PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES, PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS AND NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

1. INTRODUCTION

The primary purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM and to give you notice of the AGM. Resolutions to be proposed at the AGM include, inter alia, (a) ordinary resolutions on the proposed grant of each of the Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate; and (b) ordinary resolutions relating to the proposed re-election of the Directors.

2. PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed that the Directors be granted the Issue Mandate, i.e. a general and unconditional mandate to allot, issue and deal with new Shares up to 20% of the aggregate number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution. As at the Latest Practicable Date, a total of 225,420,034 Shares were in issue. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution granting the Issue Mandate to the Directors and on the basis that no Shares will be issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Issue Mandate to issue a maximum of 45,084,006 Shares.

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will also be proposed to give the Directors the Repurchase Mandate, i.e. a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all powers of the Company to repurchase, on the Stock Exchange, or on any other stock exchange on which the Shares may be listed, Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution. In addition, an ordinary resolution regarding the Extension Mandate will be proposed at the AGM to authorise the increase in the total number of new Shares which may be allotted and issued under the Issue Mandate by an additional number representing such number of Shares actually repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate.

The Repurchase Mandate and the Issue Mandate would expire at the earliest of: (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles of Association or by any applicable law or Companies Law to be held; or (c) when revoked or varied by ordinary resolution(s) of the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company prior to the next annual general meeting of the Company.

Under the Listing Rules, the Company is required to give to its Shareholders all information which is reasonably necessary to enable Shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution in respect of the Repurchase Mandate at the AGM. An explanatory statement for such purpose is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

3. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

(a) The Board currently consists of eleven Directors, namely Mr. Chua Nai Tuen (Chairman and Managing Director), Mr. Nelson Junior Chua, Mr. Richard Sy Tan, Mr. Chan Man Hon Eric, Mr. Jimmy Siy Tiong, Mr. Tsai Han Yung, Ms. Vivian Chua, Mr. Chan Siu Ting, Mr. James L. Kwok, Mr. Tsui Ka Wah and Dr. Luk Siu Chuen.

(b) Pursuant to Article 103(A) of the Articles of Association of the Company, Mr. Nelson Junior Chua, Mr. Chan Man Hon, Eric, Mr. Jimmy Siy Tiong and Mr. Chan Siu Ting shall retire by rotation at the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

Pursuant to Article 94 of the Articles of Association of the Company, Mr. Richard Sy Tan and Dr. Luk Siu Chuen shall also retire at the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

(c) Biographical information of each of the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

4. AGM

A notice convening the AGM is set out on pages 17 to 21 of this circular.

A proxy form for the AGM is enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you are able to attend the AGM, you are requested to complete the accompanying proxy form in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return it to the Company's place of business at Units 407–410, 4th Floor, Tower 2, Silvercord, No. 30 Canton Road, Tsimshatsui, Kowloon, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the AGM or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the proxy form shall not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjourned meeting thereof should you so wish.

5. VOTING BY POLL

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, voting by the Shareholders at the AGM will be by poll. Therefore, the chairman of the AGM will demand a poll for each and every resolution put forward at the AGM pursuant to the Articles of Association. The Company will appoint scrutineers to handle votetaking procedures at the AGM.

6. **RECOMMENDATION**

The Board considers that the ordinary resolutions to be proposed at the AGM are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole and recommends the Shareholders to vote in favour of such resolutions at the AGM.

7. GENERAL INFORMATION

The English text of this circular shall prevail over the Chinese text.

APPENDIX I

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide the Shareholders with all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to approve the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors.

1. LISTING RULES RELATING TO THE REPURCHASE OF SHARES

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listings are on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their securities on the Stock Exchange and any other stock exchange on which securities of the company are listed and such exchange is recognised by the SFC and the Stock Exchange, subject to certain restrictions. Among such restrictions, the Listing Rules provide that the shares of such company must be fully paid up and all repurchases of shares by such company must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of shareholders, either by way of a general mandate or by specific approval of a particular transaction.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were a total of 225,420,034 Shares in issue.

Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 22,542,003 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of issued shares of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

3. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

APPENDIX I

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases made pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate will be funded out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company's memorandum of association, the Articles of Association, the Companies Law, other applicable laws of Hong Kong and the Listing Rules. A listed company is prohibited from repurchasing its own securities on the Stock Exchange for a consideration other than cash or for settlement otherwise than in accordance with the trading rules of the Stock Exchange from time to time. Under the Companies Law, repurchases by the Company may only be made out of the profits of the Company or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose, or, if so authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the provisions of the Companies Law, out of capital. Any premium payable on a redemption or purchase over the par value of the Shares to be purchased must be provided for out of profits of the Company, or, if so authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the provisions of the Company, or, if so authorised by the Articles of Association to the provided for out of profits of the Company, or, if so authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the provisions of the Company, or, if so authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the provisions of the Companies Law, out of capital.

5. GENERAL

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital and/or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position as at 31 March 2023, being the date up to which its latest published audited consolidated financial statements were made, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate were to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

7. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases under the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws and regulations of Hong Kong and in accordance with the regulations set out in the memorandum of association of the Company and the Articles of Association.

8. DIRECTORS, CLOSE ASSOCIATES AND CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company under the Repurchase Mandate if the same is approved by the Shareholders. No core connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company has notified the Company that he/she/it has a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

9. THE TAKEOVERS CODE AND MINIMUM PUBLIC HOLDING

If as a result of a share repurchase made pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert (as defined in the Takeovers Code) could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best knowledge and belief of the Directors, Mr. Chua Nai Tuen (together with his parties acting in concert (as defined under the Takeovers code)) was interested and deemed to be interested (as applicable) in 102,189,675 Shares, representing an approximate total of 45.33% of the number of existing issued Shares. In the event that the Directors should exercise in full the Repurchase Mandate, Mr. Chua Nai Tuen's (together with his parties acting in concert) interests in the Company will be increased to 50.37% of the number of issued Shares. To the best knowledge and belief of the Directors, such increase in the interests in the Company would give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under the Takeovers Code.

The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would give rise to such obligation. The Directors are not aware of any consequence which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a consequence of any repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that will result in the number of Shares held in the hands of the public falling below the prescribed minimum percentage of 25%.

10. SHARE PURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company had not repurchased any of the Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months immediately preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

Set out below are the additional details of the Retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM:

Mr. Nelson Junior Chua, aged 44, was appointed as a Non-executive Director of the Company on 15 April 2008 and was re-designated as an Executive Director on 16 July 2010. He has been appointed as an Authorised Representative of the Company with effect from 1 April 2014. He is also the Director of other companies in the Group. Mr. Chua has over 15 years' experience in financial information analysis and research. He graduated from the Queen Mary & Westfield College in United Kingdom and obtained a Bachelor's degree in Molecular Biology. He is the son of Mr. Chua Nai Tuen, an executive director, controlling shareholder and substantial shareholder of the Company. He is also the brother of Mr. Gilson Chua, a member of senior management of the Group.

So far as the Directors are aware, as at 21 July 2023 (being the latest practicable date for determining the relevant information), Mr. Chua had interest (within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance) in 6,954,391 shares of the Company. He is receiving from the Company a Director's fee at such rate as from time to time approved by the Shareholders, currently being HK\$30,000 per annum. The Director's fee is regularly reviewed and compared with other listed companies in Hong Kong. Furthermore, he also receives from the Company's subsidiary a total amount of emoluments of HK\$1,103,917 per annum. Such amount of emoluments ties with his duties and responsibilities within the Group and it was determined by the Company as a reasonable amount. No service contract has been entered into between Mr. Chua and the Company. The term of office of Mr. Chua is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the AGM in accordance with the Articles of Association.

Mr. Chan Man Hon, Eric, aged 66, was first appointed as an Independent Non-executive Director of the Company in 1994 and was re-designated as a Non-executive Director in 2005. Mr. Chan is a member of the Audit Committee, the Remuneration Committee and the Nomination Committee of the Company. Mr. Chan is a practising solicitor in Hong Kong. He obtained a Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of Hong Kong and was admitted as a solicitor in Hong Kong in 1981. He was further admitted as a solicitor in England and Australia in 1984 and 1985 respectively. He is a consultant of Vincent T. K. Cheung, Yap & Co. Mr. Chan do not have any relationships with any other directors or senior management or any substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

So far as the Directors are aware, as at 21 July 2023 (being the latest practicable date for determining the relevant information), Mr. Chan had no interest (within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance) in shares of the Company. He is receiving from the Company a Director's fee at such rate as from time to time approved by the Shareholders, currently being HK\$60,000 per annum. The Director's fee is regularly reviewed and compared

with other listed companies in Hong Kong. No service contract has been entered into between Mr. Chan and the Company. The term of office of Mr. Chan is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the AGM in accordance with the Articles of Association.

Mr. Jimmy Siy Tiong, aged 86, was appointed as a Non-executive Director of the Company in 1978. Mr. Siy was the former President of Sanyo Philippines Inc., a company incorporated in the Philippines. Messrs. Chua Nai Tuen, Jimmy Siy Tiong and Tsai Han Yung are brothers. They are all directors of the Company and Mr. Chua Nai Tuen is also the controlling shareholder and substantial shareholder of the Company.

So far as the Directors are aware, as at 21 July 2023 (being the latest practicable date for determining the relevant information), Mr. Siy had interest (within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance) in 3,770,987 shares of the Company. He is receiving from the Company a Director's fee at such rate as from time to time approved by the Shareholders, currently being HK\$30,000 per annum. The Director's fee is regularly reviewed and compared with other listed companies in Hong Kong. No service contract has been entered into between Mr. Siy and the Company. The term of office of Mr. Siy is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the AGM in accordance with the Articles of Association.

Mr. Chan Siu Ting, aged 71, was appointed as an Independent Non-executive Director of the Company in 2006. Mr. Chan is the Chairman of the Audit Committee and a member of the Remuneration Committee and the Nomination Committee of the Company. Mr. Chan has been practising as a Certified Public Accountant in Hong Kong for over 30 years. He is a fellow member of The Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and The Association of Chartered Certified Accountants and a member of The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales. He is currently a Director of Wong Chan Lau C.P.A. Company Limited, Certified Public Accountants (Practising). Mr. Chan does not have any relationships with any other directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

So far as the Directors are aware, as at 21 July 2023 (being the latest practicable date for determining the relevant information), Mr. Chan had no interest (within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance) in shares of the Company. He is receiving from the Company a Director's fee at such rate as from time to time approved by the Shareholders, currently being HK\$65,000 per annum. The Director's fee is regularly reviewed and compared with other listed companies in Hong Kong. No service contract has been entered into between Mr. Chan and the Company. The term of office of Mr. Chan is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the AGM in accordance with the Articles of Association.

Mr. Chan has served on the Board for more than nine years. He brings a wide range of skills, expertise and experience to the Group. The Nomination Committee had evaluated his performance and professional qualifications and is of the view that he has provided valuable contributions to the Company and has demonstrated his abilities to provide independent, balanced and objective view to the Company's affairs. The Company has received the annual confirmation from Mr. Chan confirming his independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules of the Stock Exchange. The Board considers that the long service of Mr. Chan would not affect his exercise of independent judgment, and, therefore considers him to be independent and recommends him to be re-elected.

Mr. Richard Sy Tan, aged 44, was appointed as an Executive Director of the Company on 26 August 2022. Mr. Tan has over 20 years of architecture experience in construction projects in Philippines and Hong Kong. Mr. Tan obtained a bachelor of science in architecture from Mapua Institute of Technology and a bachelor of science in interior design from Philippine School of Interior Design. He is a licensed architect and interior designer of the Republic of the Philippines Professional Regulation Commission. He is currently a freelance architect involved in planning and designing various residential and commercial developments. Mr. Tan is the son-in-law of Mr. Chua Nai Tuen who is an executive director, controlling shareholder and substantial shareholder of the Company. He is the brother-in-law of Messrs. Nelson Junior Chua and Gilson Chua. Mr. Nelson Junior Chua is an executive director of the Company and Mr. Gilson Chua is the member of senior management of the Group.

So far as the Directors are aware, as at 21 July 2023 (being the latest practicable date for determining the relevant information), Mr. Tan is deemed to be interested in 1,000,000 shares of the Company held by his spouse, Ms. Monica Joyce Chua. He is receiving from the Company a Director's fee at such rate from time to time approved by the Shareholders, currently being HK\$30,000 per annum. The Director's fee is regularly reviewed and compared with other listed companies in Hong Kong. Furthermore, he also receives from the Company's subsidiary a total amount of emoluments of HK\$1,014,000 per annum. Such amount of emoluments ties with his duties and responsibilities within the Group and it was determined by the Company as a reasonable amount. Mr. Tan entered his service contract with the Company on 26 August 2022 for a term of three years commencing from 26 August 2022, subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the AGM in accordance with the Articles of Association.

Dr. Luk Siu Chuen, aged 45, was appointed as an Independent Non-executive Director of the Company on 26 August 2022. Dr. Luk has over 20 years of town planning experience. In 2002, he joined Lawson David & Sung Surveyors Limited as an assistant town planner and was subsequently promoted to senior town planner, handling a wide range of town planning, surveying, and real estate consultancy work, from August 2002 to July 2007. He then worked as an assistant

manager which led and supervised the planning and lands team in Dudley Surveyors Limited from August 2008 to February 2010, where he provided town planning as well as surveying and land administration services on various planning and lands projects.

Since July 2010, Dr. Luk has been the managing director at Aikon Development Consultancy Limited, to continue providing town planning as well as surveying and land administration services. In addition, Dr. Luk serves to provide a full range of real estate consultancy services to property owners, including services on applications to the Hong Kong Government, project coordination and management with professional teams, strategic advice on development and redevelopment potentials and liaison with Government officers.

Dr. Luk obtained a master degree in town and country planning with honours from the University of Manchester in the United Kingdom in June 2002. He has been a Member of the Royal Town Planning Institute in the United Kingdom since October 2004 and a Registered Professional Planner of Planners Registration Board in Hong Kong since June 2005. Dr. Luk has also been a holder of an Estate Agent (Individual) Licence, issued by the Estate Agents Authority in Hong Kong, since December 2010. He has been an Ordinary Member of the Hong Kong Institute of Real Estate Administrators since November 2011 and became the member of Hong Kong Institute of Certified Property Managers (formerly known as Greater China Institute of Property Management) in March 2017. In August 2021, Dr. Luk obtained the qualification as Registered Planner to practice in Qianhai Shenzhen Hongkong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone of Shenzhen. In November 2022, he further became a full member of Hong Kong Institute of Planners and at the same time was conferred with an honorary Doctorate of Business Administration by College de Paris in France.
