INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to, among other things, (i) the re-election of Directors; and (ii) the granting to the Directors of general mandates to issue securities of the Company and repurchase Shares up to 20% and 10% respectively of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of the passing of such resolutions.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Board consists of ten (10) Directors, namely Mr. Arthur George Dew, Mr. Akihiro Nagahara, Mr. Lee Seng Hui, Mr. Edwin Lo King Yau, Mr. Mak Pak Hung, Ms. Lee Su Hwei, Mr. David Craig Bartlett, Mr. Alan Stephen Jones, Ms. Lisa Yang Lai Sum and Mr. Kelvin Chau Kwok Wing.

Pursuant to Article 105(A) of the Articles of Association, at each annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office such that each Director (including those appointed for a specific term) will be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three (3) years at the annual general meeting, provided always that any Director appointed pursuant to Article 96 of the Articles of Association shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting. The Directors to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election but as between persons who became Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree between themselves) be determined by lot. The retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election. Pursuant to Article 96 of the Articles of Association, the Board shall have power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the Board. Any Director so appointed shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting of the Company, and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Pursuant to Article 105(A) of the Articles of Association, Messrs. Arthur George Dew, Lee Seng Hui, David Craig Bartlett and Kelvin Chau Kwok Wing shall retire from office by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

Further, pursuant to the code provision B.2.3 of Part 2 of the Corporate Governance Code under Appendix C1 of the Listing Rules, if an independent non-executive director has served more than nine (9) years, his/her further appointment should be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by shareholders.

Mr. David Craig Bartlett has served as an INED for more than nine (9) years. The Company has received from Mr. Bartlett an annual confirmation of independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and the nomination committee of the Company has assessed his independence. In the process of assessing the independence of Mr. Bartlett, the nomination committee of the Company has considered (i) the factors under Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules; (ii) whether Mr. Bartlett is capable of bringing fresh perspectives and independent judgment to the Board despite his familiarity with the Company's affairs and management; and (iii) the fact that Mr. Bartlett did not have any management role in the Group nor any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company. Based on the above criteria and upon due deliberation, the nomination committee of the Company considered that Mr. Bartlett had exercised impartial judgment and given independent guidance to the Company during his tenure of office, and his long service would not affect his ability to bring fresh perspectives and the exercise of independent judgment in his independent scope of work. As such, the nomination committee of the Company is satisfied that Mr. Bartlett is able to continue to independently fulfill his role as an INED and recommends the same to the Board. The Board concurs with the view of the nomination committee of the Company and therefore recommends the re-election of Mr. Bartlett as an INED notwithstanding the fact that he has served the Company for more than nine (9) years.

Article 109 of the Articles of Association provides that no person other than a retiring Director, shall, unless recommended by the Board for election, be eligible for election to the office of Director at any general meeting, unless notice in writing of the intention to propose that person for election as a Director and notice in writing by that person of his willingness to be elected shall have been given to the Company during the period commencing no earlier than the day after the despatch of the notice of the general meeting appointed for such election and ending no later than seven (7) days prior to the date of such general meeting.

Accordingly, if a Shareholder wishes to nominate a person to stand for election as a Director at the AGM, notice in writing of his/her intention to propose such person for election as a Director and the notice in writing executed by the nominee of his willingness to be elected must be validly served at the registered office of the Company at 22nd Floor, Allied Kajima Building, 138 Gloucester Road, Wanchai, Hong Kong on or before Wednesday, 22nd May, 2024.

Pursuant to Rule 13.74 of the Listing Rules, a listed issuer shall disclose the details required under Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules of any directors proposed to be re-elected or proposed new director in the notice or accompanying circular to its shareholders of the relevant general meeting, if such re-election or appointment is subject to shareholders' approval at that relevant general meeting.

Brief biographical details of the retiring Directors who are proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix I to this circular. If a valid notice from a Shareholder to propose a person to stand for election as a Director at the AGM is received after the printing of this circular, the Company will issue a supplementary circular to inform the Shareholders of the details of the additional candidate proposed.

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE SECURITIES AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 2nd June, 2023, ordinary resolutions were passed for the granting of general mandates to the Directors (i) to allot, issue or otherwise deal with additional securities of the Company up to 20% of the total number of Shares in issue as at that date (“Existing Issue Mandate”), being 702,736,872 Shares; and (ii) to repurchase Shares up to 10% of the total number of Shares in issue as at that date (“Existing Repurchase Mandate”), being 351,368,436 Shares.

The Existing Issue Mandate and the Existing Repurchase Mandate will expire upon the conclusion of the AGM. The Directors consider that the Existing Issue Mandate and the Existing Repurchase Mandate increase the flexibility in dealing of the Company’s affairs and are in the interests of both the Company and the Shareholders as a whole, and that the same shall continue to be adopted by the Company.

New general mandates to allot, issue or otherwise deal with additional securities of the Company up to 20% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing the resolution as set out in Resolution No. 4(A) of the notice of AGM will be proposed at the AGM. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the proposed mandate to issue securities of the Company and on the basis that the total number of Shares in issue of the Company remains unchanged on the date of the AGM, the Company will be allowed under such mandate to issue a maximum of 702,736,872 Shares, representing 20% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date. The biographical details of the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out as follows:

Mr. Arthur George Dew, aged 82, Chairman of the Company since January 2007, was appointed an INED in December 1995 and re-designated as a Non-Executive Director of the Company in July 2002. Mr. Dew is also a director of certain subsidiaries of the Company. He graduated from the Law School of the University of Sydney, Australia, and was admitted as a solicitor and later as a barrister of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, Australia. He is currently a non-practising barrister. He has a broad range of corporate and business experience and has served as a director, and in some instances chairman of the board of directors, of a number of public companies listed in Australia, Hong Kong and elsewhere. He is the chairman and a non-executive director of each of APAC Resources Limited (“APAC”) and Dragon Mining Limited. He is also the non-executive chairman and a non-executive director of Tanami Gold NL (“Tanami Gold”) and retired as a non-executive director of Tian An Australia Limited (“TIA”) with effect from the close of its annual general meeting held on 19th May, 2023. TIA and Tanami Gold are companies listed on the Australian Securities Exchange. He was previously a non-executive director of SHK Hong Kong Industries Limited (a company previously listed on the Stock Exchange until 22nd April, 2021). Save as disclosed above, Mr. Dew did not hold any other directorship in listed public companies in Hong Kong or overseas during the past three years. Mr. Dew was previously a non-executive director in around 1980 of an Australian agricultural company known as New England Agricultural Corp. Ltd. which entered into a scheme of arrangement (“Scheme”) with its creditors and shareholders in around 1980 at a time when Mr. Dew was a non-executive director. Insofar as Mr. Dew can recollect, the approximate value involved in the Scheme was approximately AUD\$2 million and the Scheme was completed in around 1981.

Limited (“SHK”) and Tian An China Investments Company Limited (“TACI”), subsidiaries of the Company, via the management service agreement between these companies and the Company; and (iii) his positions in APAC, an associate of the Company. The remuneration of Mr. Dew was determined with reference to the recommendation of the remuneration committee of the Board, the prevailing market conditions and the terms of the Company’s remuneration policy.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Dew did not have any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company nor had he any interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date.

There are no other matters or information in relation to Mr. Dew’s re-election that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders or to be disclosed pursuant to paragraphs (h) to (v) of Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules.

Mr. Lee Seng Hui, aged 55, Chief Executive of the Company since January 1998, was appointed a Non-Executive Director of the Company in July 1992 and became an Executive Director of the Company in December 1993. Mr. Lee is also a director of certain subsidiaries of the Company. He graduated from the Law School of the University of Sydney with Honours. Previously, he worked with Baker & McKenzie and N M Rothschild & Sons (Hong Kong) Limited. Mr. Lee is the chairman and a non-executive director of TACI and a non-executive director of APAC. Mr. Lee has been appointed the chairman and a non-executive director of China Medical & HealthCare Group Limited in October 2023. He is also the non-executive chairman of Mount Gibson Iron Limited, a company listed on the Australian Securities Exchange. Mr. Lee is a brother of Ms. Lee Su Hwei (a Non-Executive Director of the Company). Save as disclosed above, Mr. Lee did not hold any other directorship in listed public companies in Hong Kong or overseas during the past three years.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Lee had a personal interests in 458,420 Shares, and Mr. Lee, Ms. Lee Su Hwei (a Non-Executive Director of the Company and the sister of Mr. Lee) and Mr. Lee Seng Huang are the trustees of Lee and Lee Trust, being a discretionary trust, which indirectly held 2,634,646,760 Shares. The Lee and Lee Trust controlled approximately 74.99% of the total number of Shares in issue (inclusive of Mr. Lee's personal interests) as at the Latest Practicable Date. Mr. Lee was therefore deemed to have an interest in the above Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

An employment contract which forms the basis of emoluments including provision of an accommodation has been entered into between the Company and Mr. Lee pursuant to which he is entitled to receive (i) a monthly salary of HK\$335,000 together with an accommodation in rental value of HK\$300,000 per month with a management fee of HK\$33,545 per month during the period from 15th February, 2024 to 14th February, 2026; (ii) a discretionary bonus which is based on the performance of the Company; and (iii) a thirteen-month salary payment that is made each December in respect of that year. He will have no designated length of service with the Company but will be subject to retirement and re-election at the annual general meetings of the Company in accordance with the Articles of Association or any other applicable laws from time to time whereby he shall vacate his office. The remuneration of Mr. Lee was determined with reference to the recommendation of the remuneration committee of the Board, the prevailing market conditions and the terms of the Company's remuneration policy.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Lee did not have any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company nor had he any interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date.

Mr. David Craig Bartlett, aged 58, was appointed an INED in December 1999. A former partner of the international law firm Clyde & Co., he regularly acted for and advised the Company and its subsidiaries before leaving private practice for a career in industry. Now based primarily in England, Mr. Bartlett is also an independent non-executive director of SHK. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Bartlett did not hold any other directorship in listed public companies in Hong Kong or overseas during the past three years.

A service contract which forms the basis of emoluments has been entered into between the Company and Mr. Chau pursuant to which (i) he will have no designated length of service with the Company but shall be subject to retirement and re-election at the annual general meetings of the Company in accordance with the Articles of Association or any other applicable laws from time to time whereby he shall vacate his office; and (ii) he is entitled to a service fee of HK\$115,000 per annum. The remuneration of Mr. Chau was determined with reference to the recommendation of the remuneration committee of the Board, the prevailing market conditions and the terms of the Company's remuneration policy.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Chau did not have any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company nor had he any interests in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO as at the Latest Practicable Date. Mr. Chau has also given an annual confirmation of his independence to the Company pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and is considered by the Board to be independent after taking into account (i) the factors under Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules; (ii) his ability in bringing fresh perspectives and independent judgment to the Board; (iii) the fact that he does not have any management role in the Company nor any relationship with any Director, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company; and (iv) his experience and his past contributions to governance.

There are no other matters or information in relation to Mr. Chau's re-election that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders or to be disclosed pursuant to paragraphs (h) to (v) of Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules.

This Appendix contains the particulars that are required by the Listing Rules to be included in an explanatory statement to enable the Shareholders to make an informed view on whether to vote for or against the resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the proposed Share Repurchase Mandate.

TOTAL NUMBER OF SHARES IN ISSUE

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the total number of Shares in issue was 3,513,684,360 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the proposed Share Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that the total number of Shares in issue of the Company remains unchanged on the date of the AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 351,368,436 Shares during the period ending on the earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by a resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole for the Directors to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase Shares on the Stock Exchange. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per share and/or earnings per share of the Company and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

The Directors would exercise the power to repurchase in circumstances where they consider that the repurchase would be in the best interests of the Company and in circumstances where they consider that the Shares can be repurchased on the terms favourable to the Company. On the basis of the consolidated financial position of the Company as at 31st December, 2023, being the date to which the latest published audited financial statements of the Company were made up, if the general mandate to repurchase Shares was to be exercised in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period, it may have a material adverse impact on the working capital and gearing level of the Company.

The Directors do not propose to exercise the mandate to repurchase Shares to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the latest published audited financial statements of the Company or the gearing level which, in the opinion of the Directors, are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases to be made pursuant to the proposed Share Repurchase Mandate to repurchase Shares would be financed out of funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Articles of Association and the applicable laws of Hong Kong and the Listing Rules. Such funds include, but are not limited to, profits available for distribution.

EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE AND SHARE BUY-BACKS CODE

Upon the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interests in the voting rights of the Company increases, and such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code and Rule 6 of the Share Buy-backs Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholders' interests, may become obliged to make a mandatory general offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

To the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors, such increase will not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory general offer under Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code, and the total number of Shares held by the public will be reduced to less than 25% of the total number of Shares in issue. The Directors have no present intention to repurchase Shares to the extent that it will result in the total number of Shares held by the public being reduced to less than 25% of the total number of Shares in issue if the Share Repurchase Mandate is approved at the AGM.
