

PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS AND PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATES TO REPURCHASE SHARES AND TO ISSUE SHARES AND PROPOSED RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR AND NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of certain resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to be held on Friday, June 21, 2024 for (i) the re-election of Directors; (ii) the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate; (iii) the granting of the Issuance Mandate and the extension of the Issuance Mandate granted to the Directors to issue and allot the Shares repurchased by the Company under the Share Repurchase Mandate; (iv) the re-appointment of auditor; and (v) to give you notice of the Annual General Meeting at which resolutions will be proposed for the Shareholders to consider and, if thought fit, approve the aforesaid matters.

2. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

In accordance with Articles 108 and 112 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Li Yunfeng, Mr. Tao Jing, Dr. Hou Sheng, Dr. Qian Weizhu and Mr. Leung, Louis Ho Ming, shall retire at the Annual General Meeting. All of the above Directors, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

APPENDIX II EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE SHARE REPURCHASE MANDATE

The following is an explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting in relation to the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

The Directors are not aware of any consequences which may give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.
