INTRODUCTION

The purposes of this circular are to: (i) provide you with details of the proposed Issue Mandate and the proposed Buy-back Mandate; (ii) set out an explanatory statement regarding the Buy-back Mandate; (iii) furnish you with details of the proposed re-election of Directors; and (iv) give you notice of the AGM.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE NEW SHARES AND BUY BACK SHARES

The Company's existing mandates to issue and buy back Shares was approved by its then Shareholders on 16 June 2023. Unless otherwise renewed, the existing mandates to issue and buy back Shares will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM.

Ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the AGM to grant to the Directors new general mandates:

- (i) to allot, issue and otherwise deal with new Shares with an aggregate number not exceeding 20% of the aggregate number of the issued shares of the Company as at the date of passing the proposed resolution at the AGM; and
- (ii) to buy back Shares with an aggregate number not exceeding 10% of the aggregate number of the issued shares of the Company as at the date of passing the proposed resolution at the AGM.

In addition, a separate ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM to add to the Issue Mandate for those Shares bought back by the Company pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate (if granted to the Directors at the AGM).

The Directors have no present intention to exercise the Issue Mandate or the Buy-back Mandate (if granted to the Directors at the AGM).

As at the Latest Practicable Date, a total of 600,000,000 Shares were in issue. The biographical details of the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

The Nomination Committee of the Company has reviewed and assessed the annual confirmation of independence of each of the independent non-executive Directors based on the independence criteria as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and formed the view that all of them remain independent. Pursuant to code provision B.2.3 of the Corporate Governance Code as set out in Appendix C1 of the Listing Rules, any further appointment of independent non-executive director serving more than nine years should be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by shareholders. Mr. Wang Ping has served the Company for more than nine years. As an independent non-executive Director with extensive experience and knowledge and in-depth understanding of the Company's operations and business, Mr. Wang Ping has expressed objective views and given independent guidance to the Company over the past years. He continues demonstrating a firm commitment to his role. The nomination committee of the Company and the Board considered that his long service would not affect his exercise of independent judgment and was satisfied that Mr. Wang Ping has the required integrity and experience to continue fulfilling the role of an independent non-executive Director and consider Mr. Wang Ping to be independent.

The Nomination Committee has also considered the skills, knowledge and professional experience of the independent non-executive Director as described in his biographies set out in Appendix II to this circular, having regard to the Company's Board Diversity Policy and is of the view that Mr. Wang Ping will continue to bring valuable business experience, knowledge and professionalism to the Board for its efficient and effective functioning and diversity.

This appendix includes an explanatory statement required by the Stock Exchange to be presented to the Shareholders concerning the Buy-back Mandate proposed to be granted to the Directors in the AGM.

1. LISTING RULES FOR BUY BACK OF SHARES

The Listing Rules permit companies with a primary listing on the Stock Exchange to buy back their shares on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions.

The Listing Rules provide that all such proposed buy back of shares must be approved by shareholders in advance by an ordinary resolution at a general meeting, either by way of a general mandate or by a specific approval of a particular transaction and that the shares to be bought back must be fully paid up.

2. FUNDING AND IMPACT OF BUY BACK OF SHARES

Any buying back of Shares will be made out of funds which are legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Memorandum and Articles, the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands. As compared with the financial position of the Company as at 31 December 2023 (being the date to which the latest audited accounts of the Company have been made up), the Directors consider that there would not be a material adverse impact on the working capital and on the gearing position of the Company in the event that the proposed buying back of Shares were to be carried out in full during the proposed buy-back period.

The Directors do not propose to exercise the Buy-back Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital of the Company or the gearing position which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

3. REASONS FOR SHARES BUY BACK

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Directors to buy back Shares on the market. Subject to the passing of the relevant ordinary resolutions to approve the general mandates to issue and buy back Shares and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or bought back between the Latest Practicable Date and the AGM, the Directors would be authorised to exercise the powers of the Company to buy back a maximum of 60,000,000 Shares.

5. UNDERTAKING OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the Buy-back Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands and in accordance with the Memorandum and Articles. Neither the explanatory statement nor the proposed share repurchase has any unusual features.

6. EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a buying back of Shares pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (as defined in the Takeovers Code), depending on the level of increase of the shareholder's interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.
