, and to the exclusion of, the Memorandum and Articles.

The primary objectives of the Proposed Amendments are to:

- (i) reflect and conform to the latest amendments to Appendix 3 of the Listing Rules concerning the core shareholder protection standards which came into effect on 1 January 2022;
- (ii) bring the Memorandum and Articles more in line with the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands and the Listing Rules;
- (iii) update or clarify provisions of the Memorandum and Articles where it is considered appropriate and desirable; and
- (iv) incorporate other consequential and housekeeping amendments which are in line with the above amendments.

The Proposed Amendments and the adoption of the New Memorandum and Articles are subject to the approval of the Shareholders by way of special resolution at the EGM, and if approved, shall take effect upon such approval.

The Company confirms that there is nothing unusual about the Proposed Amendments for a Cayman Islands company listed on the Stock Exchange.

INTRODUCTION

We refer to our appointment as the Independent Financial Adviser to the Independent Board Committee and the Independent Shareholders in relation to the 2023 Framework Agreements and the transactions contemplated thereunder, including the respective proposed annual caps, details of which are set out in the letter from the Board (the “**Letter from the Board**”) contained in the circular of the Company to the Shareholders dated 10 January 2023 (the “**Circular**”), of which this letter forms part. Capitalised terms used in this letter shall have the same meanings as defined in the Circular unless the context otherwise requires.

Accordingly, Huili Caitong and Xiushuihe Mining are the associates of the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders and are therefore connected persons of the Company under Rule 14A.07 of the Listing Rules, and the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Huili FM Agreement constitute continuing connected transactions of the Company pursuant to Chapter 14A of the Listing Rules. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Yanyuan Xigang is ultimately held indirectly as to more than 30% by the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders. Accordingly, Yanyuan Xigang is an associate of the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders and is therefore connected persons of the Company under Rule 14A.07 of the Listing Rules. As one or more applicable percentage ratios in respect of the proposed annual caps for the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements, as calculated on an aggregated annual basis in accordance with the Listing Rules, exceeds 5%, such transactions contemplated thereunder, together with the proposed annual cap thereof, constitute continuing connected transactions of the Company which are subject to the reporting, announcements, annual review and independent Shareholders' approval requirements under Chapter 14A of the Listing Rules.

Any Shareholder who has a material interest in the 2023 Framework Agreements shall abstain from voting to approve the 2023 Framework Agreements and the respective proposed annual caps at the EGM. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang are associates of the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders, therefore the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders and their associates shall abstain from voting on the relevant resolutions at the EGM accordingly. The Independent Board Committee (comprising all independent non-executive Directors namely, Mr. Yu Haizong, Mr. Wu Wen and Mr. Liu Yi) has been formed to advise the Independent Shareholders in relation to the 2023 Framework Agreements and the transactions contemplated thereunder, including the respective proposed annual caps, in accordance with the Listing Rules. We, Goldlink Capital (Corporate Finance) Limited, have been appointed as the Independent Financial Adviser to advise the Independent Board Committee and the Independent Shareholders in these regards.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, we did not have any relationship with or interest in the Company and any other parties that could reasonably be regarded as relevant to our independence. Apart from normal professional fees payable to us in connection with this appointment as the Independent Financial Adviser, no arrangement exists whereby we will receive any fees or benefits from the Company or any other parties that could reasonably be regarded as relevant to our independence. During the past two years, we were appointed as an independent financial adviser for the Company on one occasion, details of which are set out in the Company's circular dated 8 June 2022 in relation to a major transaction and continuing connected transaction. Notwithstanding the above, the previous engagement with the Company would not affect our independence from the Company and we are independent from the Company, in particular that we did not serve as a financial adviser to (i) the Company, (ii) Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining, Yanyuan Xigang or their relevant subsidiaries, and (iii) any core connected person of the Company within 2 years prior to 15 December 2022, being the date of making our independence declaration to the Stock Exchange pursuant to Rule 13.85(1) of the Listing Rules. Accordingly, we are independent of the Company pursuant to Rule 13.84 of the Listing Rules.

In arriving at our recommendations, we have relied on the statements, information and representations contained in the Circular and the information and representations provided to us by the Company, the Directors and the management of the Company. For the year ended 31 December 2021 (“FY2021”)

According to 2021 Annual Report, revenue of the Group for the FY2021 was approximately RMB714.8 million, representing an increase of approximately 46.4% as compared to approximately RMB488.1 million for the year ended 31 December 2020 (“FY2020”). Such increase was mainly attributable to (i) increase in average selling price for high-grade iron concentrates by approximately 32.6% mainly driven by the recovery in demand during the construction peak season, partially offset by the Chinese government’s clampdown against commodity speculators, notwithstanding the production volume fell by approximately 41.4% mainly due to temporary suspension of the Group’s operations at the Maoling Mine during the second half of June 2021 as a result of a landslide and temporary traffic control arrangements in Aba Prefecture between July and August 2021, which affected supply chain and production operations of the Maoling Mine; and (ii) trading activities increased due to higher steel demand during the FY2021 as a result of higher infrastructure spending under the fiscal stimulus policies in China.

Despite the increase in revenue, the Group recorded a decrease in gross profit of approximately 47.1%, from approximately RMB46.6 million for the FY2020 to approximately RMB24.7 million for the FY2021, mainly due to higher unit production cost for high-grade iron concentrates mining operations.

As a result of the foregoing, the Group recorded a decrease in profit from continuing operations from approximately RMB8.3 million for the FY2020 to approximately RMB1.0 million for the FY2021. For the FY2021, the Group recorded a profit from discontinued operations of approximately RMB6.6 million as compared to a loss from discontinued operations for the FY2020 of approximately RMB32.7 million, which was mainly due to the net gain on disposal of the loss-making Mancala Australia Group of approximately RMB10.7 million, and partially offset by its net operating losses for the seven months ended 31 July 2021 (being the completion date of the said disposal) of approximately RMB4.1 million.

Based on the above, the Group recorded a profit for the year of approximately RMB7.6 million for the FY2021 as compared to a loss of approximately RMB24.4 million for the FY2020.

For the six months ended 30 June 2022 (“6M2022”)

According to the 2022 Interim Report, revenue fell slightly from approximately RMB246.3 million for the six months ended 30 June 2021 (“6M2021”) to approximately RMB233.8 million for the 6M2022, due mainly to (i) the decrease of production volume of high-grade iron concentrates by approximately 19.0% as a result of (a) the temporary suspension of the entire operations at Maoling Mine in late June 2022 due to rock collapse and rock falls near the Maoling Mine caused by the earthquakes in early June 2022 and (b) intermittent disruption to the operations of Maoling Mine due to preliminary engineering works in preparation for the expansion of the Maoling Mine; and (ii) lower average selling price from trading activities as a result of weak local market sentiment triggered by renewed COVID-related restrictions and disruptions in China.

In line with the decrease in revenue, the gross profit of the Group also decreased from approximately RMB10.3 million for the 6M2021 to approximately RMB7.1 million for the 6M2022, mainly due to lower profitability from the mining operations of the high-grade iron concentrates as a result of the diseconomies of scale which arose from the production disruption and suspension of the Maoling Mine as mentioned above, thereby causing higher unit production costs.

As a result of the foregoing, the Group recorded an increase in loss from continuing operations from approximately RMB1.5 million for the 6M2021 to approximately RMB7.8 million for the 6M2022. For the 6M2021, the Group recorded a loss from discontinued operations of approximately RMB6.2 million, which was mainly due to the loss-making Mancala Australia Group during that period. Based on the aforesaid, the Group recorded an overall slight increase in loss from approximately RMB7.6 million for the 6M2021 to approximately RMB7.8 million for the 6M2022.

As at 31 December 2020, total assets of the Group amounted to approximately RMB1.23 billion, representing a slight decrease of approximately 3.5% from approximately RMB1.27 billion as at 31 December 2019. Such decrease was mainly due to the decrease in (i) plant and equipment as a result of the depreciation and impairment of discontinued operations recognised for the year of approximately RMB27.8 million; (ii) trade and bills receivable on the back of lower revenues; and (iii) amount due from related parties as a result of settlement. As at 31 December 2021, total assets of the Group decreased slightly to RMB1.16 billion, mainly due to deconsolidation of the total assets of the Mancala Australia Group upon completion of disposal. As at 30 June 2022, the total assets of the Group amounted to approximately RMB1.16 billion, which is at similar level as compared to that as of 31 December 2021.

As at 31 December 2020, total liabilities of the Group amounted to RMB310.2 million as compared to approximately RMB328.3 million as at 31 December 2019. The decrease in total liabilities was mainly due to the decrease in current liabilities from approximately RMB313.2 million as at 31 December 2019 to approximately RMB284.8 million as at 31 December 2020, the decrease was mainly due to (i) decrease in amount due to related parties attributable to settlement and (ii) decrease in trade payables. As at 31 December 2021, total liabilities of the Group decreased to approximately RMB231.5 million, which was mainly due to deconsolidation of the total liabilities of the Mancala Australia Group upon completion of disposal. As at 30 June 2022, the total liabilities of the Group slightly increased to approximately RMB239.8 million, which was mainly due to the increase in other payables and accruals from approximately RMB60.0 million as of 31 December 2021 to approximately RMB72.6 million as at 30 June 2022.

As a result of the foregoing, the total equity attributable to the owners of the Company as at 31 December 2020, 2021 and as at 30 June 2022 amounted to RMB626.3 million, RMB635.2 million and RMB627.6 million, respectively.

1.4 Background information of parties to the transactions

Huili Caitong

Huili Caitong is a company established in the PRC with limited liability which is principally engaged in iron ore mining, iron ore beneficiation and sale of self-produced products. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Huili Caitong is wholly owned by Chengyu Vanadium, which is effectively (i) 67.5% owned by the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders; (ii) 7.2% owned by Mr. Wang Zongming; and (iii) 25.3% owned by 14 individuals and one union. Save as disclosed above, as at the Latest Practicable Date, none of the ultimate beneficial owners effectively owns more than 5% of the equity interests in Chengyu Vanadium Titano and except for the Relevant

CVT Substantial Shareholders, they are all Independent Third Parties. Huili Caitong was formerly an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company before the completion of its disposal on 30 July 2019.

Xiushuihe Mining

Xiushuihe Mining is a company established in the PRC with limited liability which is principally engaged in iron ore mining, iron ore beneficiation and sale of self-produced products. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Xiushuihe Mining is 95% and 5% owned by Huili Caitong and Xichang Vanadium and Titanium Products Co., Ltd* (西昌钒钛製品有限公司), respectively; and the latter is ultimately controlled by the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders. It was formerly an indirect subsidiary of the Company which was held as to 95.0% by Huili Caitong (a then indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company before the completion of its disposal on 30 July 2019).

Yanyuan Xigang

Yanyuan Xigang is a company established in the PRC with limited liability which is principally engaged in coal mining, processing, refining and sales of coal. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Yanyuan Xigang is effectively (i) 53.0% owned by the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders; (ii) 6.1% owned by Mr. Yang Jian; (iii) 5.6% owned by Mr. Qiu Xuhua; (iv) 5.4% owned by Mr. Xu Chao; and (v) 29.9% owned by 25 individuals. Save as disclosed above, none of the ultimate beneficial owners effectively owns more than 5% of the equity interests in Yanyuan Xigang and except for the Relevant CVT Substantial Shareholders, they are all Independent Third Parties.

Sichuan Lingwei

Sichuan Lingwei is a company established in the PRC with limited liability which is principally engaged in rendering facility management and consultancy services. It is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company.

2. The 2023 Framework Agreements

2.1 Background of the 2023 Framework Agreements

On 13 December 2022 (after trading hours), Sichuan Lingwei entered into (i) the 2023 Huili FM Agreement with Huili Caitong and Xiushuihe Mining; and (ii) the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement with Yanyuan Xigang. Pursuant to the 2023 Framework Agreements, Sichuan Lingwei has agreed to provide the FM Services, to the mining camps of Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang.

2.2 Reasons for and benefits of the entering into the 2023 Framework Agreements

In order to assess whether the entering into the 2023 Framework Agreements is in ordinary and usual course of business of the Group and in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole, we have discussed with the management of the Company and considered the followings:

The unfavourable fluctuations of the Group's financial performance on mining operations and steel trading activities

Based on our discussion with the management of the Company, we understand that the financial performance of the Group's mining operations is subject to its production volume and the selling price of the iron concentrates while the performance of the Group's trading activities is highly dependent on the selling price of steel. We noted that during the past two years, the production volume and prices of iron concentrates as well as the selling prices of steel had been highly volatile. For instance, the production volume of the Group for the FY2021 and 6M2022 decreased by approximately 41.4% and 19.0%, respectively as a result of production suspension of the Group's mines and the COVID-related restrictions and disruptions in the PRC while the price level for the 62% TFe iron ore has fallen to about RMB800 per tonne in late 2021 and lingering around RMB900 to RMB1,000 per tonne in the first half of 2022. In respect of the steel price, according to the 2021 Annual Report and the 2022 Interim Report, steel prices in China surged in May 2021 as a result of the output reduction combined with the rise in demand during the construction peak season, which subsequently saw a sharp correction towards the year end following the government interventions and the end of peak seasons of certain industries. And this trend continued during the 6M2022 where the average selling price of steels fell by approximately 22.4% as a result of sluggish demand and resulting in piled-up stock in the steel industry as a result of weak market sentiment.

Due to the fluctuations in the Group's mining productions as well as the selling prices of the iron concentrates and steel, the Group recorded unfavourable fluctuations on its financial performance as discussed in the above paragraph headed "1.2 Financial performance of the Group". Taking into account the unfavourable financial performance of the Group and the volatile business environment of the mining and steel trading industries, as advised by the management of the Company, it is the Company's intention to explore other stream of recurring revenue.

The entering into the 2023 Framework Agreements is in line with the business strategies of the Group

As discussed in the paragraph above, the management of the Company considers that it is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole to explore other stream of recurring revenues given the unfavourable financial performance of the Group and the volatile business environment of the mining and steel trading industries. As advised by the Directors, it is the Company's intention to progressively adopt asset-light business strategies while exploring other stream of recurring revenues in the current dynamic operating environment and thus the entry of the 2023 Framework Agreements represents a crucial step in implementing the aforesaid business strategies. We have reviewed the 2023 Framework Agreements and understand that the service scopes as contemplated thereunder are asset-light in nature whereas the Group's mining operations are asset-based and capital-intensive in nature.

Furthermore, the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements involves the provision of FM Services for fixed and variable fees, representing recurring revenues for the Group. Based on our review of the 2023 Framework Agreements, we note that the Group will charge monthly fee for the provision of Fixed Fee Services. As such, it is anticipated that the Group will receive a stable stream of income as compared to the fluctuating revenues for the mining and steel trading industries generated by the Group in this highly volatile business environment. In addition to the broadening of the Group's revenue, the FM Services also recorded a higher segmental profit margin for the 6M2022 (i.e. approximately 23.1%) as compared to that of the trading activities (i.e. approximately 0.8%) and High-Fe mining operations which were loss making, as stated in the 2022 Interim Report.

The 2023 Framework Agreements provides a foothold for the Group to expand its services to other industries

As disclosed in the Letter from the Board, the Group has placed all the mining facilities management activities as a standalone business unit in order to strengthen the operational system capability of a specialised facilities management team which may also facilitate allocation of relevant management resources for the facilities management operations that such coordinated efforts may potentially allow diversification of such expertise beyond mining industry should opportunities arise for the Group.

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As advised by the Directors, the Group has established a sustainable facility management business model and they believe that as facilities management continue to hold an increasingly important and integral role in other industries and sectors, particularly in a post-pandemic environment, the services to be provided and management resources to be allocated under the 2023 Framework Agreements could allow and support progressive expansion of the level of such relevant expertise (including future investments in relevant skilled personnel and technological support) such that the Group could potentially market its facilities management capabilities, procure additional service contracts, forge partnership with strategic partners so that it could explore more innovative and technology-driven facilities management strategies in managing the entire value chain of the facilities management business for other third party clients as well.

After taking into consideration of (i) the volatile business environment of the mining and steel trading industries had affected the financial performance of the Group in recent years; (ii) the Company's intention to explore other stream of recurring revenues; (iii) the Company's intention to progressively adopt asset-light business strategies and the entry of the 2023 Framework Agreements represents a crucial step in implementing these business strategies; (iv) the nature of these revenues from the facilities management, which are recurring and higher profit margin; and (v) the 2023 Framework Agreements could allow and support progressive expansion of the same to other industries and sectors, we concur with the Directors' view that the entering into of the 2023 Framework Agreements is in the ordinary and usual course of business of the Group and in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

2.3 Major terms of the 2023 Framework Agreements

Set out below are the major terms of the 2023 Framework Agreements. For details please refer to the Letter from the Board.

Date: 13 December 2022

Parties: **In respect of the 2023 Huili FM Agreement:**

- (i) Huili Caitong (as customer);
- (ii) Xiushuihe Mining (as customer); and
- (iii) Sichuan Lingwei (as service provider)

In respect of the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement:

- (i) Yanyuan Xigang (as customer); and
- (ii) Sichuan Lingwei (as service provider)

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- Term: From 1 January 2023 or the date of approval of the 2023 Framework Agreements by the independent Shareholders at the general meeting of the Company (whichever is the later) until 31 December 2025.
- Service Scope: Sichuan Lingwei is responsible for providing with a wide range of FM Services, including but not limited to:
- (i) **Fixed Fee Services** generally comprising cleaning services, security services, meal processing services, vehicle driving services, greening services, loader driving services, water pumping services, pipeline inspection services, warehouse management services and weighing services; and
 - (ii) **Volume-based Fee Services** generally comprising engineering labor services, canteen contract operation services, vehicle leasing services and consultancy services.
- Pricing and Other Pertinent Terms: The service fees for the FM Services under the 2023 Framework Agreements shall be determined on arm's length basis with reference to the pricing policy as set out below.
- The parties to the 2023 Framework Agreements have also agreed as follows:
- (i) the parties shall enter into Specific Agreements which will set out the necessary terms and conditions for the relevant transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements in the ordinary course of business after arm's length negotiations on normal commercial term; and
 - (ii) the Specific Agreements shall conform with the principles and provisions set out in the 2023 Framework Agreements.

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2.4 Fairness and reasonableness on the terms of the 2023 Framework Agreements

Pricing policy of the 2023 Framework Agreements

As stated in the Letter from the Board, as a general principle, the service fees under the 2023 Framework Agreements shall be determined by arm's length basis after the commercial negotiations with reference to the following pricing methods:

- (i) the prevailing government-prescribed prices or government guiding prices for the relevant services. The service fees shall be determined within the range as prescribed by the relevant government agency (as applicable);
- (ii) the prevailing market prices for similar and/or other comparable services on general commercial terms as conducted in the ordinary course of business from reliable and independent sources (the "**Prevailing Market Prices**"), including prices quoted by independent third parties; and/or
- (iii) cost-plus pricing model taking into account of the anticipated operational costs to be incurred for rendering the services, among others, labour costs (general workers and technical skilled labours), travel expenses, administration costs, material costs and sub-contracting costs (if any) plus a reasonable profit margin and subject to inflationary adjustments (the "**Cost-Plus Pricing**").

Based on the above pricing models, in the absence of prevailing government prescribed prices or government guiding prices for the relevant services, the pricing models for the Fixed Fee Services and Volume-based Fee Services will be determined with reference to the Prevailing Market Prices and the Cost-Plus Pricing models, as applicable. As an overall measurement, the Group will also review and update the relevant costing computation details prior to entering into any Specific Agreements such that the final pricing remains commercially feasible to the contracting parties. The costing and pricing review process forms part of the implementation of the internal control measures.

Assessment on the pricing policy

In order to assess the fairness and reasonableness of the pricing policies of the 2023 Framework Agreements, we have considered and performed the following independent workdone:

- We have obtained and reviewed the 2023 Framework Agreements and note that the services scopes as contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements comprise Fixed Fee Services and Volume-based Fee Services;

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- In respect of the Fixed Fee Services, we understand from the management that, as at the Latest Practicable Date, there are no prevailing government-prescribed prices or government guiding prices (if any and as applicable) promulgated by the PRC government for the provision of the services under the Fixed Fee Services. In the absence of such, the pricings of the Fixed Fee Services will be determined with reference to (i) the prevailing market prices for similar and/or other comparable services on general commercial terms as conducted in the ordinary course of business from reliable and independent sources; and/or (ii) prices by reasonable cost-plus pricing model taking into account of the anticipated operational costs to be incurred for rendering the services, among others, labour costs, travel expenses, material costs, administration costs and sub-contracting costs (if any) plus a profit margin and subject to inflationary adjustments.

We understand that the Company has obtained 3 quotations from 3 independent third parties service providers in respect of the similar services to be provided under the 2023 Framework Agreements, and we have obtained and reviewed the aforesaid quotations and note that the pricing to be charged by the Group are within the range of the quotations charged by such independent third parties service providers. We hence concur with the views of the Directors that the Fixed Fee Services charged by the Group are fair and reasonable and on normal commercial terms;

- In respect of the Volume-based Fee Services, we understand that there are prevailing government-prescribed prices or guiding prices promulgated by the PRC government for certain services. As such, the pricings of the Volume-based Fee Services will be determined with reference to (i) prevailing government-prescribed prices or guiding prices (if any and as applicable) promulgated by the PRC government for the provision of the services, (ii) the prevailing market prices for similar and/or other comparable services on general commercial terms as conducted in the ordinary course of business from reliable and independent sources; and/or (iii) prices by reasonable cost-plus pricing model taking into account of the anticipated operational costs to be incurred for rendering the services, among others, labour costs, travel expenses, material costs, administration costs and sub-contracting costs (if any) plus a profit margin and subject to inflationary adjustments.

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We have obtained and reviewed Valuation Quotas of Bill of Quantities of Construction Projects in Sichuan Province* (“四川省建設工程工程量清單計價定額”) and noted that such guiding prices has been effective since April 2021 and set out the guiding prices for different types of engineering labour services to be performed in Sichuan Province, the PRC. Given that the engineering labour services will be priced with reference to the pricing policies as stipulated by the PRC government, we concur with the views of the Directors that the pricing policies charged by the Group on engineering labour services is justifiable;

- We understand from the management of the Company that there is no historical transactions between the Group and Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang in respect of other Volume-based Fee Services such as canteen contract operation services, vehicle leasing services and consultancy services. We were given to understand that the Company will adopt the internal control procedures on pricing to ensure that the pricing and terms of such Volume-based Fee Services are conducted on normal commercial terms and in accordance to the pricing policy of the Group.
- We have obtained and reviewed the Company’s written internal control measures relating to the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements and note that:
 - (i) the relevant personnel of the business department will supervise and monitor the pricing policy to ensure the relevant continuing connected transaction is conducted on normal commercial terms and will not be prejudicial to the interest of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole;
 - (ii) prior to entering into any specific agreements, the relevant department, among others, the operation department, the legal and compliance department, the finance department and the management of the Group will review, assess and approve the terms to ensure they are consistent with the principles and provisions set out in the 2023 Framework Agreements and in accordance with the aforesaid pricing policy;
 - (iii) the finance department will compile and consolidate the transaction amounts under the 2023 Framework Agreements and any other ancillary separate individual agreements derived for every month for the legal and compliance department to review and confirm that the annual caps are not exceeded, and the details will then be reported to the management of the Company and the Board;

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- (iv) if the annual caps are expected to be exceeded, the finance department shall promptly report to the Independent Board Committee and take necessary measures, including obtaining approval of the revised annual caps from the Independent Shareholders and suspend any transactions under the relevant Specific Agreements before re-compliance of relevant Listing Rules;
- (v) the finance department and the legal and compliance department of the Group will conduct regular random checks to review and assess whether the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements and any other ancillary separate individual agreements, among others, pricing methodology and pertinent terms, are conducted in accordance with the terms set out in the respective agreements (including conduct of market comparison check if necessary), and report the result of random checks to the management of the Company and the Board;
- (vi) the Group's internal auditor will conduct regular review of the internal control system is effectively in place to ensure that the connected transactions are entered into in accordance with the terms set out in the 2023 Framework Agreements;
- (vii) the Group's external auditor will conduct an annual review of the transactions entered into under the 2023 Framework Agreements in accordance with the relevant requirements under the Listing Rules; and
- (viii) the Company's independent non-executive Directors, will conduct annual review, of the status of the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements to ensure that the Group has complied with its internal approval process, the terms of the 2023 Framework Agreements and the relevant requirements under the Listing Rules.

Based on the above, we concur with the Directors' view that the internal control measures are sufficiently in place to ensure the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements will be conducted on normal commercial terms.

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After taking into consideration that (i) the pricing to be charged by the Group for the Fixed Fee Services are within the range of the quotations charged by such independent third parties service providers; (ii) the engineering labor services under the Volume-based Fee Services will be priced with reference to the Valuation Quotas of Bill of Quantities of Construction Projects in Sichuan Province* (“四川省建設工程工程量清單計價定額”) issued by the relevant authority of Sichuan Province; (iii) since there are no historical transactions between the Group and Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang in respect of other Volume-based Fee Services, and the Company will adopt the internal control procedures on pricing to ensure that the pricing and terms of the such Volume-based Fee Services are conducted on normal commercial terms and in accordance with the pricing policy of the Group; and (iv) the internal control measures are sufficiently in place to ensure the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements will be conducted on normal commercial terms, we concur with the Directors’ view that the terms of the 2023 Framework Agreements are on normal commercial terms and fair and reasonable as far as the Independent Shareholders are concerned.

The proposed annual caps for the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Framework Agreements are arrived at after taking into consideration of, among others, the following:

- (i) historical transaction amounts arising from the Existing Framework Agreements;
- (ii) the anticipated expansion in the scope of services which may require higher levels of technical customisation and the contemplated increase in project activities with reference to the proposed operational plans, among others;

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- the anticipated expansion of scope of services commencing from early 2023 will include loader driving services; water pumping services; pipeline inspection services; warehouse management services and weighing services;
 - the anticipated gradual increase and resumption in mining and production capacities given the signs of potential exit of zero-COVID policy in China that may lead to increasingly higher utilisation rates commencing from the fourth quarter of 2023;
 - the anticipated completion of an additional mine tailings facility in 2024 which will require additional general workers to support the Fixed Fee Services as well as additional skilled labours to manage the engineering labor services; and
 - the anticipated expansion of canteen contract operations and vehicle leasing services in particular, from 2024 onwards, will result in the deployment of additional general workers in supporting the Volume-based Services;
- (iii) the types, locations and conditions of the facilities, including, among others, the level of complexity and the topography of the mining camps which may require deployment of additional skilled labour and specialised mining equipment;
- (iv) the anticipated increase in the number of labour (general workers and technical skilled labour), which may double that of the 2022 level, taking into account of the above operational plans and the increasingly higher capacity utilisation rates for mining engineering project activities from the fourth quarter of 2023 onwards assuming a potential full exit of zero-COVID policy in China;
- (v) cost-plus pricing model taking into account of the anticipated operational costs to be incurred for rendering the services, among others, labour costs, travel expenses, material costs, administration costs and sub-contracting costs (if any) plus a profit margin and subject to inflationary adjustments;
- (vi) the anticipated demand based on the existing operational requirements, including the potential expansion of scope or structure of services as identified for the said mining camps during the term of the 2023 Framework Agreements; and
- (vii) the buffer (being approximately 5%) budgeted to cope with potential increase in the relevant service demands, as well as estimated increase in average market prices for similar services due to (a) expected increase in costs caused by inflation, and economic and social development during the term of the 2023 Framework Agreements and (b) the possibility of adjustment of total service fees for the scope of services due to unforeseen circumstances.

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As set out in the Letter from the Board, the historical actual amount recorded for the period from 1 April 2022 to 31 December 2022 in relation to the Existing Framework Agreements was approximately RMB7.9 million.

In assessing the fairness and reasonableness of the aforesaid bases and assumptions adopted by the Board in arriving the proposed annual caps under the 2023 Framework Agreements, we have (i) discussed with the management of the Company regarding the bases and assumptions; and (ii) obtained and reviewed the computations prepared by the management of the Company in arriving the proposed annual caps under the 2023 Huili FM Agreement and the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement.

We understand from the aforesaid computations that the Proposed Annual Caps mainly comprised (i) the estimated transaction amounts in relation to the Fixed Fee Services provided to Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang; (ii) the estimated transaction amounts in relation to the Volume-based Fee Services provided to Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang; and (iii) a buffer of approximately 5%.

In respect of the estimated transaction amounts in relation to the Fixed Fee Services provided to Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang, we understand from the management of the Company that the provision of Fixed Fee Services are labour intensive. As such, we note from the aforesaid computations that such estimated transaction amounts are determined with reference to (a) the number of labour involved for the provision of Fixed Fee Services; (b) the monthly fee to be charged by the Group for each of the labour involved which are determined with reference to the monthly salary of the labour as well as their relevant employment social benefits etc; and (c) operating margins as negotiated by the parties.

In respect to the estimated transaction amounts in relation to the Volume-based Fee Services provided to Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang, we note from the computations that such services mainly comprise engineering labour services, vehicle leasing services and canteen contract operation services.

- For the engineering labour services, we note that from the computation that it is determined based on (a) the estimated volume of engineering work required for the three years ending 31 December 2025 with reference to the average historical engineering investment amounts from 2021 to 2022 on the respective mines of Huili Caitong, Xiushuihe Mining and Yanyuan Xigang; (b) the estimated price of engineering work with reference to the Valuation Quotas of Bill of Quantities of Construction Projects in Sichuan Province* (“四川省建設工程工程量清單計價定額”) issued by the relevant government of Sichuan Province; and (c) operating margins as negotiated by the parties.

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- For vehicle leasing services, we note from the computations that the vehicle leasing services is expected to start providing such services from 2024 onwards and the estimated transaction amounts are determined based on (a) the number of vehicles required; and (b) historical vehicle rental price from a third party in 2022.
- For canteen contract operation services, we note from the computation that the Sichuan Lingwei is expected to start providing such services from 2024 onwards and the estimated transaction amounts are determined after taking into account the (a) the number of labour involved for the provision of such services; (b) the monthly fee to be charged by the Group for each of the labour involved which are determined with reference to the monthly salary of the labour including their relevant employment social benefits, among others; (c) estimated cost of procuring canteen supplies; and (d) operating margins as negotiated by the parties.

In respect of a buffer of approximately 5%, we have considered the recent inflation rate of the PRC and note that year-on-year monthly inflation rate from January 2022 to November 2022, as quoted from the National Bureau of Statistics, ranged from 0.9% in January 2022 to 1.6% in November 2022, with the highest monthly inflation rate of 2.8% in September 2022. As such, we consider that the inclusion of a buffer of approximately 5% to cater for the inflation in the PRC as well as any unforeseen circumstances is justifiable.

In light of the above, we are of the view that the proposed annual caps for the transactions contemplated under the 2023 Huili FM Agreement and the 2023 Yanyuan FM Agreement are determined based on reasonable estimation and after due and careful consideration and they are fair and reasonable so far as the Company and the Independent Shareholders are concerned.

RECOMMENDATION

Having considered the above-mentioned principal factors and reasons, we are of the view that the entering into of the 2023 Framework Agreements and the transactions contemplated thereunder, including the respective proposed annual caps is in the ordinary and usual course of business of the Group, and is in the interests on the Company and the Shareholders as a whole, and the terms of the 2023 Framework Agreements and the transactions contemplated thereunder, including the respective proposed annual caps are on normal commercial terms which are fair and reasonable so far as the Independent Shareholders are concerned.

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Accordingly, we recommend the Independent Shareholders, as well as the Independent Board Committee to recommend the Independent Shareholders, to vote in favour of the ordinary resolutions to be proposed at the EGM to approve the 2023 Framework Agreements and the transactions contemplated thereunder, including the respective proposed annual caps.

22. The Company shall have a first and paramount lien on every share (not being a fully paid share) for all moneys (whether presently payable or not) called or payable at a fixed time in respect of that share. 25. Subject to these Articles and to the terms of allotment, the Board may from time to time make calls upon the Members in respect of any moneys unpaid on their shares (whether on account of the nominal value of the shares or by way of premium), and each Member shall (subject to being given at least fourteen (14) clear days' Notice specifying the time and place of payment) pay to the Company as required by such notice the amount called on his shares. A call may be extended, postponed or revoked in whole or in part as the Board determines but no Member shall be entitled to any such extension, postponement or revocation except as a matter of grace and favour.
26. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Board authorising the call was passed and may be made payable either in one lump sum or by instalments.
27. A person upon whom a call is made shall remain liable for calls made upon him notwithstanding the subsequent transfer of the shares in respect of which the call was made. The joint holders of a share shall be jointly and severally liable to pay all calls and instalments due in respect thereof or other moneys due in respect thereof.

If a sum called in respect of a share is not paid before or on the day appointed for payment thereof, the person from whom the sum is due shall pay interest on the amount unpaid from the day appointed for payment thereof to the time of actual payment at such rate (not exceeding twenty per cent. On the trial or hearing of any action or other proceedings for the recovery of any money due for any call, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the Member sued is entered in the Register as the holder, or one of the holders, of the shares in respect of which such debt accrued, that the resolution making the call is duly recorded in the minute book, and that notice of such call was duly given to the Member sued, in pursuance of these Articles; and it shall not be necessary to prove the appointment of the Directors who made such call, nor any other matters whatsoever, but the proof of the matters aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

31. Any amount payable in respect of a share upon allotment or at any fixed date, whether in respect of nominal value or premium or as an instalment of a call, shall be deemed to be a call duly made and payable on the date fixed for payment and if it is not paid the provisions of these Articles shall apply as if that amount had become due and payable by virtue of a call duly made and notified.
32. On the issue of shares the Board may differentiate between the allottees or holders as to the amount of calls to be paid and the times of payment.
33. 34. (1) If a call remains unpaid after it has become due and payable the Board may give to the person from whom it is due not less than fourteen (14) clear days' Notice:
- (a) requiring payment of the amount unpaid together with any interest which may have accrued and which may still accrue up to the date of actual payment; and
 - (b) stating that if the Notice is not complied with the shares on which the call was made will be liable to be forfeited.

37. Any share so forfeited shall be deemed the property of the Company and may be sold, re-allotted or otherwise disposed of to such person, upon such terms and in such manner as the Board determines, and at any time before a sale, re-allotment or disposition the forfeiture may be annulled by the Board on such terms as the Board determines.
38. A person whose shares have been forfeited shall cease to be a Member in respect of the forfeited shares but nevertheless shall remain liable to pay the Company all moneys which at the date of forfeiture were presently payable by him to the Company in respect of the shares, with (if the Directors shall in their discretion so require) interest thereon from the date of forfeiture until payment at such rate (not exceeding twenty per cent. (20%) per annum) as the Board determines. The Board may enforce payment thereof if it thinks fit, and without any deduction or allowance for the value of the forfeited shares, at the date of forfeiture, but his liability shall cease if and when the Company shall have received payment in full of all such moneys in respect of the shares. A declaration by a Director or the Secretary that a share has been forfeited on a specified date shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons claiming to be entitled to the share, and such declaration shall (subject to the execution of an instrument of transfer by the Company if necessary) constitute a good title to the share, and the person to whom the share is disposed of shall be registered as the holder of the share and shall not be bound to see to the application of the consideration (if any), nor shall his title to the share be affected by any irregularity in or invalidity of the proceedings in reference to the forfeiture, sale or disposal of the share. When any share shall have been forfeited, notice of the declaration shall be given to the Member in whose name it stood immediately prior to the forfeiture, and an entry of the forfeiture, with the date thereof, shall forthwith be made in the register, but no forfeiture shall be in any manner invalidated by any omission or neglect to give such notice or make any such entry.
40. Notwithstanding any such forfeiture as aforesaid the Board may at any time, before any shares so forfeited shall have been sold, re-allotted or otherwise disposed of, permit the shares forfeited to be bought back upon the terms of payment of all calls and interest due upon and expenses incurred in respect of the share, and upon such further terms (if any) as it thinks fit.

41. The forfeiture of a share shall not prejudice the right of the Company to any call already made or instalment payable thereon.

REGISTER OF MEMBERS

43. (1) The Company shall keep in one or more books a Register of its Members and shall enter therein the following particulars, that is to say:
- (a) the name and address of each Member, the number and class of shares held by him and the amount paid or agreed to be considered as paid on such shares;
 - (b) the date on which each person was entered in the Register; and
 - (c) the date on which any person ceased to be a Member.
- (2) The Company may keep an overseas or local or other branch register of Members resident in any place, and the Board may make and vary such regulations as it determines in respect of the keeping of any such register and maintaining a Registration Office in connection therewith.
44. The Register and branch register of Members maintained in Hong Kong, as the case may be, shall be open to inspection for at least two (2) hours during business hours by Members without charge or by any other person, upon a maximum payment of HK\$2.50 or such lesser sum specified by the Board, at the Office or such other place at which the Register is kept in accordance with the ~~Law~~Act or, if appropriate, upon a maximum payment of HK\$1.00 or such lesser sum specified by the Board at the Registration Office. The Register including any overseas or local or other branch register of Members may, after notice has been given by advertisement in an appointed newspaper or any other newspapers in accordance with the requirements of any Designated Stock Exchange or by any electronic means in such manner as may be accepted by the Designated Stock Exchange to that effect, be closed at such times or for such periods not exceeding in the whole thirty (30) days in each year as the Board may determine and either generally or in respect of any class of shares. The period of thirty (30) days may be extended for a further period or periods not exceeding thirty (30) days in the whole in respect of any year if approved by the Members by ordinary resolution.

45. Subject to the Listing Rules ~~of any Designated Stock Exchange~~, notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles the Company or the Directors may fix any date as the record date for:
- (a) determining the Members entitled to receive any dividend, distribution, allotment or issue; and
 - (b) determining the Members entitled to receive notice of and to vote at any general meeting of the Company.

TRANSFER OF SHARES

46. (1) Subject to these Articles, any Member may transfer all or any of his shares by an instrument of transfer in the usual or common form or in a form prescribed by the Designated Stock Exchange or in any other form approved by the Board and may be under hand or, if the transferor or transferee is a clearing house or its nominee(s), by hand or by machine imprinted signature or by such other manner of execution as the Board may approve from time to time.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (1) above, for so long as any shares are listed on the Designated Stock Exchange, titles to such listed shares may be evidenced and transferred in accordance with the laws applicable to and the Listing Rules ~~and regulations of the Designated Stock Exchange~~ that are or shall be applicable to such listed shares. The register of members of the Company in respect of its listed shares (whether the Register or a branch register) may be kept by recording the particulars required by Section 40 of the Law Act in a form otherwise than legible if such recording otherwise complies with the laws applicable to and the Listing Rules ~~and regulations of the Designated Stock Exchange~~ that are or shall be applicable to such listed shares.
47. The instrument of transfer shall be executed by or on behalf of the transferor and the transferee provided that the Board may dispense with the execution of the instrument of transfer by the transferee in any case which it thinks fit in its discretion to do so. Without prejudice to the last preceding Article, the Board may also resolve, either generally or in any particular case, upon request by either the transferor or transferee, to accept mechanically executed transfers. The transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of the share until the name of the transferee is entered in the Register in respect thereof. Nothing in these Articles shall preclude the Board from recognising a renunciation of the allotment or provisional allotment of any share by the allottee in favour of some other person.

48. (1) The Board may, in its absolute discretion, and without giving any reason therefor, refuse to register a transfer of any share (not being a fully paid up share) to a person of whom it does not approve, or any share issued under any share incentive scheme for employees upon which a restriction on transfer imposed thereby still subsists, and it may also, without prejudice to the foregoing generality, refuse to register a transfer of any share to more than four (4) joint holders or a transfer of any share (not being a fully paid up share) on which the Company has a lien. - (2) No transfer shall be made to an infant or to a person of unsound mind or under other legal disability.
- (3) The Board in so far as permitted by any applicable law may, in its absolute discretion, at any time and from time to time transfer any share upon the Register to any branch register or any share on any branch register to the Register or any other branch register. In the event of any such transfer, the shareholder requesting such transfer shall bear the cost of effecting the transfer unless the Board otherwise determines.
- (4) Unless the Board otherwise agrees (which agreement may be on such terms and subject to such conditions as the Board in its absolute discretion may from time to time determine, and which agreement the Board shall, without giving any reason therefor, be entitled in its absolute discretion to give or withhold), no shares upon the Register shall be transferred to any branch register nor shall shares on any branch register be transferred to the Register or any other branch register and all transfers and other documents of title shall be lodged for registration, and registered, in the case of any shares on a branch register, at the relevant Registration Office, and, in the case of any shares on the Register, at the Office or such other place at which the Register is kept in accordance with the ~~Law~~Act. 49. Without limiting the generality of the last preceding Article, the Board may decline to recognise any instrument of transfer unless:-
- (a) a fee of such maximum sum as the Designated Stock Exchange may determine to be payable or such lesser sum as the Board may from time to time require is paid to the Company in respect thereof; App-3

- (b) the instrument of transfer is in respect of only one class of share;

- (c) the instrument of transfer is lodged at the Office or such other place at which the Register is kept in accordance with the ~~Law~~Act or the Registration Office (as the case may be) accompanied by the relevant share certificate(s) and such other evidence as the Board may reasonably require to show the right of the transferor to make the transfer (and, if the instrument of transfer is executed by some other person on his behalf, the authority of that person so to do); and
- (d) if applicable, the instrument of transfer is duly and properly stamped.
50. If the Board refuses to register a transfer of any share, it shall, within two (2) months after the date on which the transfer was lodged with the Company, send to each of the transferor and transferee notice of the refusal.
51. The registration of transfers of shares or of any class of shares may, after notice has been given by announcement or by electronic communication or by advertisement in any newspapers or by any other means in accordance with the requirements of any Designated Stock Exchange to that effect be suspended at such times and for such periods (not exceeding in the whole thirty (30) days in any year) as the Board may determine. The period of thirty (30) days may be extended for a further period or periods not exceeding thirty (30) days in the whole in respect of any year if approved by the Members by ordinary resolution.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES

52. If a Member dies, the survivor or survivors where the deceased was a joint holder, and his legal personal representatives where he was a sole or only surviving holder, will be the only persons recognised by the Company as having any title to his interest in the shares; but nothing in this Article will release the estate of a deceased Member (whether sole or joint) from any liability in respect of any share which had been solely or jointly held by him.
53. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy or winding-up of a Member may, upon such evidence as to his title being produced as may be required by the Board, elect either to become the holder of the share or to have some person nominated by him registered as the transferee thereof. If he elects to become the holder he shall notify the Company in writing either at the Registration Office or Office, as the case may be, to that effect. If he elects to have another person registered he shall execute a transfer of the share in favour of that person. The provisions of these Articles relating to the transfer and registration of transfers of shares shall apply to such notice or transfer as aforesaid as if the death or bankruptcy of the Member had not occurred and the notice or transfer were a transfer signed by such Member.

54. A person becoming entitled to a share by reason of the death or bankruptcy or winding-up of a Member shall be entitled to the same dividends and other advantages to which he would be entitled if he were the registered holder of the share. However, the Board may, if it thinks fit, withhold the payment of any dividend payable or other advantages in respect of such share until such person shall become the registered holder of the share or shall have effectually transferred such share, but, subject to the requirements of Article 72(2) being met, such a person may vote at meetings.

UNTRACEABLE MEMBERS

55. (1) Without prejudice to the rights of the Company under paragraph (2) of this Article, the Company may cease sending cheques for dividend entitlements or dividend warrants by post if such cheques or warrants have been left uncashed on two consecutive occasions. However, the Company may exercise the power to cease sending cheques for dividend entitlements or dividend warrants after the first occasion on which such a cheque or warrant is returned undelivered. App. 3

- (2) The Company shall have the power to sell, in such manner as the Board thinks fit, any shares of a Member who is untraceable, but no such sale shall be made unless: App. 3

- (a) all cheques or warrants in respect of dividends of the shares in question, being not less than three in total number, for any sum payable in cash to the holder of such shares in respect of them sent during the relevant period in the manner authorised by the Articles have remained uncashed;
- (b) so far as it is aware at the end of the relevant period, the Company has not at any time during the relevant period received any indication of the existence of the Member who is the holder of such shares or of a person entitled to such shares by death, bankruptcy or operation of law; and
- (c) the Company has given notice of its intention to sell such shares to, and caused advertisement in daily newspapers in accordance with the requirements of, the Designated Stock Exchange, and a period of three (3) months or such shorter period as may be allowed by the Designated Stock Exchange has elapsed since the date of such advertisement.

For the purpose of the foregoing, the “relevant period” means the period commencing twelve (12) years before the date of publication of the advertisement referred to in paragraph (c) of this Article and ending at the expiry of the period referred to in that paragraph.

- (3) To give effect to any such sale the Board may authorise some person to transfer the said shares and an instrument of transfer signed or otherwise executed by or on behalf of such person shall be as effective as if it had been executed by the registered holder or the person entitled by transmission to such shares, and the purchaser shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money nor shall his title to the shares be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings relating to the sale. The net proceeds of the sale will belong to the Company and upon receipt by the Company of such net proceeds it shall become indebted to the former Member for an amount equal to such net proceeds. No trust shall be created in respect of such debt and no interest shall be payable in respect of it and the Company shall not be required to account for any money earned from the net proceeds which may be employed in the business of the Company or as it thinks fit. Any sale under this Article shall be valid and effective notwithstanding that the Member holding the shares sold is dead, bankrupt or otherwise under any legal disability or incapacity.

GENERAL MEETINGS

56. An annual general meeting of the Company shall be held in each financial year ~~other than the financial year of the Company's adoption of these Articles (within a period of not more than fifteen (15) and such annual general meeting must be held within six months after the holding of the last preceding annual general meeting or not more than eighteen (18) months after the end date of the Company's financial year (adoption of these Articles,~~ unless a longer period would not infringe the Listing Rules ~~of the Designated Stock Exchange, if any).~~ App-13B

57. Each general meeting, other than an annual general meeting, shall be called an extraordinary general meeting. All general meetings (including an annual general meeting, any adjourned meeting or postponed meeting) may be held as a physical meeting in any part of the world and at one or more locations as provided in Article 64A or as a hybrid meeting, as may be determined by the Board in its absolute discretion.

58. The Board may whenever it thinks fit call extraordinary general meetings. Any one or more Member(s) holding at the date of deposit of the requisition not less than one-tenth of the paid up capital of the Company carrying the right of voting at general meetings of the Company, on a one vote per share basis shall at all times have the right, by written requisition to the Board or the Secretary of the Company, to require an extraordinary general meeting to be called by the Board for the transaction of any business or resolution specified in such requisition; and such meeting shall be held within two (2) months after the deposit of such requisition. If within twenty-one (21) days of such deposit the Board fails to proceed to convene such meeting the requisitionist(s) himself (themselves) may convene a physical meeting at only one location which will be the Principal Meeting Place, and all reasonable expenses incurred by the requisitionist(s) as a result of the failure of the Board shall be reimbursed to the requisitionist(s) by the Company.

NOTICE OF GENERAL MEETINGS

59. (1) An annual general meeting must be called by Notice of not less than twenty-one (21) ~~clear days and not less than twenty (20) clear business days~~ ^{App. 13B} ~~clear business days~~. All other general meetings (including an extraordinary general meeting) must be called by Notice of not less than fourteen (14) clear days ~~and not less than ten (10) clear business days but if permitted by the rules of the Designated Stock Exchange,~~ a general meeting may be called by shorter notice, subject to the Law Act and the Listing Rules, if it is so agreed:
- (a) in the case of a meeting called as an annual general meeting, by all the Members entitled to attend and vote thereat; and
- (b) in the case of any other meeting, by a majority in number of the Members having the right to attend and vote at the meeting, being a majority together representing not less than ninety-five per cent. (95%) of the total voting rights at the meeting of all the Members.

- (2) The Notice shall specify (a) the time and date of the meeting, (b) the place of the meeting and if there is more than one ~~M~~meeting ~~E~~location as determined by the Board pursuant to Article 64A, the principal place of the meeting (the “**Principal Meeting Place**”), (c) if the general meeting is to be a hybrid meeting, the Notice shall include a statement to that effect and with details of the electronic facilities for attendance and participation by electronic means at the meeting or where such details will be made available by the Company prior to the meeting, ~~and~~(d) particulars of resolutions to be considered at the meeting, and (e) in case of special business, the general nature of the business. The notice convening an annual general meeting shall specify the meeting as such. Notice of every general meeting shall be given to all Members other than to such Members as, under the provisions of these Articles or the terms of issue of the shares they hold, are not entitled to receive such notices from the Company to all persons entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy or winding-up of a Member and to each of the Directors and the Auditors.
60. The accidental omission to give Notice of a meeting or (in cases where instruments of proxy are sent out with the Notice) to send such instrument of proxy to, or the non-receipt of such Notice or such instrument of proxy by, any person entitled to receive such Notice shall not invalidate any resolution passed or the proceedings at that meeting.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

61. (1) All business shall be deemed special that is transacted at an extraordinary general meeting, and also all business that is transacted at an annual general meeting, with the exception of:
- (a) the declaration and sanctioning of dividends;
 - (b) consideration and adoption of the accounts and balance sheet and the reports of the Directors and Auditors and other documents required to be annexed to the balance sheet;
 - (c) the election of Directors whether by rotation or otherwise in the place of those retiring;
 - (d) appointment of Auditors (where special notice of the intention for such appointment is not required by the ~~Law~~Act) and other officers; and
 - (e) the fixing of the remuneration of the Auditors, and the voting of remuneration or extra remuneration to the Directors.

- (2) No business other than the appointment of a chairman of a meeting shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum is present at the commencement of the business. Two (2) Members entitled to vote and present in person or by proxy shall form a quorum for all purposes.
62. If within thirty (30) minutes (or such longer time not exceeding one hour as the chairman of the meeting may determine to wait) after the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened on the requisition of Members, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and (where applicable) same place(s) or to such day, such time and (where applicable) such place(s) and in such form and manner referred to in Article 57 as the chairman of the meeting (or in default, the Board) may absolutely determine. If at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for holding the meeting, the meeting shall be dissolved.
63. (1) The chairman of the Company or if there is more than one chairman, any one of them as may be agreed amongst themselves or failing such agreement, any one of them elected by all the Directors present shall preside as chairman at a general meeting. If at any meeting no chairman, is present within fifteen (15) minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting, or is willing to act as chairman, the deputy chairman of the Company or if there is more than one deputy chairman, any one of them as may be agreed amongst themselves or failing such agreement, any one of them elected by all the Directors present shall preside as chairman. If no chairman or deputy chairman is present or is willing to act as chairman of the meeting, the Directors present shall choose one of their number to act, or if one Director only is present he shall preside as chairman if willing to act. If no Director is present, or if each of the Directors present declines to take the chair, or if the chairman chosen shall retire from the chair, the Members present in person or by proxy and entitled to vote shall elect one of their number to be chairman of the meeting.
- (2) If the chairman of a general meeting is participating in the general meeting using an electronic facility or facilities and becomes unable to participate in the general meeting using such electronic facility or facilities, another person (determined in accordance with Article 63(1) above) shall preside as chairman of the meeting unless and until the original chairman of the meeting is able to participate in the general meeting using the electronic facility or facilities.

64. Subject to Article 64C, the chairman may, with the consent of any meeting at which a quorum is present (and shall if so directed by the meeting), adjourn the meeting from time to time (or indefinitely) and/or from place to place(s) and/or from one form to another (a physical meeting or a hybrid meeting) as the meeting shall determine, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business which might lawfully have been transacted at the meeting had the adjournment not taken place. When a meeting is adjourned for fourteen (14) days or more, at least seven (7) clear days' notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given specifying the details set out in Article 59(2) but it shall not be necessary to specify in such notice the nature of the business to be transacted at the adjourned meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted. Save as aforesaid, it shall be unnecessary to give notice of an adjournment.
- 64A. (1) The Board may, at its absolute discretion, arrange for persons entitled to attend a general meeting to do so by simultaneous attendance and participation by means of electronic facilities at such location or locations ("**Meeting Location(s)**") determined by the Board at its absolute discretion. Any Member or any proxy attending and participating in such way or any Member or proxy attending and participating in a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities is deemed to be present at and shall be counted in the quorum of the meeting.
- (2) All general meetings are subject to the following and, where appropriate, all references to a "Member" or "Members" in this sub-paragraph (2) shall include a proxy or proxies respectively:
- (a) where a Member is attending a Meeting Location and/or in the case of a hybrid meeting, the meeting shall be treated as having commenced if it has commenced at the Principal Meeting Place;
 - (b) Members present in person (in the case of a Member being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy at a Meeting Location and/or Members attending and participating in a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities shall be counted in the quorum for and entitled to vote at the meeting in question, and that meeting shall be duly constituted and its proceedings valid provided that the chairman of the meeting is satisfied that adequate electronic facilities are available throughout the meeting to ensure that Members at all Meeting Locations and Members participating in a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities are able to participate in the business for which the meeting has been convened;

- (c) where Members attend a meeting by being present at one of the Meeting Locations and/or where Members participating in a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities, a failure (for any reason) of the electronic facilities or communication equipment, or any other failure in the arrangements for enabling those in a Meeting Location other than the Principal Meeting Place to participate in the business for which the meeting has been convened or in the case of a hybrid meeting, the inability of one or more Members or proxies to access, or continue to access, the electronic facilities despite adequate electronic facilities having been made available by the Company, shall not affect the validity of the meeting or the resolutions passed, or any business conducted there or any action taken pursuant to such business provided that there is a quorum present throughout the meeting; and
 - (d) if any of the Meeting Locations is not in the same jurisdiction as the Principal Meeting Place and/or in the case of a hybrid meeting, the provisions of these Articles concerning the service and giving of Notice for the meeting, and the time for lodging proxies, shall apply by reference to the Principal Meeting Place.
- 64B. The Board and, at any general meeting, the chairman of the meeting may from time to time make arrangements for managing attendance and/or participation and/or voting at the Principal Meeting Place, any Meeting Location(s) and/or participation and/or voting in a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities (whether involving the issue of tickets or some other means of identification, passcode, seat reservation, electronic voting or otherwise) as it shall in its absolute discretion consider appropriate, and may from time to time change any such arrangements, provided that a Member who, pursuant to such arrangements, is not entitled to attend, in person (in the case of a Member being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy, at any Meeting Location shall be entitled so to attend at one of the other Meeting Locations; and the entitlement of any Member so to attend the meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting at such Meeting Location or Meeting Locations shall be subject to any such arrangement as may be for the time being in force and by the Notice of meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting stated to apply to the meeting.
- 64C. If it appears to the chairman of the general meeting that:
 - (a) the electronic facilities at the Principal Meeting Place or at such other Meeting Location(s) at which the meeting may be attended have become inadequate for the purposes referred to in Article 64A(1) or are otherwise not sufficient to allow the meeting to be conducted substantially in accordance with the provisions set out in the Notice of the meeting;

- (b) in the case of a hybrid meeting, electronic facilities being made available by the Company have become inadequate;
- (c) it is not possible to ascertain the view of those present or to give all persons entitled to do so a reasonable opportunity to speak, communicate and/or vote at the meeting; or
- (d) there is violence or the threat of violence, unruly behaviour or other disruption occurring at the meeting or it is not possible to secure the proper and orderly conduct of the meeting;

then, without prejudice to any other power which the chairman of the meeting may have under these Articles or at common law, the chairman may, at his/her absolute discretion, without the consent of the meeting, and before or after the meeting has started and irrespective of whether a quorum is present, interrupt or adjourn the meeting (including adjournment for indefinite period). All business conducted at the meeting up to the time of such adjournment shall be valid.

- 64D. The Board and, at any general meeting, the chairman of the meeting may make any arrangement and impose any requirement or restriction the Board or the chairman of the meeting, as the case may be, considers appropriate to ensure the security and orderly conduct of a meeting (including, without limitation, requirements for evidence of identity to be produced by those attending the meeting, the searching of their personal property and the restriction of items that may be taken into the meeting place, determining the number and frequency of and the time allowed for questions that may be raised at a meeting). Members shall also comply with all requirements or restrictions imposed by the owner of the premises at which the meeting is held. Any decision made under this Article shall be final and conclusive and a person who refuses to comply with any such arrangements, requirements or restrictions may be refused entry to the meeting or ejected (physically or electronically) from the meeting.

64E. If, after the sending of Notice of a general meeting but before the meeting is held, or after the adjournment of a meeting but before the adjourned meeting is held (whether or not Notice of the adjourned meeting is required), the Directors, in their absolute discretion, consider that it is inappropriate, impracticable, unreasonable or undesirable for any reason to hold the general meeting on the date or at the time or place or by means of electronic facilities specified in the Notice calling the meeting, they may change or postpone the meeting to another date, time and/or place and/or change the electronic facilities and/or change the form of the meeting (a physical meeting or a hybrid meeting) without approval from the Members. Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, the Directors shall have the power to provide in every Notice calling a general meeting the circumstances in which a postponement of the relevant general meeting may occur automatically without further notice, including without limitation where a warning number 8 or higher typhoon signal, black rainstorm warning or other similar event is in force at any time on the day of the meeting. This Article shall be subject to the following:

- (a) when a meeting is so postponed, the Company shall endeavour to post a notice of such postponement on the Company's website as soon as practicable (provided that failure to post such a notice shall not affect the automatic postponement of such meeting);
- (b) when only the electronic facilities specified in the Notice are, or the form of meeting has been, changed, the Board shall notify the Members of details of such change in such manner as the Board may determine;
- (c) when a meeting is changed or postponed in accordance with this Article, subject to and without prejudice to Article 64, unless already specified in the original Notice of the meeting, the Board shall fix the date, time, place (if applicable) and electronic facilities (if applicable) for the changed or postponed meeting and shall notify the Members of such details in such manner as the Board may determine; further all proxy forms shall be valid (unless revoked or replaced by a new proxy) if they are received as required by these Articles not less than 48 hours before the time of the changed or postponed meeting; and
- (d) notice of the business to be transacted at the changed or postponed meeting shall not be required, nor shall any accompanying documents be required to be recirculated, provided that the business to be transacted at the changed or postponed meeting is the same as that set out in the original Notice of general meeting circulated to the Members.

- 64F. All persons seeking to attend and participate in a hybrid meeting shall be responsible for maintaining adequate facilities to enable them to do so. Subject to Article 64C, any inability of a person or persons to attend or participate in a general meeting by way of electronic facilities shall not invalidate the proceedings of and/or resolutions passed at that meeting.
- 64G. Without prejudice to Articles 64, 64A to 64F a physical meeting may also be held by means of such telephone, electronic or other communication facilities as permit all persons participating in the meeting to communicate with each other simultaneously and instantaneously, and participation in such a meeting shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.
65. If an amendment is proposed to any resolution under consideration but is in good faith ruled out of order by the chairman of the meeting, the proceedings on the substantive resolution shall not be invalidated by any error in such ruling. In the case of a resolution duly proposed as a special resolution, no amendment thereto (other than a mere clerical amendment to correct a patent error) may in any event be considered or voted upon.

VOTING

66. (1) Subject to any special rights or restrictions as to voting for the time being attached to any shares by or in accordance with these Articles, at any general meeting on a poll every Member present in person or by proxy shall have one vote for every fully paid share of which he is the holder but so that no amount paid up or credited as paid up on a share in advance of calls or instalments is treated for the foregoing purposes as paid up on the share. A resolution put to the vote of a meeting shall be decided by way of a poll save that in the case of a physical meeting, the chairman of the meeting may in good faith, allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands in which case every Member present in person or by proxy(ies) shall have one vote provided that where more than one proxy is appointed by a Member which is a clearing house (or its nominee(s)), each such proxy shall have one vote on a show of hands. For purposes of this Article, procedural and administrative matters are those that (i) are not on the agenda of the general meeting or in any supplementary circular that may be issued by the Company to its Members; and (ii) relate to the chairman's duties to maintain the orderly conduct of the meeting and/or allow the business of the meeting to be properly and effectively dealt with, whilst allowing all Members a reasonable opportunity to express their views. Votes (whether on a show of hands or by way of poll) may be cast by such means, electronic or otherwise, as the Directors or the chairman of the meeting may determine.

- (2) In the case of a physical meeting where a show of hands is allowed, before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands, a poll may be demanded:
- (a) by at least three Members present in person or by proxy for the time being entitled to vote at the meeting; or
 - (b) by a Member or Members present in person or by proxy and representing not less than one-tenth of the total voting rights of all Members having the right to vote at the meeting; or
 - (c) by a Member or Members present in person or by proxy and holding shares in the Company conferring a right to vote at the meeting being shares on which an aggregate sum has been paid up equal to not less than one-tenth of the total sum paid up on all shares conferring that right.

A demand by a person as proxy for a Member shall be deemed to be the same as a demand by the Member.

67. Where a resolution is voted on by a show of hands, a declaration by the chairman that a resolution has been carried, or carried unanimously, or by a particular majority, or not carried by a particular majority, or lost, and an entry to that effect made in the minute book of the Company, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded for or against the resolution. The result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting. The Company shall only be required to disclose the voting figures on a poll if such disclosure is required by the Listing Rules ~~of the Designated Stock Exchange~~.
68. On a poll votes may be given either personally or by proxy.
69. A person entitled to more than one vote on a poll need not use all his votes or cast all the votes he uses in the same way.
70. All questions submitted to a meeting shall be decided by a simple majority of votes except where a greater majority is required by these Articles or by the Law Act. In the case of an equality of votes, the chairman of such meeting shall be entitled to a second or casting vote in addition to any other vote he may have.

71. Where there are joint holders of any share any one of such joint holders may vote, either in person or by proxy, in respect of such share as if he were solely entitled thereto, but if more than one of such joint holders be present at any meeting the vote of the senior holder who tenders a vote, whether in person or by proxy, shall be accepted to the exclusion of the votes of the other joint holders, and for this purpose seniority shall be determined by the order in which the names stand in the Register in respect of the joint holding. Several executors or administrators of a deceased Member in whose name any share stands shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed joint holders thereof.
72. (1) A Member who is a patient for any purpose relating to mental health or in respect of whom an order has been made by any court having jurisdiction for the protection or management of the affairs of persons incapable of managing their own affairs may vote, by his receiver, committee, *curator bonis* or other person in the nature of a receiver, committee or *curator bonis* appointed by such court, and such receiver, committee, *curator bonis* or other person may vote by proxy, and may otherwise act and be treated as if he were the registered holder of such shares for the purposes of general meetings, provided that such evidence as the Board may require of the authority of the person claiming to vote shall have been deposited at the Office, head office or Registration Office, as appropriate, not less than forty-eight (48) hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting, or adjourned meeting, or postponed meeting, as the case may be.
- (2) Any person entitled under Article 53 to be registered as the holder of any shares may vote at any general meeting in respect thereof in the same manner as if he were the registered holder of such shares, provided that forty-eight (48) hours at least before the time of the holding of the meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting, as the case may be, at which he proposes to vote, he shall satisfy the Board of his entitlement to such shares, or the Board shall have previously admitted his right to vote at such meeting in respect thereof.
73. (1) No Member shall, unless the Board otherwise determines, be entitled to attend and vote and to be reckoned in a quorum at any general meeting unless he is duly registered and all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid.
- (2) All Members shall have the right to (a) speak at a general meeting; and (b) vote at a general meeting except where a Member is required, by the Listing Rules, to abstain from voting to approve the matter under consideration.

(2)(3) Where the Company has knowledge that any Member is, under the Listing Rules of ~~the Designated Stock Exchange~~, required to abstain from voting on any particular resolution of the Company or restricted to voting only for or only against any particular resolution of the Company, any votes cast by or on behalf of such Member in contravention of such requirement or restriction shall not be counted. 74. If:

- (a) any objection shall be raised to the qualification of any voter; or
- (b) any votes have been counted which ought not to have been counted or which might have been rejected; or
- (c) any votes are not counted which ought to have been counted;

the objection or error shall not vitiate the decision of the meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting on any resolution unless the same is raised or pointed out at the meeting or, as the case may be, the adjourned meeting or postponed meeting at which the vote objected to is given or tendered or at which the error occurs. Any objection or error shall be referred to the chairman of the meeting and shall only vitiate the decision of the meeting on any resolution if the chairman decides that the same may have affected the decision of the meeting. The decision of the chairman on such matters shall be final and conclusive.

PROXIES

75. Any Member entitled to attend and vote at a meeting of the Company shall be entitled to appoint another person as his proxy to attend and vote instead of him. A Member who is the holder of two or more shares may appoint more than one proxy to represent him and vote on his behalf at a general meeting of the Company or at a class meeting. A proxy need not be a Member. In addition, a proxy or proxies representing either a Member who is an individual or a Member which is a corporation (including a clearing house or its nominee(s)) shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of the Member which he or they represent as such Member could exercise. 76. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney duly authorised in writing or, if the appointor is a corporation, either under its seal or under the hand of an officer, attorney or other person authorised to sign the same. In the case of an instrument of proxy purporting to be signed on behalf of a corporation by an officer thereof it shall be assumed, unless the contrary appears, that such officer was duly authorised to sign such instrument of proxy on behalf of the corporation without further evidence of the facts. 77. (1) The Company may, at its absolute discretion, provide an electronic address for the receipt of any document or information relating to proxies for a general meeting (including any instrument of proxy or invitation to appoint a proxy, any document necessary to show the validity of, or otherwise relating to, an appointment of proxy (whether or not required under these Articles) and notice of termination of the authority of a proxy). If such an electronic address is provided, the Company shall be deemed to have agreed that any such document or information (relating to proxies as aforesaid) may be sent by electronic means to that address, subject as hereafter provided and subject to any other limitations or conditions specified by the Company when providing the address. Without limitation, the Company may from time to time determine that any such electronic address may be used generally for such matters or specifically for particular meetings or purposes and, if so, the Company may provide different electronic addresses for different purposes. The Company may also impose any conditions on the transmission of and its receipt of such electronic communications including, for the avoidance of doubt, imposing any security or encryption arrangements as may be specified by the Company. If any document or information required to be sent to the Company under this Article is sent to the Company by electronic means, such document or information is not treated as validly delivered to or deposited with the Company if the same is not received by the Company at its designated electronic address provided in accordance with this Article or if no electronic address is so designated by the Company for the receipt of such document or information.
- (2) The instrument appointing a proxy and (if required by the Board) the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed, or a certified copy of such power or authority, shall be delivered to such place or one of such places (if any) as may be specified for that purpose in or by way of note to or in any document accompanying the notice convening the meeting (or, if no place is so specified at the Registration Office or the Office, as may be appropriate), or if the Company has provided an electronic address in accordance with the preceding paragraph, shall be received at the electronic address specified, not less than forty-eight (48) hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote. No instrument appointing a proxy shall be valid after the expiration of twelve (12) months from the date named in it as the date of its execution, except at an adjourned meeting or postponed meeting in cases where the meeting was originally held within twelve (12) months from such date. Delivery of an instrument appointing a proxy shall not preclude a Member from attending and voting at the meeting convened and in such event, the instrument appointing a proxy shall be deemed to be revoked.

78. Instruments of proxy shall be in any common form or in such other form as the Board may approve (provided that this shall not preclude the use of the two-way form) and the Board may, if it thinks fit, send out with the notice of any meeting forms of instrument of proxy for use at the meeting. The instrument of proxy shall be deemed to confer authority to vote on any amendment of a resolution put to the meeting for which it is given as the proxy thinks fit. The instrument of proxy shall, unless the contrary is stated therein, be valid as well for any adjournment or postponement of the meeting as for the meeting to which it relates. The Board may decide, either generally or in any particular case, to treat a proxy appointment as valid notwithstanding that the appointment or any of the information required under these Articles has not been received in accordance with the requirements of these Articles. Subject to aforesaid, if the proxy appointment and any of the information required under these Articles is not received in the manner set out in these Articles, the appointee shall not be entitled to vote in respect of the shares in question. A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument of proxy shall be valid notwithstanding the previous death or insanity of the principal, or revocation of the instrument of proxy or of the authority under which it was executed, provided that no intimation in writing of such death, insanity or revocation shall have been received by the Company at the Office or the Registration Office (or such other place as may be specified for the delivery of instruments of proxy in the notice convening the meeting or other document sent therewith) two (2) hours at least before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting, at which the instrument of proxy is used.

Anything which under these Articles a Member may do by proxy he may likewise do by his duly appointed attorney and the provisions of these Articles relating to proxies and instruments appointing proxies shall apply *mutatis mutandis* in relation to any such attorney and the instrument under which such attorney is appointed.

CORPORATIONS ACTING BY REPRESENTATIVES

81. (1) Any corporation which is a Member may by resolution of its directors or other governing body authorise such person as it thinks fit to act as its representative at any meeting of the Company or at any meeting of any class of Members. The person so authorised shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of such corporation as the corporation could exercise if it were an individual Member and such corporation shall for the purposes of these Articles be deemed to be present in person at any such meeting if a person so authorised is present thereat. - (2) If a clearing house (or its nominee(s)), being a corporation, is a Member, it may authorise such persons as it thinks fit to act as its representatives at any meeting of the Company or at any meeting of any class of Members provided that, if more than one person is so authorised, the authorisation shall specify the number and class of shares in respect of which each such representative is so authorised. Each person so authorised under the provisions of this Article shall be deemed to have been duly authorised without further evidence of the facts and be entitled to exercise the same rights and powers on behalf of the clearing house (or its nominee(s)) as if such person was the registered holder of the shares of the Company held by the clearing house (or its nominee(s)) including, the right to speak and vote and, where a show of hands is allowed, the right to vote individually on a show of hands. - (3) Any reference in these Articles to a duly authorised representative of a Member being a corporation shall mean a representative authorised under the provisions of this Article.

WRITTEN RESOLUTIONS OF MEMBERS

82. A resolution in writing signed (in such manner as to indicate, expressly or impliedly, unconditional approval) by or on behalf of all persons for the time being entitled to receive notice of and to attend and vote at general meetings of the Company shall, for the purposes of these Articles, be treated as a resolution duly passed at a general meeting of the Company and, where relevant, as a special resolution so passed. Any such resolution shall be deemed to have been passed at a meeting held on the date on which it was signed by the last Member to sign, and where the resolution states a date as being the date of his signature thereof by any Member the statement shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him on that date. Such a resolution may consist of several documents in the like form, each signed by one or more relevant Members.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

83. (1) Unless otherwise determined by the Company in general meeting, the number of Directors shall not be less than two (2). There shall be no maximum number of Directors unless otherwise determined from time to time by the Members in general meeting. The Directors shall be elected or appointed in the first place by the subscribers to the Memorandum of Association or by a majority of them and thereafter in accordance with Article 84 called for such purpose and who shall hold office for such term as the Members may determine or, in the absence of such determination, in accordance with Article 84 or until their successors are elected or appointed or their office is otherwise vacated.

- (2) Subject to the Articles and the ~~Law~~Act, the Company may by ordinary resolution elect any person to be a Director either to fill a casual vacancy on the Board, or as an addition to the existing Board.
- (3) The Directors shall have the power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy on the Board or as an addition to the existing Board. Any Director so appointed ~~by the Board to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office until the first general meeting of Members after his appointment and be subject to re-election at such meeting and any Director appointed by the Board as an addition to the existing Board shall hold office only until the next first following annual general meeting of the Company~~ after his appointment and shall then be eligible for re-election. - (4) Neither a Director nor an alternate Director shall be required to hold any shares of the Company by way of qualification and a Director or alternate Director (as the case may be) who is not a Member shall be entitled to receive notice of and to attend and speak at any general meeting of the Company and of all classes of shares of the Company.
- (5) The Members may, at any general meeting convened and held in accordance with these Articles, by ordinary resolution remove a Director (including a managing or other executive Director) at any time before the expiration of his ~~period~~term of office notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Articles or in any agreement between the Company and such Director (but without prejudice to any claim for damages under any such agreement). - (6) A vacancy on the Board created by the removal of a Director under the provisions of subparagraph (5) above may be filled by the election or appointment by ordinary resolution of the Members at the meeting at which such Director is removed.
- (7) The Company may from time to time in general meeting by ordinary resolution increase or reduce the number of Directors but so that the number of Directors shall never be less than two (2).

RETIREMENT OF DIRECTORS

84. (1) Notwithstanding any other provisions in the Articles, at each annual general meeting one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at an annual general meeting at least once every three years.

(2) A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election and shall continue to act as a Director throughout the meeting at which he retires. The Directors to retire by rotation shall include (so far as necessary to ascertain the number of directors to retire by rotation) any Director who wishes to retire and not to offer himself for re-election. Any further Directors so to retire shall be those of the other Directors subject to retirement by rotation who have been longest in office since their last re-election or appointment and so that as between persons who became or were last re-elected Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot. Any Director appointed by the Board pursuant to Article 83(3) shall not be taken into account in determining which particular Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation.

85. No person other than a Director retiring at the meeting shall, unless recommended by the Directors for election, be eligible for election as a Director at any general meeting unless a Notice signed by a Member (other than the person to be proposed) duly qualified to attend and vote at the meeting for which such notice is given of his intention to propose such person for election and also a Notice signed by the person to be proposed of his willingness to be elected shall have been lodged at the head office or at the Registration Office provided that the minimum length of the period, during which such Notice(s) are given, shall be at least seven (7) days and that (if the Notices are submitted after the despatch of the notice of the general meeting appointed for such election) the period for lodgment of such Notice(s) shall commence on the day after the despatch of the notice of the general meeting appointed for such election and end no later than seven (7) days prior to the date of such general meeting.

DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS

86. The office of a Director shall be vacated if the Director:

(1) resigns his office by notice in writing delivered to the Company at the Office or tendered at a meeting of the Board;

(2) becomes of unsound mind or dies;

- (3) without special leave of absence from the Board, is absent from meetings of the Board for six consecutive months, and his alternate Director, if any, shall not during such period have attended in his stead and the Board resolves that his office be vacated;
- (4) becomes bankrupt or has a receiving order made against him or suspends payment or compounds with his creditors;
- (5) is prohibited by law from being a Director; or
- (6) ceases to be a Director by virtue of any provision of the Statutes or is removed from office pursuant to these Articles.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS

- 87. The Board may from time to time appoint any one or more of its body to be a managing director, joint managing director or deputy managing director or to hold any other employment or executive office with the Company for such period (subject to their continuance as Directors) and upon such terms as the Board may determine and the Board may revoke or terminate any of such appointments. Any such revocation or termination as aforesaid shall be without prejudice to any claim for damages that such Director may have against the Company or the Company may have against such Director. A Director appointed to an office under this Article shall be subject to the same provisions as to removal as the other Directors of the Company, and he shall (subject to the provisions of any contract between him and the Company) ipso facto and immediately cease to hold such office if he shall cease to hold the office of Director for any cause.
- 88. Notwithstanding Articles 93, 94, 95 and 96, an executive director appointed to an office under Article 87 hereof shall receive such remuneration (whether by way of salary, commission, participation in profits or otherwise or by all or any of those modes) and such other benefits (including pension and/or gratuity and/or other benefits on retirement) and allowances as the Board may from time to time determine, and either in addition to or in lieu of his remuneration as a Director.

ALTERNATE DIRECTORS

89. Any Director may at any time by Notice delivered to the Office or head office or at a meeting of the Directors appoint any person (including another Director) to be his alternate Director. Any person so appointed shall have all the rights and powers of the Director or Directors for whom such person is appointed in the alternative provided that such person shall not be counted more than once in determining whether or not a quorum is present. An alternate Director may be removed at any time by the body which appointed him and, subject thereto, the office of alternate Director shall continue until the happening of any event which, if he were a Director, would cause him to vacate such office or if his appointer ceases for any reason to be a Director. Any appointment or removal of an alternate Director shall be effected by Notice signed by the appointor and delivered to the Office or head office or tendered at a meeting of the Board. An alternate Director may also be a Director in his own right and may act as alternate to more than one Director. An alternate Director shall, if his appointor so requests, be entitled to receive notices of meetings of the Board or of committees of the Board to the same extent as, but in lieu of, the Director appointing him and shall be entitled to such extent to attend and vote as a Director at any such meeting at which the Director appointing him is not personally present and generally at such meeting to exercise and discharge all the functions, powers and duties of his appointor as a Director and for the purposes of the proceedings at such meeting the provisions of these Articles shall apply as if he were a Director save that as an alternate for more than one Director his voting rights shall be cumulative.
90. An alternate Director shall only be a Director for the purposes of the ~~Law~~Act and shall only be subject to the provisions of the ~~Law~~Act insofar as they relate to the duties and obligations of a Director when performing the functions of the Director for whom he is appointed in the alternative and shall alone be responsible to the Company for his acts and defaults and shall not be deemed to be the agent of or for the Director appointing him. An alternate Director shall be entitled to contract and be interested in and benefit from contracts or arrangements or transactions and to be repaid expenses and to be indemnified by the Company to the same extent mutatis mutandis as if he were a Director but he shall not be entitled to receive from the Company any fee in his capacity as an alternate Director except only such part, if any, of the remuneration otherwise payable to his appointor as such appointor may by Notice to the Company from time to time direct.

91. Every person acting as an alternate Director shall have one vote for each Director for whom he acts as alternate (in addition to his own vote if he is also a Director). If his appointor is for the time being absent from Hong Kong or otherwise not available or unable to act, the signature of an alternate Director to any resolution in writing of the Board or a committee of the Board of which his appointor is a member shall, unless the notice of his appointment provides to the contrary, be as effective as the signature of his appointor.
92. An alternate Director shall ipso facto cease to be an alternate Director if his appointor ceases for any reason to be a Director, however, such alternate Director or any other person may be re-appointed by the Directors to serve as an alternate Director PROVIDED always that, if at any meeting any Director retires but is re-elected at the same meeting, any appointment of such alternate Director pursuant to these Articles which was in force immediately before his retirement shall remain in force as though he had not retired.

DIRECTORS' FEES AND EXPENSES

93. The ordinary remuneration of the Directors shall from time to time be determined by the Company in general meeting and shall (unless otherwise directed by the resolution by which it is voted) be divided amongst the Board in such proportions and in such manner as the Board may agree or, failing agreement, equally, except that any Director who shall hold office for part only of the period in respect of which such remuneration is payable shall be entitled only to rank in such division for a proportion of remuneration related to the period during which he has held office. Such remuneration shall be deemed to accrue from day to day.
94. Each Director shall be entitled to be repaid or prepaid all travelling, hotel and incidental expenses reasonably incurred or expected to be incurred by him in attending meetings of the Board or committees of the Board or general meetings or separate meetings of any class of shares or of debentures of the Company or otherwise in connection with the discharge of his duties as a Director.
95. Any Director who, by request, goes or resides abroad for any purpose of the Company or who performs services which in the opinion of the Board go beyond the ordinary duties of a Director may be paid such extra remuneration (whether by way of salary, commission, participation in profits or otherwise) as the Board may determine and such extra remuneration shall be in addition to or in substitution for any ordinary remuneration provided for by or pursuant to any other Article.

96. The Board shall obtain the approval of the Company in general meeting before making any payment to any Director or past Director of the Company by way of compensation for loss of office, or as consideration for or in connection with his retirement from office (not being payment to which the Director is contractually entitled). DIRECTORS' INTERESTS

97. A Director may:
- (a) hold any other office or place of profit with the Company (except that of Auditor) in conjunction with his office of Director for such period and upon such terms as the Board may determine. Any remuneration (whether by way of salary, commission, participation in profits or otherwise) paid to any Director in respect of any such other office or place of profit shall be in addition to any remuneration provided for by or pursuant to any other Article;
 - (b) act by himself or his firm in a professional capacity for the Company (otherwise than as Auditor) and he or his firm may be remunerated for professional services as if he were not a Director;
 - (c) continue to be or become a director, managing director, joint managing director, deputy managing director, executive director, manager or other officer or member of any other company promoted by the Company or in which the Company may be interested as a vendor, shareholder or otherwise and (unless otherwise agreed) no such Director shall be accountable for any remuneration, profits or other benefits received by him as a director, managing director, joint managing director, deputy managing director, executive director, manager or other officer or member of or from his interests in any such other company. Subject as otherwise provided by these Articles the Directors may exercise or cause to be exercised the voting powers conferred by the shares in any other company held or owned by the Company, or exercisable by them as Directors of such other company in such manner in all respects as they think fit (including the exercise thereof in favour of any resolution appointing themselves or any of them directors, managing directors, joint managing directors, deputy managing directors, executive directors, managers or other officers of such company) or voting or providing for the payment of remuneration to the director, managing director, joint managing director, deputy managing director, executive director, manager or other officers of such other company and any Director may vote in favour of the exercise of such voting rights in manner aforesaid notwithstanding that he may be, or about to be, appointed a director, managing director, joint managing director, deputy managing director, executive director, manager or other officer of such a company, and that as such he is or may become interested in the exercise of such voting rights in manner aforesaid.

98. Subject to the ~~Law~~Act and to these Articles, no Director or proposed or intending Director shall be disqualified by his office from contracting with the Company, either with regard to his tenure of any office or place of profit or as vendor, purchaser or in any other manner whatsoever, nor shall any such contract or any other contract or arrangement in which any Director is in any way interested be liable to be avoided, nor shall any Director so contracting or being so interested be liable to account to the Company or the Members for any remuneration, profit or other benefits realised by any such contract or arrangement by reason of such Director holding that office or of the fiduciary relationship thereby established provided that such Director shall disclose the nature of his interest in any contract or arrangement in which he is interested in accordance with Article 99 herein.

99. A Director who to his knowledge is in any way, whether directly or indirectly, interested in a contract or arrangement or proposed contract or arrangement with the Company shall declare the nature of his interest at the meeting of the Board at which the question of entering into the contract or arrangement is first considered, if he knows his interest then exists, or in any other case at the first meeting of the Board after he knows that he is or has become so interested. For the purposes of this Article, a general Notice to the Board by a Director to the effect that:

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- (a) he is a member or officer of a specified company or firm and is to be regarded as interested in any contract or arrangement which may after the date of the Notice be made with that company or firm; or
- (b) he is to be regarded as interested in any contract or arrangement which may after the date of the Notice be made with a specified person who is connected with him;

shall be deemed to be a sufficient declaration of interest under this Article in relation to any such contract or arrangement, provided that no such Notice shall be effective unless either it is given at a meeting of the Board or the Director takes reasonable steps to secure that it is brought up and read at the next Board meeting after it is given.

100. (1) A Director shall not vote (nor be counted in the quorum) on any resolution of the Board approving any contract or arrangement or any other proposal in which he or any of his close associates is materially interested, but this prohibition shall not apply to any of the following matters namely: App-3

- (ii) ~~any contract or arrangement proposal~~ concerning an offer of shares or debentures or other securities of or by the Company or any other company which the Company may promote or be interested in for subscription or purchase; where the Director or his close associate(s) is/are or is/are to be interested as a participant in the underwriting or sub-underwriting of the offer;
- ~~any contract or arrangement in which the Director or his close associate(s) is/are interested in the same manner as other holders of shares or debentures or other securities of the Company by virtue only of his/their interest in shares or debentures or other securities of the Company; or~~
- (iii) any proposal or arrangement concerning the benefit of employees of the Company or its subsidiaries including:
- (a) the adoption, modification or operation of any employees' share scheme or any share incentive or a share option scheme; under which the Director or his close associate(s) may benefit; or
 - (b) the adoption, modification or operation of a pension fund or retirement, death or disability benefits scheme or other arrangement which relates both to Directors or his the Director, his close associate(s) and to employee(s) of the Company or of any of its subsidiaries and does not provide in respect of any Director, or his close associate(s), as such any privilege or advantage not ~~accorded~~ generally accorded to the class of persons to which such scheme or fund relates;

- (iv) any contract or arrangement in which the Director or his close associate(s) is/are interested in the same manner as other holders of shares or debentures or other securities of the Company by virtue only of his/their interest in shares or debentures or other securities of the Company.
- (2) If any question shall arise at any meeting of the Board as to the materiality of the interest of a Director (other than the chairman of the meeting) or as to the entitlement of any Director (other than such chairman) to vote and such question is not resolved by his voluntarily agreeing to abstain from voting, such question shall be referred to the chairman of the meeting and his ruling in relation to such other Director shall be final and conclusive except in a case where the nature or extent of the interest of the Director concerned as known to such Director has not been fairly disclosed to the Board. If any question as aforesaid shall arise in respect of the chairman of the meeting such question shall be decided by a resolution of the Board (for which purpose such chairman shall not vote thereon) and such resolution shall be final and conclusive except in a case where the nature or extent of the interest of such chairman as known to such chairman has not been fairly disclosed to the Board.

GENERAL POWERS OF THE DIRECTORS

101. (1) The business of the Company shall be managed and conducted by the Board, which may pay all expenses incurred in forming and registering the Company and may exercise all powers of the Company (whether relating to the management of the business of the Company or otherwise) which are not by the Statutes or by these Articles required to be exercised by the Company in general meeting, subject nevertheless to the provisions of the Statutes and of these Articles and to such regulations being not inconsistent with such provisions, as may be prescribed by the Company in general meeting, but no regulations made by the Company in general meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulations had not been made. The general powers given by this Article shall not be limited or restricted by any special authority or power given to the Board by any other Article.
- (2) Any person contracting or dealing with the Company in the ordinary course of business shall be entitled to rely on any written or oral contract or agreement or deed, document or instrument entered into or executed as the case may be by any two of the Directors acting jointly on behalf of the Company and the same shall be deemed to be validly entered into or executed by the Company as the case may be and shall, subject to any rule of law, be binding on the Company.

- (3) Without prejudice to the general powers conferred by these Articles it is hereby expressly declared that the Board shall have the following powers:
- (a) to give to any person the right or option of requiring at a future date that an allotment shall be made to him of any share at par or at such premium as may be agreed;
 - (b) to give to any Directors, officers or servants of the Company an interest in any particular business or transaction or participation in the profits thereof or in the general profits of the Company either in addition to or in substitution for a salary or other remuneration; and
 - (c) to resolve that the Company be deregistered in the Cayman Islands and continued in a named jurisdiction outside the Cayman Islands subject to the provisions of the ~~Law~~Act.
- (4) The Company shall not make any loan, directly or indirectly, to a Director or his close associate(s) if and to the extent it would be prohibited by the Companies Ordinance (Chapter 622 of the laws of Hong Kong) as if the Company were a company incorporated in Hong Kong. App. 13B
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Article 101(4) shall only have effect for so long as the shares of the Company are listed on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited.

102. The Board may establish any regional or local boards or agencies for managing any of the affairs of the Company in any place, and may appoint any persons to be members of such local boards, or any managers or agents, and may fix their remuneration (either by way of salary or by commission or by conferring the right to participation in the profits of the Company or by a combination of two or more of these modes) and pay the working expenses of any staff employed by them upon the business of the Company. The Board may delegate to any regional or local board, manager or agent any of the powers, authorities and discretions vested in or exercisable by the Board (other than its powers to make calls and forfeit shares), with power to sub-delegate, and may authorise the members of any of them to fill any vacancies therein and to act notwithstanding vacancies. Any such appointment or delegation may be made upon such terms and subject to such conditions as the Board may think fit, and the Board may remove any person appointed as aforesaid, and may revoke or vary such delegation, but no person dealing in good faith and without notice of any such revocation or variation shall be affected thereby.

103. The Board may by power of attorney appoint under the Seal any company, firm or person or any fluctuating body of persons, whether nominated directly or indirectly by the Board, to be the attorney or attorneys of the Company for such purposes and with such powers, authorities and discretions (not exceeding those vested in or exercisable by the Board under these Articles) and for such period and subject to such conditions as it may think fit, and any such power of attorney may contain such provisions for the protection and convenience of persons dealing with any such attorney as the Board may think fit, and may also authorise any such attorney to sub-delegate all or any of the powers, authorities and discretions vested in him. Such attorney or attorneys may, if so authorised under the Seal of the Company, execute any deed or instrument under their personal seal with the same effect as the affixation of the Company's Seal.
104. The Board may entrust to and confer upon a managing director, joint managing director, deputy managing director, an executive director or any Director any of the powers exercisable by it upon such terms and conditions and with such restrictions as it thinks fit, and either collaterally with, or to the exclusion of, its own powers, and may from time to time revoke or vary all or any of such powers but no person dealing in good faith and without notice of such revocation or variation shall be affected thereby.
105. All cheques, promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange and other instruments, whether negotiable or transferable or not, and all receipts for moneys paid to the Company shall be signed, drawn, accepted, endorsed or otherwise executed, as the case may be, in such manner as the Board shall from time to time by resolution determine. The Company's banking accounts shall be kept with such banker or bankers as the Board shall from time to time determine.
106. (1) The Board may establish or concur or join with other companies (being subsidiary companies of the Company or companies with which it is associated in business) in establishing and making contributions out of the Company's moneys to any schemes or funds for providing pensions, sickness or compassionate allowances, life assurance or other benefits for employees (which expression as used in this and the following paragraph shall include any Director or ex Director who may hold or have held any executive office or any office of profit under the Company or any of its subsidiary companies) and ex-employees of the Company and their dependants or any class or classes of such person.

- (2) The Board may pay, enter into agreements to pay or make grants of revocable or irrevocable, and either subject or not subject to any terms or conditions, pensions or other benefits to employees and ex-employees and their dependants, or to any of such persons, including pensions or benefits additional to those, if any, to which such employees or ex-employees or their dependants are or may become entitled under any such scheme or fund as mentioned in the last preceding paragraph. Any such pension or benefit may, as the Board considers desirable, be granted to an employee either before and in anticipation of or upon or at any time after his actual retirement.

BORROWING POWERS

107. The Board may exercise all the powers of the Company to raise or borrow money and to mortgage or charge all or any part of the undertaking, property and assets (present and future) and uncalled capital of the Company and, subject to the LawAct, to issue debentures, bonds and other securities, whether outright or as collateral security for any debt, liability or obligation of the Company or of any third party.
108. Debentures, bonds and other securities may be made assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.
109. Any debentures, bonds or other securities may be issued at a discount (other than shares), premium or otherwise and with any special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, attending and voting at general meetings of the Company, appointment of Directors and otherwise.
110. (1) Where any uncalled capital of the Company is charged, all persons taking any subsequent charge thereon shall take the same subject to such prior charge, and shall not be entitled, by notice to the Members or otherwise, to obtain priority over such prior charge.
- (2) The Board shall cause a proper register to be kept, in accordance with the provisions of the LawAct, of all charges specifically affecting the property of the Company and of any series of debentures issued by the Company and shall duly comply with the requirements of the LawAct in regard to the registration of charges and debentures therein specified and otherwise.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE DIRECTORS

111. The Board may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn or postpone and otherwise regulate its meetings as it considers appropriate. Questions arising at any meeting shall be determined by a majority of votes. In the case of any equality of votes the chairman of the meeting shall have an additional or casting vote.

112. A meeting of the Board may be convened by the Secretary on request of a Director or by any Director. The Secretary shall convene a meeting of the Board whenever he shall be required so to do by any Director. Notice of a meeting of the Board shall be deemed to be duly given to a Director if it is given to such Director in writing or verbally (including in person or by telephone) or by electronic means to an electronic address from time to time notified to the Company by such Director or (if the recipient consents to it being made available on a website) by making it available on a website or by telephone or in such other manner as the Board may from time to time determine.
113. (1) The quorum necessary for the transaction of the business of the Board may be fixed by the Board and, unless so fixed at any other number, shall be two (2). An alternate Director shall be counted in a quorum in the case of the absence of a Director for whom he is the alternate provided that he shall not be counted more than once for the purpose of determining whether or not a quorum is present.
- (2) Directors may participate in any meeting of the Board by means of a conference telephone, electronic facilities or other communications equipment through which all persons participating in the meeting can communicate with each other simultaneously and instantaneously and, for the purpose of counting a quorum, such participation shall constitute presence at a meeting as if those participating were present in person.
- (3) Any Director who ceases to be a Director at a Board meeting may continue to be present and to act as a Director and be counted in the quorum until the termination of such Board meeting if no other Director objects and if otherwise a quorum of Directors would not be present.
114. The continuing Directors or a sole continuing Director may act notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board but, if and so long as the number of Directors is reduced below the minimum number fixed by or in accordance with these Articles, the continuing Directors or Director, notwithstanding that the number of Directors is below the number fixed by or in accordance with these Articles as the quorum or that there is only one continuing Director, may act for the purpose of filling vacancies in the Board or of summoning general meetings of the Company but not for any other purpose.
115. The Board may elect one or more chairman and one or more deputy chairman of its meetings and determine the period for which they are respectively to hold such office. If no chairman or deputy chairman is elected, or if at any meeting no chairman or deputy chairman is present within five (5) minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the Directors present may choose one of their number to be chairman of the meeting.

116. A meeting of the Board at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all the powers, authorities and discretions for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Board.
117. (1) The Board may delegate any of its powers, authorities and discretions to committees, consisting of such Director or Directors and other persons as it thinks fit, and they may, from time to time, revoke such delegation or revoke the appointment of and discharge any such committees either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes. Any committee so formed shall, in the exercise of the powers, authorities and discretions so delegated, conform to any regulations which may be imposed on it by the Board.
- (2) All acts done by any such committee in conformity with such regulations, and in fulfilment of the purposes for which it was appointed, but not otherwise, shall have like force and effect as if done by the Board, and the Board shall have power, with the consent of the Company in general meeting, to remunerate the members of any such committee, and charge such remuneration to the current expenses of the Company.
118. The meetings and proceedings of any committee consisting of two or more members shall be governed by the provisions contained in these Articles for regulating the meetings and proceedings of the Board so far as the same are applicable and are not superseded by any regulations imposed by the Board under the last preceding Article.
119. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors except such as are temporarily unable to act through ill health or disability, and all the alternate Directors, if appropriate, whose appointors are temporarily unable to act as aforesaid shall (provided that such number is sufficient to constitute a quorum and further provided that a copy of such resolution has been given or the contents thereof communicated to all the Directors for the time being entitled to receive notices of Board meetings in the same manner as notices of meetings are required to be given by these Articles) be as valid and effectual as if a resolution had been passed at a meeting of the Board duly convened and held. A notification of consent to such resolution given by a Director or an alternate Director in writing to the Board by any means (including by means of electronic communication) shall be deemed to be his/her signature to such resolution in writing for the purpose of this Article. Such resolution may be contained in one document or in several documents in like form each signed by one or more of the Directors or alternate Directors and for this purpose a facsimile signature of a Director or an alternate Director shall be treated as valid. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a resolution in writing shall not be passed in lieu of a meeting of the Board for the purposes of considering any matter or business in which a substantial shareholder of the Company or a Director has a conflict of interest and the Board has determined that such conflict of interest to be material.

120. All acts bona fide done by the Board or by any committee or by any person acting as a Director or members of a committee, shall, notwithstanding that it is afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any member of the Board or such committee or person acting as aforesaid or that they or any of them were disqualified or had vacated office, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified and had continued to be a Director or member of such committee.

MANAGERS

121. The Board may from time to time appoint a general manager, a manager or managers of the Company and may fix his or their remuneration either by way of salary or commission or by conferring the right to participation in the profits of the Company or by a combination of two or more of these modes and pay the working expenses of any of the staff of the general manager, manager or managers who may be employed by him or them upon the business of the Company.
122. The appointment of such general manager, manager or managers may be for such period as the Board may decide, and the Board may confer upon him or them all or any of the powers of the Board as they may think fit.
123. The Board may enter into such agreement or agreements with any such general manager, manager or managers upon such terms and conditions in all respects as the Board may in their absolute discretion think fit, including a power for such general manager, manager or managers to appoint an assistant manager or managers or other employees whatsoever under them for the purpose of carrying on the business of the Company.

OFFICERS

124. (1) The officers of the Company shall consist of at least one chairman, the Directors and Secretary and such additional officers (who may or may not be Directors) as the Board may from time to time determine, all of whom shall be deemed to be officers for the purposes of the ~~Law~~Act and these Articles.
- (2) The Directors shall, as soon as may be after each appointment or election of Directors, elect amongst the Directors a chairman and if more than one (1) Director is proposed for this office, the Directors may elect more than one chairman in such manner as the Directors may determine.
- (3) The officers shall receive such remuneration as the Directors may from time to time determine.

125. (1) The Secretary and additional officers, if any, shall be appointed by the Board and shall hold office on such terms and for such period as the Board may determine. If thought fit, two (2) or more persons may be appointed as joint Secretaries. The Board may also appoint from time to time on such terms as it thinks fit one or more assistant or deputy Secretaries.
- (2) The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the Members and shall keep correct minutes of such meetings and enter the same in the proper books provided for the purpose. He shall perform such other duties as are prescribed by the LawAct or these Articles or as may be prescribed by the Board.
126. The officers of the Company shall have such powers and perform such duties in the management, business and affairs of the Company as may be delegated to them by the Directors from time to time.
127. A provision of the LawAct or of these Articles requiring or authorising a thing to be done by or to a Director and the Secretary shall not be satisfied by its being done by or to the same person acting both as Director and as or in place of the Secretary.

REGISTER OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

128. The Company shall cause to be kept in one or more books at its Office a Register of Directors and Officers in which there shall be entered the full names and addresses of the Directors and Officers and such other particulars as required by the LawAct or as the Directors may determine. The Company shall send to the Registrar of Companies in the Cayman Islands a copy of such register, and shall from time to time notify to the said Registrar of any change that takes place in relation to such Directors and Officers as required by the LawAct.

MINUTES

129. (1) The Board shall cause minutes to be duly entered in books provided for the purpose:
- (a) of all elections and appointments of officers;
 - (b) of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors and of any committee of the Directors;
 - (c) of all resolutions and proceedings of each general meeting of the Members, meetings of the Board and meetings of committees of the Board and where there are managers, of all proceedings of meetings of the managers.
- (2) Minutes shall be kept by the Secretary at the head office.

SEAL

130. (1) The Company shall have one or more Seals, as the Board may determine. For the purpose of sealing documents creating or evidencing securities issued by the Company, the Company may have a securities seal which is a facsimile of the Seal of the Company with the addition of the word "Securities" on its face or in such other form as the Board may approve. The Board shall provide for the custody of each Seal and no Seal shall be used without the authority of the Board or of a committee of the Board authorised by the Board in that behalf. Subject as otherwise provided in these Articles, any instrument to which a Seal is affixed shall be signed autographically by one Director and the Secretary or by two Directors or by such other person (including a Director) or persons as the Board may appoint, either generally or in any particular case, save that as regards any certificates for shares or debentures or other securities of the Company the Board may by resolution determine that such signatures or either of them shall be dispensed with or affixed by some method or system of mechanical signature. Every instrument executed in manner provided by this Article shall be deemed to be sealed and executed with the authority of the Board previously given. App-3
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- (2) Where the Company has a Seal for use abroad, the Board may by writing under the Seal appoint any agent or committee abroad to be the duly authorised agent of the Company for the purpose of affixing and using such Seal and the Board may impose restrictions on the use thereof as may be thought fit. Wherever in these Articles reference is made to the Seal, the reference shall, when and so far as may be applicable, be deemed to include any such other Seal as aforesaid.

AUTHENTICATION OF DOCUMENTS

131. Any Director or the Secretary or any person appointed by the Board for the purpose may authenticate any documents affecting the constitution of the Company and any resolution passed by the Company or the Board or any committee, and any books, records, documents and accounts relating to the business of the Company, and to certify copies thereof or extracts therefrom as true copies or extracts, and if any books, records, documents or accounts are elsewhere than at the Office or the head office the local manager or other officer of the Company having the custody thereof shall be deemed to be a person so appointed by the Board. A document purporting to be a copy of a resolution, or an extract from the minutes of a meeting, of the Company or of the Board or any committee which is so certified shall be conclusive evidence in favour of all persons dealing with the Company upon the faith thereof that such resolution has been duly passed or, as the case may be, that such minutes or extract is a true and accurate record of proceedings at a duly constituted meeting.

DESTRUCTION OF DOCUMENTS

132. (1) The Company shall be entitled to destroy the following documents at the following times:
- (a) any share certificate which has been cancelled at any time after the expiry of one (1) year from the date of such cancellation;
 - (b) any dividend mandate or any variation or cancellation thereof or any notification of change of name or address at any time after the expiry of two (2) years from the date such mandate variation cancellation or notification was recorded by the Company;
 - (c) any instrument of transfer of shares which has been registered at any time after the expiry of seven (7) years from the date of registration;
 - (d) any allotment letters after the expiry of seven (7) years from the date of issue thereof; and
 - (e) copies of powers of attorney, grants of probate and letters of administration at any time after the expiry of seven (7) years after the account to which the relevant power of attorney, grant of probate or letters of administration related has been closed;

and it shall conclusively be presumed in favour of the Company that every entry in the Register purporting to be made on the basis of any such documents so destroyed was duly and properly made and every share certificate so destroyed was a valid certificate duly and properly cancelled and that every instrument of transfer so destroyed was a valid and effective instrument duly and properly registered and that every other document destroyed hereunder was a valid and effective document in accordance with the recorded particulars thereof in the books or records of the Company. Provided always that: (1) the foregoing provisions of this Article shall apply only to the destruction of a document in good faith and without express notice to the Company that the preservation of such document was relevant to a claim; (2) nothing contained in this Article shall be construed as imposing upon the Company any liability in respect of the destruction of any such document earlier than as aforesaid or in any case where the conditions of proviso (1) above are not fulfilled; and (3) references in this Article to the destruction of any document include references to its disposal in any manner.

- (2) Notwithstanding any provision contained in these Articles, the Directors may, if permitted by applicable law, authorise the destruction of documents set out in subparagraphs (a) to (e) of paragraph (1) of this Article and any other documents in relation to share registration which have been microfilmed or electronically stored by the Company or by the share registrar on its behalf provided always that this Article shall apply only to the destruction of a document in good faith and without express notice to the Company and its share registrar that the preservation of such document was relevant to a claim.

DIVIDENDS AND OTHER PAYMENTS

133. Subject to the ~~Law~~Act, the Company in general meeting may from time to time declare dividends in any currency to be paid to the Members but no dividend shall be declared in excess of the amount recommended by the Board.
134. Dividends may be declared and paid out of the profits of the Company, realised or unrealised, or from any reserve set aside from profits which the Directors determine is no longer needed. With the sanction of an ordinary resolution dividends may also be declared and paid out of share premium account or any other fund or account which can be authorised for this purpose in accordance with the ~~Law~~Act.
135. Except in so far as the rights attaching to, or the terms of issue of, any share otherwise provide:
- (a) all dividends shall be declared and paid according to the amounts paid up on the shares in respect of which the dividend is paid, but no amount paid up on a share in advance of calls shall be treated for the purposes of this Article as paid up on the share; and
- (b) all dividends shall be apportioned and paid pro rata according to the amounts paid up on the shares during any portion or portions of the period in respect of which the dividend is paid.

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136. The Board may from time to time pay to the Members such interim dividends as appear to the Board to be justified by the profits of the Company and in particular (but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing) if at any time the share capital of the Company is divided into different classes, the Board may pay such interim dividends in respect of those shares in the capital of the Company which confer on the holders thereof deferred or non-preferential rights as well as in respect of those shares which confer on the holders thereof preferential rights with regard to dividend and provided that the Board acts bona fide the Board shall not incur any responsibility to the holders of shares conferring any preference for any damage that they may suffer by reason of the payment of an interim dividend on any shares having deferred or non-preferential rights and may also pay any fixed dividend which is payable on any shares of the Company half-yearly or on any other dates, whenever such profits, in the opinion of the Board, justifies such payment.
137. The Board may deduct from any dividend or other moneys payable to a Member by the Company on or in respect of any shares all sums of money (if any) presently payable by him to the Company on account of calls or otherwise.
138. No dividend or other moneys payable by the Company on or in respect of any share shall bear interest against the Company.
139. Any dividend, interest or other sum payable in cash to the holder of shares may be paid by cheque or warrant sent through the post addressed to the holder at his registered address or, in the case of joint holders, addressed to the holder whose name stands first in the Register in respect of the shares at his address as appearing in the Register or addressed to such person and at such address as the holder or joint holders may in writing direct. Every such cheque or warrant shall, unless the holder or joint holders otherwise direct, be made payable to the order of the holder or, in the case of joint holders, to the order of the holder whose name stands first on the Register in respect of such shares, and shall be sent at his or their risk and payment of the cheque or warrant by the bank on which it is drawn shall constitute a good discharge to the Company notwithstanding that it may subsequently appear that the same has been stolen or that any endorsement thereon has been forged. Any one of two or more joint holders may give effectual receipts for any dividends or other moneys payable or property distributable in respect of the shares held by such joint holders.

140. All dividends or bonuses unclaimed for one (1) year after having been declared may be invested or otherwise made use of by the Board for the benefit of the Company until claimed. Any dividend or bonuses unclaimed after a period of six (6) years from the date of declaration shall be forfeited and shall revert to the Company. The payment by the Board of any unclaimed dividend or other sums payable on or in respect of a share into a separate account shall not constitute the Company a trustee in respect thereof. App-3
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141. Whenever the Board or the Company in general meeting has resolved that a dividend be paid or declared, the Board may further resolve that such dividend be satisfied wholly or in part by the distribution of specific assets of any kind and in particular of paid up shares, debentures or warrants to subscribe securities of the Company or any other company, or in any one or more of such ways, and where any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution the Board may settle the same as it thinks expedient, and in particular may issue certificates in respect of fractions of shares, disregard fractional entitlements or round the same up or down, and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets, or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Members upon the footing of the value so fixed in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such specific assets in trustees as may seem expedient to the Board and may appoint any person to sign any requisite instruments of transfer and other documents on behalf of the persons entitled to the dividend, and such appointment shall be effective and binding on the Members. The Board may resolve that no such assets shall be made available to Members with registered addresses in any particular territory or territories where, in the absence of a registration statement or other special formalities, such distribution of assets would or might, in the opinion of the Board, be unlawful or impracticable and in such event the only entitlement of the Members aforesaid shall be to receive cash payments as aforesaid. Members affected as a result of the foregoing sentence shall not be or be deemed to be a separate class of Members for any purpose whatsoever.
142. (1) Whenever the Board or the Company in general meeting has resolved that a dividend be paid or declared on any class of the share capital of the Company, the Board may further resolve either:
- (a) that such dividend be satisfied wholly or in part in the form of an allotment of shares credited as fully paid up, provided that the Members entitled thereto will be entitled to elect to receive such dividend (or part thereof if the Board so determines) in cash in lieu of such allotment. In such case, the following provisions shall apply:
 - (i) the basis of any such allotment shall be determined by the Board;

- (ii) the Board, after determining the basis of allotment, shall give not less than two (2) weeks' Notice to the holders of the relevant shares of the right of election accorded to them and shall send with such notice forms of election and specify the procedure to be followed and the place at which and the latest date and time by which duly completed forms of election must be lodged in order to be effective;
 - (iii) the right of election may be exercised in respect of the whole or part of that portion of the dividend in respect of which the right of election has been accorded; and
 - (iv) the dividend (or that part of the dividend to be satisfied by the allotment of shares as aforesaid) shall not be payable in cash on shares in respect whereof the cash election has not been duly exercised ("the non-elected shares") and in satisfaction thereof shares of the relevant class shall be allotted credited as fully paid up to the holders of the non-elected shares on the basis of allotment determined as aforesaid and for such purpose the Board shall capitalise and apply out of any part of the undivided profits of the Company (including profits carried and standing to the credit of any reserves or other special account, share premium account, capital redemption reserve other than the Subscription Rights Reserve (as defined below)) as the Board may determine, such sum as may be required to pay up in full the appropriate number of shares of the relevant class for allotment and distribution to and amongst the holders of the non-elected shares on such basis; or
- (b) that the Members entitled to such dividend shall be entitled to elect to receive an allotment of shares credited as fully paid up in lieu of the whole or such part of the dividend as the Board may think fit. In such case, the following provisions shall apply:
- (i) the basis of any such allotment shall be determined by the Board;
 - (ii) the Board, after determining the basis of allotment, shall give not less than two (2) weeks' Notice to the holders of the relevant shares of the right of election accorded to them and shall send with such notice forms of election and specify the procedure to be followed and the place at which and the latest date and time by which duly completed forms of election must be lodged in order to be effective;
 - (iii) the right of election may be exercised in respect of the whole or part of that portion of the dividend in respect of which the right of election has been accorded; and

- (iv) the dividend (or that part of the dividend in respect of which a right of election has been accorded) shall not be payable in cash on shares in respect whereof the share election has been duly exercised (“the elected shares”) and in lieu thereof shares of the relevant class shall be allotted credited as fully paid up to the holders of the elected shares on the basis of allotment determined as aforesaid and for such purpose the Board shall capitalise and apply out of any part of the undivided profits of the Company (including profits carried and standing to the credit of any reserves or other special account, share premium account, capital redemption reserve other than the Subscription Rights Reserve (as defined below)) as the Board may determine, such sum as may be required to pay up in full the appropriate number of shares of the relevant class for allotment and distribution to and amongst the holders of the elected shares on such basis.
- (2) (a) The shares allotted pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article shall rank *pari passu* in all respects with shares of the same class (if any) then in issue save only as regards participation in the relevant dividend or in any other distributions, bonuses or rights paid, made, declared or announced prior to or contemporaneously with the payment or declaration of the relevant dividend unless, contemporaneously with the announcement by the Board of their proposal to apply the provisions of sub-paragraph (a) or (b) of paragraph (1) of this Article in relation to the relevant dividend or contemporaneously with their announcement of the distribution, bonus or rights in question, the Board shall specify that the shares to be allotted pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article shall rank for participation in such distribution, bonus or rights.
- (b) The Board may do all acts and things considered necessary or expedient to give effect to any capitalisation pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, with full power to the Board to make such provisions as it thinks fit in the case of shares becoming distributable in fractions (including provisions whereby, in whole or in part, fractional entitlements are aggregated and sold and the net proceeds distributed to those entitled, or are disregarded or rounded up or down or whereby the benefit of fractional entitlements accrues to the Company rather than to the Members concerned). The Board may authorise any person to enter into on behalf of all Members interested, an agreement with the Company providing for such capitalisation and matters incidental thereto and any agreement made pursuant to such authority shall be effective and binding on all concerned.

- (3) The Company may upon the recommendation of the Board by ordinary resolution resolve in respect of any one particular dividend of the Company that notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article a dividend may be satisfied wholly in the form of an allotment of shares credited as fully paid up without offering any right to shareholders to elect to receive such dividend in cash in lieu of such allotment.
- (4) The Board may on any occasion determine that rights of election and the allotment of shares under paragraph (1) of this Article shall not be made available or made to any shareholders with registered addresses in any territory where, in the absence of a registration statement or other special formalities, the circulation of an offer of such rights of election or the allotment of shares would or might, in the opinion of the Board, be unlawful or impracticable, and in such event the provisions aforesaid shall be read and construed subject to such determination. Members affected as a result of the foregoing sentence shall not be or be deemed to be a separate class of Members for any purpose whatsoever.
- (5) Any resolution declaring a dividend on shares of any class, whether a resolution of the Company in general meeting or a resolution of the Board, may specify that the same shall be payable or distributable to the persons registered as the holders of such shares at the close of business on a particular date, notwithstanding that it may be a date prior to that on which the resolution is passed, and thereupon the dividend shall be payable or distributable to them in accordance with their respective holdings so registered, but without prejudice to the rights inter se in respect of such dividend of transferors and transferees of any such shares. The provisions of this Article shall *mutatis mutandis* apply to bonuses, capitalisation issues, distributions of realised capital profits or offers or grants made by the Company to the Members.

RESERVES

143. (1) The Board shall establish an account to be called the share premium account and shall carry to the credit of such account from time to time a sum equal to the amount or value of the premium paid on the issue of any share in the Company. Unless otherwise provided by the provisions of these Articles, the Board may apply the share premium account in any manner permitted by the Law Act. The Company shall at all times comply with the provisions of the Law Act in relation to the share premium account.

- (2) Before recommending any dividend, the Board may set aside out of the profits of the Company such sums as it determines as reserves which shall, at the discretion of the Board, be applicable for any purpose to which the profits of the Company may be properly applied and pending such application may, also at such discretion, either be employed in the business of the Company or be invested in such investments as the Board may from time to time think fit and so that it shall not be necessary to keep any investments constituting the reserve or reserves separate or distinct from any other investments of the Company. The Board may also without placing the same to reserve carry forward any profits which it may think prudent not to distribute.

CAPITALISATION

144. (1) The Company may, upon the recommendation of the Board, at any time and from time to time pass an ordinary resolution to the effect that it is desirable to capitalise all or any part of any amount for the time being standing to the credit of any reserve or fund (including a share premium account and capital redemption reserve and the profit and loss account) whether or not the same is available for distribution and accordingly that such amount be set free for distribution among the Members or any class of Members who would be entitled thereto if it were distributed by way of dividend and in the same proportions, on the footing that the same is not paid in cash but is applied either in or towards paying up the amounts for the time being unpaid on any shares in the Company held by such Members respectively or in paying up in full unissued shares, debentures or other obligations of the Company, to be allotted and distributed credited as fully paid up among such Members, or partly in one way and partly in the other, and the Board shall give effect to such resolution provided that, for the purposes of this Article, a share premium account and any capital redemption reserve or fund representing unrealised profits, may be applied only in paying up in full unissued shares of the Company to be allotted to such Members credited as fully paid.

- (2) Notwithstanding any provisions in these Articles, the Board may resolve to capitalise all or any part of any amount for the time being standing to the credit of any reserve or fund (including a share premium account and the profit and loss account) whether or not the same is available for distribution by applying such sum in paying up unissued shares to be allotted to (i) employees (including directors) of the Company and/or its affiliates (meaning any individual, corporation, partnership, association, joint-stock company, trust, unincorporated association or other entity (other than the Company) that directly, or indirectly through one or more intermediaries, controls, is controlled by or is under common control with, the Company) upon exercise or vesting of any options or awards granted under any share incentive scheme or employee benefit scheme or other arrangement which relates to such persons that has been adopted or approved by the Members at a general meeting, or (ii) any trustee of any trust to whom shares are to be allotted and issued by the Company in connection with the operation of any share incentive scheme or employee benefit scheme or other arrangement which relates to such persons that has been adopted or approved by the Members at a general meeting.

145. The Board may settle, as it considers appropriate, any difficulty arising in regard to any distribution under the last preceding Article and in particular may issue certificates in respect of fractions of shares or authorise any person to sell and transfer any fractions or may resolve that the distribution should be as nearly as may be practicable in the correct proportion but not exactly so or may ignore fractions altogether, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Members in order to adjust the rights of all parties, as may seem expedient to the Board. The Board may appoint any person to sign on behalf of the persons entitled to participate in the distribution any contract necessary or desirable for giving effect thereto and such appointment shall be effective and binding upon the Members.

SUBSCRIPTION RIGHTS RESERVE

146. The following provisions shall have effect to the extent that they are not prohibited by and are in compliance with the ~~Law~~Act:
- (1) If, so long as any of the rights attached to any warrants issued by the Company to subscribe for shares of the Company shall remain exercisable, the Company does any act or engages in any transaction which, as a result of any adjustments to the subscription price in accordance with the provisions of the conditions of the warrants, would reduce the subscription price to below the par value of a share, then the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) as from the date of such act or transaction the Company shall establish and thereafter (subject as provided in this Article) maintain in accordance with the provisions of this Article a reserve (the “Subscription Rights Reserve”) the amount of which shall at no time be less than the sum which for the time being would be required to be capitalised and applied in paying up in full the nominal amount of the additional shares required to be issued and allotted credited as fully paid pursuant to sub- paragraph (c) below on the exercise in full of all the subscription rights outstanding and shall apply the Subscription Rights Reserve in paying up such additional shares in full as and when the same are allotted;
- (b) the Subscription Rights Reserve shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified above unless all other reserves of the Company (other than share premium account) have been extinguished and will then only be used to make good losses of the Company if and so far as is required by law;
- (c) upon the exercise of all or any of the subscription rights represented by any warrant, the relevant subscription rights shall be exercisable in respect of a nominal amount of shares equal to the amount in cash which the holder of such warrant is required to pay on exercise of the subscription rights represented thereby (or, as the case may be the relevant portion thereof in the event of a partial exercise of the subscription rights) and, in addition, there shall be allotted in respect of such subscription rights to the exercising warrant holder, credited as fully paid, such additional nominal amount of shares as is equal to the difference between:
 - (i) the said amount in cash which the holder of such warrant is required to pay on exercise of the subscription rights represented thereby (or, as the case may be, the relevant portion thereof in the event of a partial exercise of the subscription rights); and
 - (ii) the nominal amount of shares in respect of which such subscription rights would have been exercisable having regard to the provisions of the conditions of the warrants, had it been possible for such subscription rights to represent the right to subscribe for shares at less than par and immediately upon such exercise so much of the sum standing to the credit of the Subscription Rights Reserve as is required to pay up in full such additional nominal amount of shares shall be capitalised and applied in paying up in full such additional nominal amount of shares which shall forthwith be allotted credited as fully paid to the exercising warrant holders; and

- (d) if, upon the exercise of the subscription rights represented by any warrant, the amount standing to the credit of the Subscription Rights Reserve is not sufficient to pay up in full such additional nominal amount of shares equal to such difference as aforesaid to which the exercising warrant holder is entitled, the Board shall apply any profits or reserves then or thereafter becoming available (including, to the extent permitted by law, share premium account) for such purpose until such additional nominal amount of shares is paid up and allotted as aforesaid and until then no dividend or other distribution shall be paid or made on the fully paid shares of the Company then in issue. Pending such payment and allotment, the exercising warrant holder shall be issued by the Company with a certificate evidencing his right to the allotment of such additional nominal amount of shares. The rights represented by any such certificate shall be in registered form and shall be transferable in whole or in part in units of one share in the like manner as the shares for the time being are transferable, and the Company shall make such arrangements in relation to the maintenance of a register therefor and other matters in relation thereto as the Board may think fit and adequate particulars thereof shall be made known to each relevant exercising warrant holder upon the issue of such certificate.
- (2) Shares allotted pursuant to the provisions of this Article shall rank *pari passu* in all respects with the other shares allotted on the relevant exercise of the subscription rights represented by the warrant concerned. Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (1) of this Article, no fraction of any share shall be allotted on exercise of the subscription rights.
- (3) The provision of this Article as to the establishment and maintenance of the Subscription Rights Reserve shall not be altered or added to in any way which would vary or abrogate, or which would have the effect of varying or abrogating the provisions for the benefit of any warrant holder or class of warrant holders under this Article without the sanction of a special resolution of such warrant holders or class of warrant holders.
- (4) A certificate or report by the ~~auditors~~ Auditors ~~for the time being of the Company~~ as to whether or not the Subscription Rights Reserve is required to be established and maintained and if so the amount thereof so required to be established and maintained, as to the purposes for which the Subscription Rights Reserve has been used, as to the extent to which it has been used to make good losses of the Company, as to the additional nominal amount of shares required to be allotted to exercising warrant holders credited as fully paid, and as to any other matter concerning the Subscription Rights Reserve shall (in the absence of manifest error) be conclusive and binding upon the Company and all warrant holders and shareholders.

ACCOUNTING RECORDS

147. The Board shall cause true accounts to be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Company, and the matters in respect of which such receipt and expenditure take place, and of the property, assets, credits and liabilities of the Company and of all other matters required by the ~~Law~~Act or necessary to give a true and fair view of the Company's affairs and to explain its transactions. 148. The accounting records shall be kept at the Office or, at such other place or places as the Board decides and shall always be open to inspection by the Directors. No Member (other than a Director) shall have any right of inspecting any accounting record or book or document of the Company except as conferred by law or authorised by the Board or the Company in general meeting.

Subject to Article 150, a printed copy of the Directors' report, accompanied by the balance sheet and profit and loss account, including every document required by law to be annexed thereto, made up to the end of the applicable financial year and containing a summary of the assets and liabilities of the Company under convenient heads and a statement of income and expenditure, together with a copy of the Auditors' report, shall be sent to each person entitled thereto at least twenty-one (21) days before the date of the general meeting and at the same time as the notice of annual general meeting and laid before the Company at the annual general meeting held in accordance with Article 56 provided that this Article shall not require a copy of those documents to be sent to any person whose address the Company is not aware or to more than one of the joint holders of any shares or debentures. 163.
