NOTES TO THE UNAUDITED CONDENSED CONSOLIDATED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the six months ended 30 September 2025

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

The Company was incorporated in the Cayman Islands under the Companies Law, Chapter 22 (Law 3 of 1961, as combined and revised (now known as the Companies Act (2021))) of the Cayman Islands as an exempted company with limited liability on 20 April 2015. The address of the registered office of the Company is located at Cricket Square, Hutchins Drive, P.O. Box 2681, Grand Cayman KY1-1111, Cayman Islands, and the address of principal place of business of the Company is located at 2/F, 35-45B Bonham Strand, Sheung Wan, Hong Kong.

The Company is an investment holding company. Its major operating subsidiaries are engaged in the provision of financial printing services.

The unaudited condensed consolidated financial statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars (“HK\$”), which is the same as the functional currency of the Group.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The condensed consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

The condensed consolidated financial statements for the six months ended 30 September 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards (“HKFRSs”) which is a collective term that includes all applicable individual HKFRSs, Hong Kong Accounting Standards (“HKAS”) and Interpretations issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (“HKICPA”), and accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong. In addition, the unaudited condensed consolidated financial statements also comply with the applicable disclosure provisions of the Listing Rules and the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance (Chapter 622 of the Laws of Hong Kong).

The accounting policies used in the condensed consolidated interim financial statements are consistent with those adopted in the preparation of the Group’s annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2025.

The condensed consolidated financial statements have not been audited by the Company’s independent auditors, but have been reviewed by the Audit Committee.

3. CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

In the current period, the Group has applied the following amendments to HKFRSs issued by the HKICPA for the first time, which are mandatorily effective for the Group's annual period beginning on 1 April 2025, for the preparation of the Group's condensed consolidated interim financial statements:

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

On behalf of the board (the “Board”) of Directors (the “Directors”) of A.Plus Group Holdings Limited (the “Company”), I present the unaudited interim results of the Company and its subsidiaries (collectively, the “Group”) for the six months ended 30 September 2025 to the shareholders of the Company.

BUSINESS REVIEW

During the six months ended 30 September 2025, the Group’s revenue decreased by approximately 3.2% as compared to the corresponding period in 2024. This decrease was mainly due to the decrease in revenue generated from (i) company announcements and shareholder circulars segment of approximately HK\$4.2 million from approximately HK\$21.4 million for the six months ended 30 September 2024 to approximately HK\$17.2 million for the six months ended 30 September 2025; and (ii) results announcements and financial reports segment of approximately HK\$0.6 million from approximately HK\$33.0 million for the six months ended 30 September 2024 to approximately HK\$32.4 million for the six months ended 30 September 2025. Such decrease was partly offset by the increase in revenue generated from fund documents segment of approximately HK\$1.7 million from approximately HK\$0.7 million for the six months ended 30 September 2024 to approximately HK\$2.1 million for the six months ended 30 September 2025 and revenue generated from debt offering circulars and initial public offering prospectuses segment of approximately HK\$1.0 million from approximately HK\$5.8 million for the six months ended 30 September 2024 to approximately HK\$6.8 million for the six months ended 30 September 2025.

PROSPECTS

The financial printing industry faces notable challenges as the Hong Kong Stock Exchange implements further paperless listing reforms in January 2025. These reforms mandate that listed issuers primarily communicate electronically with shareholders, removing the option to issue paper application forms for IPOs. While this transition supports sustainable practices in the Hong Kong capital market, it is likely to decrease the demand for printed documents and potentially affecting the profitability of the Group and the financial printing industry as a whole.

In response, we will concentrate on strengthening our core competencies in branding, networking, and service delivery to sustain our competitive edge. The overall liquidity of the Hong Kong capital market is projected to improve in view of its development in the recent months.

Amid the challenges we are facing, the Group is well prepared, both in terms of hardware and services, to capture new opportunities in the market.

DIVIDENDS

The Board does not recommend the payment of any dividend for the six months ended 30 September 2025 (six months ended 30 September 2024: Nil).

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Revenue

The Group's revenue decreased from approximately HK\$62.9 million for the six months ended 30 September 2024 to approximately HK\$60.9 million for the six months ended 30 September 2025, representing a decrease of approximately 3.2%. Segmentally, revenue generated from company announcements and shareholder circulars segment and results announcements and financial report segment decreased by approximately HK\$4.2 million and HK\$0.6 million respectively, which was partly offset by the increase in revenue generated from fund documents segment and debt offering circulars and initial public offering prospectuses segment of approximately HK\$1.7 million and HK\$1.0 million respectively.

Cost of services

The Group's cost of services mainly included printing cost, staff cost and translation cost which represented approximately 16.3%, 37.5% and 30.1% of the Group's total cost of services for the six months ended 30 September 2025 respectively. The Group's cost of services decreased from approximately HK\$32.8 million for the six months ended 30 September 2024 to approximately HK\$30.6 million for the six months ended 30 September 2025, representing a decrease of approximately 7.1%.

Gross profit

The Group's gross profit for the six months ended 30 September 2024 and the six months ended 30 September 2025 were approximately HK\$30.1 million and HK\$30.3 million respectively, which remained relatively stable.

Other income

The Group's other income decreased from approximately HK\$3.0 million for the six months ended 30 September 2024 to approximately HK\$0.9 million for the six months ended 30 September 2025. The decrease was mainly attributable to the decrease in others and interest income.

Selling and distribution expenses

The Group's selling and distribution expenses remained relatively stable which increased by approximately HK\$0.6 million from approximately HK\$8.1 million for the six months ended 30 September 2024 to approximately HK\$8.7 million for the six months ended 30 September 2025.

Administrative expenses

The Group's administrative expenses for the six months ended 30 September 2024 and the six months ended 30 September 2025 were approximately HK\$12.6 million and HK\$12.8 million respectively, which remained relatively stable.

Impairment loss of trade receivables

The Group's impairment loss of trade receivables for the six months ended 30 September 2024 and the six months ended 30 September 2025 were approximately HK\$0.6 million and approximately HK\$0.9 million respectively.

Finance cost

The Group's finance cost for the six months ended 30 September 2024 and the six months ended 30 September 2025 were approximately HK\$187,000 and approximately HK\$35,000 respectively.

Income tax expenses

The Group's income tax expenses for the six months ended 30 September 2024 and the six months ended 30 September 2025 were approximately HK\$1.4 million and approximately HK\$1.3 million respectively.

Profit for the period

Profit after tax of the Group decreased by approximately 25.6% or approximately HK\$2.6 million from approximately HK\$10.1 million for the six months ended 30 September 2024 to approximately HK\$7.5 million for the six months ended 30 September 2025. The decrease was mainly attributable to the decrease in other income of approximately HK\$2.1 million.

GEARING RATIO

As at 30 September 2025, the gearing ratio of the Group was 3.9% (as at 31 March 2025: 1.5%).

LIQUIDITY, FINANCIAL RESOURCES AND CAPITAL STRUCTURE

As at 31 March 2025 and 30 September 2025, the Group had net current assets of approximately HK\$94.3 million and HK\$100.2 million respectively. As at 31 March 2025 and 30 September 2025, the Group had cash and cash equivalents of approximately HK\$74.6 million and HK\$79.6 million respectively. As at 31 March 2025 and 30 September 2025, the Group did not have any borrowings, bank overdrafts, bank loans and banking facilities. The Group intends to finance its future operations, capital expenditure and other capital requirements with the cash generated from business operations and cash and bank balances available.

EMPLOYEES AND REMUNERATION POLICY

As at 30 September 2025, the Group employed 71 full time employees in Hong Kong (as at 30 September 2024: 74) for its activities. Employees' costs (including Directors' emoluments) amounted to approximately HK\$23.0 million for the reporting period (six months ended 30 September 2024: approximately HK\$22.7 million). The Group recognises the importance of retaining talented and professional employees for operations and business, and it continues to provide remuneration packages to employees with reference to the performance of the Group, the performance of individual employees and prevailing market rates.

CAPITAL COMMITMENTS AND FINANCING NEEDS

As at 30 September 2025, the Group had no new implementation plans or financing plans.

SIGNIFICANT INVESTMENTS/MATERIAL ACQUISITIONS AND DISPOSALS

The Group did not make any significant investments or material acquisition and disposal during the six months ended 30 September 2025.

CHARGES ON THE GROUP'S ASSETS

As at 30 September 2025 and 2024, there were no charges on the Group's assets.

FUTURE PLANS FOR MATERIAL INVESTMENTS OR CAPITAL ASSETS

There was no specific plan for material investments or capital assets as at 30 September 2025.

CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

As at 30 September 2025 and 2024, the Group did not have any significant contingent liabilities.

FOREIGN CURRENCY EXPOSURE

Since the Group's business activities are solely operated in Hong Kong and mainly denominated in Hong Kong dollars, the Directors consider that the Group's risk in foreign exchange is insignificant.

The Group had no significant events after the end of the reporting period of this announcement.
