1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of the resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting for (i) granting to the Directors of the Buy-back Mandate to buy back Shares; (ii) granting to the Directors of the Issuance Mandate to issue new Shares; (iii) extension of the Issuance Mandate by adding to it the aggregate number of the issued Shares bought back by the Company under the Buy-back Mandate; (iv) re-election of the retiring Directors; and (v) the declaration of final dividend and special final dividend.

2. PROPOSED GRANTING OF THE BUY-BACK AND ISSUANCE MANDATES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 22 August 2024, general mandates were granted to the Directors to buy back Shares and to issue new Shares respectively. Such mandates will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting.

Ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to approve the granting of new general mandates to the Directors:

- (a) to buy back Shares on the Stock Exchange with an aggregate nominal amount not exceeding 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of such resolution (the “Buy-back Mandate”). As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised of 1,381,696,104 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed ordinary resolution no. 5 contained in the notice of the Annual General Meeting and on the assumption that the issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged on the date of the Annual General Meeting, the Directors would be authorised under the Buy-back Mandate to buy back a maximum of 138,169,610 Shares during the period in which the Buy-back Mandate remains in force.
- (b) to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares with an aggregate nominal amount not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company on the date of passing of such resolution (the “Issuance Mandate”). As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised of 1,381,696,104 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed ordinary resolution no. 6 contained in the notice of the Annual General Meeting and on the assumption that the issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged up to the date of the Annual General Meeting, the Directors would be authorised under the Issuance Mandate to allot, issue and deal with a maximum of 276,339,220 additional Shares during the period in which the Issuance Mandate remains in force.
- (c) to extend the Issuance Mandate by the addition to the number of Shares which may be allotted and issued thereunder of the aggregate number of Shares bought back by the Company pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate.

Each of the Buy-back Mandate and the Issuance Mandate, if approved, will continue in force until the earliest of: (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company following the passing of the resolutions to approve the same; (b) the revocation or variation of the authority given under such resolutions by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company; or (c) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Bye-laws or any applicable laws to be held.

With reference to the Buy-back Mandate and the Issuance Mandate, the Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to buy back or issue any Shares pursuant thereto.

In accordance with the Listing Rules, the Company is required to send to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolution in respect of the granting of the Buy-back Mandate. The explanatory statement as required by the Listing Rules in connection with the Buy-back Mandate is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

3. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

Dr. Chan Yuk Mau Eddie was appointed as an independent non-executive Director with effect from 15 May 2025. In accordance with Clause 86(2) of the Bye-laws, Dr. Chan Yuk Mau Eddie shall hold office until the first annual general meeting after his appointment and, being eligible, offer himself for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Mr. Cheng Shu Wing has indicated that he will not stand for re-election at the Annual General Meeting and will retire as an independent non-executive Director after the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting in accordance with Clause 87(1) of the Bye-laws.

Except for Dr. Chan Yuk Mau Eddie and Mr. Cheng Shu Wing, all the existing directors (including Mr. Poon Bun Chak, Mr. Ho Lai Hong, Mr. Poon Ho Tak, Mr. Ng Mo Ping, Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin and Ms. Lin Kit Yee Anna) will retire, and being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting in accordance with Clause 87(1) of the Bye-laws.

Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin, who has been serving as independent non-executive Director for more than 9 years, has provided a confirmation of his independence with reference to the factors set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. In light of the foregoing, the Company considers that Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin is still independent in accordance with the independence guidelines as set out in the Listing Rules and will continue to bring valuable business experience, knowledge and professionalism to the Board for its efficient and effective functioning.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, save and except that Mr. Cheng Shu Wing who will retire as an independent non-executive Director after the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting, details of the length of tenure of each independent non-executive Director who has served more than 9 years on the Board is as follows:

In proposing candidates of independent non-executive Directors for re-election at the Annual General Meeting, the Nomination Committee has considered their past performance, their confirmations of independence to the Company under Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules as well as his skills, backgrounds, knowledge and experience.

In this regard, the Nomination Committee had evaluated the performance of the retiring independent non-executive Directors who will offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting (being Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin, Ms. Lin Kit Yee Anna and Dr. Chan Yuk Mau Eddie) and found their performance satisfactory. In reviewing the past performance of each of Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin, Ms. Lin Kit Yee Anna and Dr. Chan Yuk Mau Eddie in discharging their duties as independent non-executive Directors, including but not limited to the attendance records of Board meetings and various committees of the Board, the Nomination Committee is satisfied that each of them has demonstrated his/her ability to exercise independent judgment and provide impartial advice on different issues of the Company. The Company has received from each of the existing independent non-executive Directors, a confirmation of his/her independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and considers that all four independent non-executive Directors, namely, Mr. Cheng Shu Wing, Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin, Ms. Lin Kit Yee Anna and Dr. Chan Yuk Mau Eddie are independent. The Nomination Committee has also assessed and the Company confirmed that all of them remain independent. Notwithstanding Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin has served as an independent non-executive Director for more than 9 years, the Board is of the view that each of Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin, Ms. Lin Kit Yee Anna and Dr. Chan Yuk Mau Eddie would bring to the Board their own perspective, skills and experience.

Pursuant to the code provision B.2.3 of the corporate governance code as set out in Appendix C1 to the Listing Rules, any further appointment of independent non-executive directors serving more than 9 years should be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by shareholders. As such, the re-appointment of Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin at the Annual General Meeting will be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by the Shareholders in accordance with the Listing Rules.

Given their unique and diverse background, skills and experience, the Company considers that each of Mr. Law Brian Chung Nin, Ms. Lin Kit Yee Anna and Dr. Chan Yuk Mau Eddie is a highly valued and respected member of the Board, and can contribute to the diversity of the Board with their strong and diversified educational backgrounds and professional experience in their expertise, including their in-depth knowledge in commercial and general management, professional accounting and audit, international experience, investment strategies and connections in various industries.

The following is an explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting in relation to the granting of the Buy-back Mandate.

1. REASONS FOR SHARE BUY-BACKS

Though the Directors have no present intention to buy back Shares, they believe that the flexibility afforded by the Buy-back Mandate would be beneficial to the Company and its Shareholders. At any time in the future when Shares are trading at a discount to their underlying value, the ability of the Company to buy back Shares will be beneficial to those Shareholders who retain their investment in the Company since their percentage interests in the assets of the Company would increase in proportion to the number of Shares bought back by the Company.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 1,381,696,104 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the proposed ordinary resolution no. 5 set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting and on the assumption that the issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged on the date of the Annual General Meeting, the Directors would be authorised under the Buy-back Mandate to buy back, during the period in which the Buy-back Mandate remains in force, a maximum of 138,169,610 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company at the date of the Annual General Meeting.

3. FUNDING OF SHARE BUY-BACKS

In a share buy-back, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Bye-laws and all applicable laws, including the laws of Bermuda.

Bermuda law provides that a share buy-back may only be effected out of the capital paid up on the shares to be bought back, out of the funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the proceeds of a new issue of shares of the Company made for the purpose of the buy-back. Any amount of premium payable on the buy-back over the par value of the shares of the Company to be bought back must be provided for out of the funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the Company's share premium account before the shares are bought back.

4. IMPACT OF SHARE BUY-BACKS

If the Buy-back Mandate was to be exercised in full at any time during the proposed buy-back period, there might be a material adverse effect on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2025 contained in the 2025 annual report of the Company). However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Buy-back Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements or the gearing levels of the Company which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

5. GENERAL

The Directors will exercise the powers of the Company to make buy-back of Shares pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and laws of Bermuda.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge and having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the granting of the Buy-back Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

No core connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company has notified the Company that he or she has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company or has undertaken not to sell any Shares held by him/her to the Company, in the event that the granting of the Buy-back Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Company confirms that neither this explanatory statement nor the Buy-back Mandate has any unusual features.

The Company's present intention is that any Shares bought back under the Buy-back Mandate would be cancelled rather than be held as treasury shares. 7. TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a buy-back of Shares pursuant to the Buy-back Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning under the Takeovers Code), depending on the level of increase in the Shareholders' interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and thereby become(s) obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, each of Mr. Poon Bun Chak and UBS Trustees (B.V.I.) Limited (as trustee of a discretionary family trust founded by Mr. Poon Bun Chak) was taken to have an interest in the same block of 698,830,104 Shares representing 50.58% of the issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to buy back Shares in accordance with the Buy-back Mandate, the shareholding interests of Mr. Poon Bun Chak and UBS Trustees (B.V.I.) Limited would increase to approximately 56.20% of the issued share capital of the Company. Such increase in interest would not give rise to an obligation on Mr. Poon Bun Chak and UBS Trustees (B.V.I.) Limited to make a mandatory offer under Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

In any event, the Directors have no present intention to buy back Shares to such extent and the Directors do not propose to exercise the Buy-back Mandate to such an extent that the aggregate number of Shares held by the public shareholders would fall below the minimum percentage required by the Stock Exchange.

8. BUY-BACKS OF SHARES MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company did not buy back any Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the preceding six months ending on the Latest Practicable Date.

Experience and Position

Mr. Poon Bun Chak is an executive Director and the executive chairman of the Company and responsible for overseeing the planning and development of the Group. He is also a director of certain subsidiaries of the Company. He founded the Group in 1975. He has over 50 years of experience in the textile field. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Poon Bun Chak did not hold any other directorships in any other listed public companies in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years and any position with the Company and its subsidiaries.

Length of service

The length of service of Mr. Poon Bun Chak with the Group is 50 years. Mr. Poon Bun Chak has entered into service contract(s) with the Group. The service contract(s) shall continue unless and until terminated by either the employer or Mr. Poon Bun Chak by giving not less than 3 months' notice in writing or compensation in lieu. He is subject to retirement at each annual general meeting and is eligible for re-election in accordance with the Bye-laws.

Relationships

Mr. Poon Bun Chak is the father of Mr. Poon Ho Tak, an executive Director, and the father-in-law of Mr. Wu Chi Hang, a senior management of the Group. In addition, Mr. Poon Bun Chak is the founder of a discretionary family trust of which UBS Trustees (B.V.I.) Limited is the trustee. Mr. Poon Bun Chak is also a director of Poon's Holdings Limited and of Farrow Star Limited. Each of UBS Trustees (B.V.I.) Limited, Poon's Holdings Limited and Farrow Star Limited is a controlling shareholder of the Company. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Poon Bun Chak does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial shareholders, or controlling shareholders of the Company.

Interests in Shares

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Poon Bun Chak was interested or deemed to be interested in 698,830,104 Shares or underlying Shares pursuant to Part XV of the SFO.

Director's emoluments

Pursuant to the service contracts and its related document(s) entered into between Mr. Poon Bun Chak and the Company, Mr. Poon Bun Chak is entitled to receive an annual remuneration of HK\$6,190,080, which was determined based on his expertise and experience in the field. Mr. Poon Bun Chak will also be entitled to receive a director's fee which is to be fixed by the Board as authorised by the Shareholders at each annual general meeting of the Company and discretionary bonus to be decided by the Board, depending on the performance of the Group. In addition, the Group is providing a living quarter to Mr. Poon Bun Chak.

Matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders

There is no other information required to be disclosed pursuant to Rules 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules, nor any other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders in relation to Mr. Poon Bun Chak's re-election.

(2) Mr. Ho Lai Hong ("Mr. Ho"), aged 67, executive Director*Experience and Position*

Mr. Ho is an executive Director and the chief executive officer of the Company and a member of the Nomination Committee and the Remuneration Committee.
